This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking (C Hall Trucking) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on October 30, 2019, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2020 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on July 16, 2019. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations, please refer to the Penalty Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

C Hall Trucking has been assessed a \$1,850 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine, unless you choose the reduced penalty option explained below. Please remit payment of \$1,850 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

C HALL TRUCKING IS A NEW ENTRANT MOTOR CARRIER AND MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PENALTY REDUCTION OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) UNDER THE FOLLOWING TERMS SET OUT IN THE ATTACHED REDUCED PENALTY AGREEMENT.

To become eligible, you must agree to meet the terms and obligations set out in the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to be eligible for the reduction. The Reduced Penalty Agreement must be submitted to the Litigation Division within 15 days.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER:

You have the right to request a hearing if you contest the terms of the Penalty Order. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking must file within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to Litigation Counsel at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to adhere to the terms and obligations set out in the attached Penalty Order, including payment of the penalty of \$1,850 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within 15 days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, will result in the Order becoming final and the terms and conditions set out therein will be enforced.

REDUCED PENALTY AGREEMENT

20-TRAM-220-PEN

Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking (C Hall Trucking) hereby submits this Reduced Penalty Agreement for approval of a fifty percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed in the Penalty Order dated November 21, 2019. C Hall Trucking has agreed to comply with the following terms and obligations:

1. C Hall Trucking has submitted, within fifteen (15) days from the date of the Penalty Order this signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel.

2. C Hall Trucking will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, submit to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) and describing specific and detailed information explaining its efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. I understand the CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to become eligible for the 50% reduced penalty.

3. C Hall Trucking will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, send an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance will be submitted to the Litigation Counsel.

4. C Hall Trucking will be available within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking understands that if approved, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment will be issued by the Commission assessing a reduced penalty of \$925, and will set out the terms and conditions stated above. Once the Order Amending Penalty Assessment is issued by the Commission, C Hall Trucking will have thirty (30) days from the date of service of that Order to pay the reduced penalty assessed.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

1. Pursuant to K.S.A 2018 Supp. 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

2. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

3. Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking (C Hall Trucking) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 2902014.

4. Chris Hall attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on September 26, 2016, on behalf of C Hall Trucking.

5. C Hall Trucking is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls machinery, large objects, livestock, grain, feed, hay, commodities dry bulk and farm supplies.

6. C Hall Trucking is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fiftypercent (50%) reduction of the penalty(s) assessed below.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on October 30, 2019, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback conducted a compliance review of the operations of C Hall Trucking. A copy of the safety compliance review is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified seven (7) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

a. On July 7, 2019, C Hall Trucking required or permitted its driver, Kevin Hall, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Freightliner CL120, VIN ending in 78396, GVWR 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2003 Wilson semi-trailer, VIN ending in 37882, in intrastate commerce from Scott City, Kansas to Great Bend, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver's Daily Log, dated July 7, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, C Hall Trucking did not have a person

designated to undergo 60 minutes of training for suspicious alcohol abuse and 60 minutes of training for suspicious controlled substance abuse. The carrier's inability to produce documentation of this training and its failure to have a designated person to attend 60 minutes of training on alcohol misuse and an additional 60 minutes of training on controlled substances use is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.603, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

- b. On August 28, 2019, C Hall Trucking required or permitted its driver, Christopher Hall, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2004 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 821469, GVWR 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2003 Wilson semi-trailer, VIN ending in 37882, in intrastate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Wichita, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated August 28, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, C Hall Trucking used a driver that did not possess a valid Commercial Driver's License (CDL) to operate the commercial motor vehicles stated above due to an expired medical card since November 30, 2016. The carrier's operation using a driver without a valid CDL is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 392.2, authorized by K.S.A. 8-2,125. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- c. During the transportation described in paragraph b, above, C Hall Trucking used a driver that was not medically examined and certified as

physically fit to operate a commercial motor vehicle. The carrier's failure to confirm that its driver is medically examined and certified prior to requiring or permitting the operation of a commercial motor vehicle and maintaining documentation of the medical certificate in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.41(a)(1)(i), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

