NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Sign Here, Inc. (Sign Here) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on March 28, 2019, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Michael Heenan. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2019 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on August 7, 2018. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations, please refer to the Penalty Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

Sign Here has been assessed a \$1,100 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine, unless you choose the reduced penalty option explained below. Please remit payment of \$1,100 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

SIGN HERE IS A NEW ENTRANT MOTOR CARRIER AND MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PENALTY REDUCTION OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) UNDER THE FOLLOWING TERMS SET OUT IN THE ATTACHED REDUCED PENALTY AGREEMENT.

To become eligible, you must agree to meet the terms and obligations set out in the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to be eligible for the reduction. The Reduced Penalty Agreement must be submitted to the Litigation Division within 15 days.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER:

You have the right to request a hearing if you contest the terms of the Penalty Order. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Sign Here, Inc. must file within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to Litigation Counsel at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-542.


IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

REDUCED PENALTY AGREEMENT

Sign Here, Inc. (Sign Here) hereby submits this Reduced Penalty Agreement for approval of a fifty percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed in the Penalty Order dated April 16, 2019. Sign Here has agreed to comply with the following terms and obligations:

- 1. Sign Here has submitted, within fifteen (15) days from the date of the Penalty Order this signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel.
- 2. Sign Here will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, submit to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) and describing specific and detailed information explaining its efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. I understand the CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to become eligible for the 50% reduced penalty.
- 3. Sign Here will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, send an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance will be submitted to the Litigation Counsel.
- 4. Sign Here will be available within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

Sign Here, Inc. understands that if approved, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment will be issued by the Commission assessing a reduced penalty of \$550, and will set out the terms and conditions stated above. Once the Order Amending Penalty Assessment is issued by the Commission, Sign Here will have thirty (30) days from the date of service of that Order to pay the reduced penalty assessed.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.A.R. 82-4-1b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.A.R. 82-4-1, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Sign Here, Inc. (Sign Here) has private operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 1738167.
- 5. Brandon Smith attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on December 18, 2015, on behalf of Sign Here.
 - 6. Sign Here is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls signs and supplies.
- 7. Sign Here is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction of the penalty(s) assessed below.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 8. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on March 28, 2019, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Michael Heenan conducted a compliance review of the operations of Sign Here. A copy of the safety compliance review is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On September 18, 2018, Sign Here required or permitted its driver, David
 M. Fesenmeyer, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a
 2000 Sterling boom bucket truck, VIN ending in 32870, GVWR 33,000

lbs., in intrastate commerce from Olathe, Kansas to Gardner, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report Number KSPD83961340, dated September 18, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Sign Here failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The carrier's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a, above, Sign Here had not obtained a pre-employment alcohol/controlled substance test of a negative result on driver David M. Fesenmeyer. The carrier's failure to require its driver to submit to a pre-employment alcohol and/or controlled substances USDOT regulated test and to obtain a negative test result within 30 days of him employment and prior to requiring or permitting him to operate a commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- c. During the transportation described in paragraph a, above, Sign Here used a driver that had a valid regular driver's license to drive a commercial

motor vehicle that requires a Class B CDL. The carrier's failure to require its driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle without the driver taking and passing the written and driving tests for a CDL and obtaining a CDL license is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 383.23(a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

d. During the transportation described in paragraph a, above, Sign Here failed to require its driver to complete a record of duty service or any time record for the above-listed trip. The carrier's failure to require its drivers to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period, or in the alternative to maintain and retain time records described in 49 C.F.R. 395.1(e) under the short haul exemption, using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Sign Here committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

- 10. Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,100 for four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 11. Staff provides notice to the Commission that Sign Here, Inc. is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced civil penalty. The carrier must submit to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Penalty Order the signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement and Transportation Staff must approve the carrier's Corrective Action Plan (CAP).
- 12. Staff recommends Sign Here, Inc. submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. The CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to qualify for the fifty-percent (50%) discount.
- 13. Staff further recommends that a representative from Sign Here attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel.
- 14. Finally, Staff recommends that Sign Here submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

15. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Sign Here because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.A.R. 82-4-1.

