I am a resident of Kansas City, KS. I am writing to express my concern about an application from Quail Oil & Gas, LC for a permit to inject wastewater into the Arbuckle formation in Morris County, KS.

Most induced earthquakes in the United States are a result of the deep disposal of fluids (wastewater) related to oil and gas production. It is possible for the toxins in these fluids to leech into ground water and drinking water sources. Seismicity can be induced at distances of 10 km or more away from the injection point and at significantly greater depths than injection. The site of the proposed injection well is within that proximity to several fresh water springs.

Without our water, we have nothing. Water is the source of all life. The oil and gas industry has sold the American people short for too long. We should not relinquish our natural resources that our following generations will depend on so that a corporation can temporarily gain economically.
