CURB'S RESPONSE TO STAFF'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

The Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB) submits its response to the Report and Recommendation filed by the Staff of the Kansas Corporation Commission (Staff and Commission respectively) in the above-captioned docket on June 14, 2017.

- 1. On January 6, 2017, Empire District Electric Company (Empire) filed its Application requesting approval of its proposed Asbury Environmental and Riverton Cost Recovery ("AERR") Rider. The proposed AERR Rider will replace Empire's current Asbury Environmental Cost Recovery ("AECR") Rider pursuant to K.S.A. 66-117 and paragraph 26 of the Unanimous Settlement Agreement ("Settlement Agreement"), which was approved in Docket No. 16-EPDE-410-ACQ ("410 Docket").
- 2. On January 9, 2017, CURB filed its Petition to Intervene and Motion for Protective Order and Discovery Order.³ CURB explained that Empire's proposal to replace the existing AECR Rider with the AERR Rider may substantially affect the rates paid and services received by residential and small commercial ratepayers.⁴

- 3. On February 2, 2017, the Commission issued an Order granting CURB's Petition to Intervene.⁵
- 4. On June 6, 2017, Staff filed its Report and Recommendation ("R&R").⁶ Staff recommends that the Commission approve the Application by Empire to amend and replace its AECR Rider with the proposed AERR Rider with Staff's updated revenue requirement of \$1,740,667.00, or \$0.00798 per kWh.⁷ Empire's average Kansas residential customer's bill will increase by \$4.89 per month or a total AERR surcharge of \$8.41 per month.⁸
- 5. As part of the Unanimous Settlement Agreement (Settlement Agreement) in Docket No. 16-EPDE-410-ACQ ("Docket 16-410"), CURB, along with Staff, agreed to not categorically oppose Empire's request to amend the AECR rider provided that the revised rider met certain conditions.⁹
- 6. CURB analyzed this Application, along with Staff's R&R, and believes that Staff's recommendations in its R&R are reasonable. Empire's pending rate increase, which it withdrew as a part of the Settlement Agreement in Docket 16-410, could have resulted in a rate increase to customers' bills of approximately 25%. ¹⁰ Empire's pending rate increase request was

not eliminated, but deferred until it re-files its request sometime after May 1, 2018.¹¹ CURB, Staff, and Empire agree that the proposed AERR Rider should lessen the impact/rate shock of any future rate increase to Empire's customers. CURB believes that the recovery of costs related to investments in Riverton 12, collected on a gradual basis, is in the best interests of Empire's ratepayers.

WHEREFORE, CURB respectfully recommends that the Commission adopt Staff's Report and Recommendation and for such other relief as the Commission deems just and proper.