- d. During the transportation described in paragraph b, above, C Hall Trucking failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The special investigator discovered two (2) violations of this type. The carrier's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- e. On July 25, 2019, C Hall Trucking required or permitted its driver, Kevin Hall, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2004 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 821469, GVWR over 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2003 Wilson semi-trailer, VIN ending in 37882, in intrastate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Wichita, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver's Daily Log, dated July 25, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the

time of this transportation, Kevin Hall drove 5.39 hours after being on duty 14 hours. The carrier's failure to require its driver to cease driving at the 14th hour after coming on duty following ten (10) consecutive hours off duty is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(2), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

- f. During the transportation described in paragraph e, above, driver Kevin Hall drove from Scott City, Kansas to Leoti, Kansas after he had delivered in Wichita, Kansas. Mr. Hall failed to log his hours of service from Scott City, Kansas to Leoti, Kansas when he was required to complete a record of duty status. The special investigator discovered two (2) violations of this type. C Hall Trucking's failure to require its driver to keep accurate records of duty status for each 24-hour period using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- g. During the transportation described in paragraph e, above, C Hall Trucking failed to obtain the inspector certifications of Benjamin Rempel and Randy Jacobs indicating they were qualified to conduct annual inspections on the commercial motor vehicles. The special investigator discovered two (2) violations of this type. The carrier's failure to retain evidence of the inspector's qualifications to inspect the commercial motor

vehicles is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.19(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find C Hall Trucking committed seven (7) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,850 for seven (7) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff provides notice to the Commission that Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced civil penalty. The carrier must submit to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Penalty Order the signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement and Transportation Staff must approve the carrier's Corrective Action Plan (CAP).

11. Staff recommends Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. The CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to qualify for the fifty-percent (50%) discount.

12. Staff further recommends that a representative from C Hall Trucking attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel.

13. Finally, Staff recommends that C Hall Trucking submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

14. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over C Hall Trucking because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.

15. The Commission finds a penalty of \$1,850 should be assessed to C Hall Trucking for committing seven (7) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

16. The Commission finds C Hall Trucking is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed herein.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Christopher Hall, d/b/a C Hall Trucking, of Scott City, KS is hereby assessed a penalty of \$1,850 for seven (7) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations. Payment of \$1,850 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's

KTRAN system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

B. A representative from C Hall Trucking is ordered to attend a Commissionsponsored safety meeting within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

C. C Hall Trucking must submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described above, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

D. C Hall Trucking is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

E. If C Hall Trucking does not submit the Reduced Penalty Agreement and fails to pay the penalty of \$1,850 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, the Commission will have the right to order further sanctions, including suspension of C Hall Trucking's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may issue and enforce revocation of motor carrier authority and/or issue cease and desist order(s), and may order other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

F. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may</u> request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, within fifteen (15) days from the date of

service of this Penalty Order. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and a copy mailed to the Litigation Counsel. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of C Hall Trucking's right to a hearing.

G. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

Ensure that you have on file a mechanics certification from mechanics that conduct your annual inspections.

11 DQ File

Each motor carrier shall maintain a driver qualification (DQ) file for each driver it employs. A driver's qualification file may be conbined with his/her personnel file. The DQ file must include: driver's application for employment ,a copy of the motor vehicle record received from each State within 30 days of the hire date, certificate of the driver's road test or a copy of the CDL license, copy of the annual motor vehicle record received from each State agency every 12 months, a note relating to the annual review of the driver's driving record, a list or certificate relating to violations of motor vehicle laws and ordinances, a copy of the medical examiner's certificate, a note relating to the verification of medical examiner being listing on the National Registry of Certified Medical Examiners, and a Skill Performance Evaluation Certificate if applicable due to the drivers inability to pass the physical requirements for a medical certification.