- 16. The Commission finds a penalty of \$1,100 should be assessed to Sign Here for committing four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 17. The Commission finds Sign Here is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed herein.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Sign Here, Inc., of Gardner, KS is hereby assessed a penalty of \$1,100 for four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations. Payment of \$1,100 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.
- B. A representative from Sign Here is ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety meeting within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- C. Sign Here must submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described above, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. Sign Here is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- E. If Sign Here does not submit the Reduced Penalty Agreement and fails to pay the penalty of \$1,100 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, the Commission will have the right to order further sanctions, including suspension of Sign Here's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may issue and enforce revocation of motor carrier authority and/or issue cease and desist order(s), and may order other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.
- F. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and a copy mailed to the Litigation Counsel. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Sign Here's right to a hearing.
- G. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney,

unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.



- 1. Operating a CDL required vehicle without a proper and valid CDL.
- 2. Do not allow drivers to operate a commercial motor vehicle without proper endorsements.
- 3. Every self-propelled CMV subject to to the regulations must be marked in accordance to 390.21 (b), (c), and (d) of this section and Kansas ruling under KSA 8-143e. 390.21(b)(1) - Legal name or a single trade name as listed on Form MCSA-1 or the motor carrier identification report; (b)(2) - The identification number issued by FMCSA to the motor carrier, preceded by the letters USDOT. KSA 8-143e requires the carrier to also include the City and State where based and GRW (gross registered weight) of the tag if not apportioned. Continuing with 390.21, the marking must (c)(1) appear on both sides of the self-propelled CMV; (c)(2) - have letters in contrasting colors; (c)(3) - be visible during daylight hours from a distance of 50 feet while stationary (2" tall is required by State Statutes); and (c)(4) - be kept and maintained in a manner that retains the legibility required by (c)(3).
- 4. Ensure that you give drivers a written drug policy and educational materials.
- 5. Per 391.51(a) requiremenst for maintaining the medical certification information in the Driver Qualification file is as follows:
 - (7)(i) The medical examiner's certificate as required by § 391.43(g) or a legible copy of the certificate.
 - (ii) Exception. For CDL holders, beginning January 30, 2012, if the CDLIS motor vehicle record contains medical certification status information, the motor carrier employer must meet this requirement by obtaining the CDLIS motor vehicle record defined at § 384.105 of this chapter. That record must be obtained from the current licensing State and placed in the driver qualification file. After January 30, 2015, a non-excepted, interstate CDL or CLP holder without medical certification status information on the CDLIS motor vehicle record is designated "not-certified" to operate a CMV in interstate commerce. After January 30, 2015, a motor carrier may use a copy of the driver's current medical examiner's certificate that was submitted to the State for up to 15 days from the date it was issued as proof of medical certification.
 - (iii) If that driver obtained the medical certification based on having obtained a medical variance from FMCSA, the motor carrier must also include a copy of the medical variance documentation in the driver qualification file in accordance with § 391.51(b)(8);
- 6. The MCS-150 (Motor Carrier Identification Report) is required to be updated bi-annually. As required under 49 CFR 390.19(a) and 390.19(b), the carrier must file Form MCS-150 before it begins operations and every 24 months according to the schedule noted in 390.19(b)(2). Depending on the next to the last digit of the USDOT#, the carrier will be responsible for updating the USDOT# in either the even or odd number year. Example: The next to the last number in the USDOT# is 2, the carrier would need to update the MCS150 in an even numbered year. On the same hand, the last number of the USDOT# is the qualifier for the month in which the update must occur. If the last number of the USDOT# is 4, the USDOT# must be updated by the end of April. The required form must be filed with FMCSA Office of Information Management. The USDOT number needs to be filed electronically according to the instructions at the Agency's (www.fmcsa.dot.gov) Web site.
- 7. I acknowledge that these requirements and/or recommendations have been discussed with me and my questions have been answered. I understand that failure to satisfactorily remedy the above-listed requirements, and/or failure to comply with Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes and Regulations could result in the suspension of Sign Here Inc operating authority and/or the impoundment of Sign Here Inc vehicles.

- 14. 391.21 A person shall not drive a commercial motor vehicle unless he/she has completed and furnished the motor carrier that employs him/her with an application for employment that meets the requirements of paragraph (b) of this section.

FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.


