ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State

of Kansas. Having examined the files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the

Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

1. K.S.A. 74-623 provides that the Commission has the exclusive jurisdiction and

authority to regulate oil and gas activities.

2. K.A.R. 82-3-203 provides oil production allowables based on depth.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 3. The operator filed the application in this docket on January 28, 2015.
- 4. The operator requests a special production allowable of the lesser of the

following: A) 300 barrels per day, retroactive to the date of first production (November 25,

2014); and B) the well's capability as demonstrated by the state test. Because the well is drilled

to a total depth of between 4,001 and 6,000, the allowable is currently 200 barrels of oil per day.

5. The subject well is productive from the St. Louis Formation.

6. Notice was properly served and published pursuant to K.A.R. 82-3-135a at least

15 days before the issuance of this Order. No protests to the grant of the application were filed.

7. Commission Staff has recommended that this application should be granted to prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

8. The application was filed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Commission and Kansas statutes.

9. Notice was properly served and published.

10. The application should be granted to prevent waste and protect correlative rights.

THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

A. The application for a special production allowable is granted. The special production allowable shall be the lesser of the following: A) 300 barrels per day, retroactive to the date of first production (November 25, 2014); and B) the well's capability as demonstrated by the state test.

B. At such time that oil production from the subject well decreases to the point that the special production allowable is no longer needed, the special allowable shall cancel and the wells shall be subject to the allowable in the general rules and regulations.

C. Any party affected by this Order may file with the Commission a petition for reconsideration pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529(a). The petition shall be filed within 15 days after service of this Order. If service of this Order is by mail, three days are added to the deadline. The petition shall be addressed to the Commission and sent to 266 N. Main, Ste. 220, Wichita, Kansas 67202. Pursuant to K.S.A. 55-606 and K.S.A. 77-529(a), reconsideration is prerequisite for judicial review of this Order. Any party taking an action permitted by this summary proceeding before the deadline for a petition for reconsideration does so at their own risk of further proceedings.

D. The Commission retains jurisdiction of the subject matter and the parties and may

enter additional orders as it deems appropriate.
