This is a notice of a penalty assessment against The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc (Golden Belt Coop) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on September 15, 2023, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Doug Handy. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 29, 2023. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Golden Belt Coop has been assessed a \$1,050 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$1,050, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) systemlocated at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Golden Belt Coop must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.\(^1\)

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,050 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On September 15, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Doug Handy, completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc (Golden Belt Coop or Carrier). Golden Belt Coop is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 961931.
- 2. On October 17, 2023, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation (R&R), attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$1,050 to be issued to Golden Belt Coop based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigations, SI Doug Handy identified five (5) violation(s), accounting for three (3) count(s),

of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.²

- 3. Finally, Staff recommends that Golden Belt Coop submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.³ Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- 4. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.
- 6. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc, of Ellis, KS is hereby assessed a \$1,050 civil penalty for five (5) violation(s), accounting for three (3) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Golden Belt Coop is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Golden Belt Coop's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- D. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney,

unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁴

E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,050 is due

in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$1,050 must be made

through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking

Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You

must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

F. Failure to pay the \$1,050 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of

service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may

result in suspension of Golden Belt Coop's motor carrier operating authority without further

notice.5 Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited

to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and

any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

the Revocation of Motor Carrier Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc is a motor carrier (MC) possessing public for-hire and private operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling liquids, gases, grain, feed, hay and farm supplies. The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc operates under USDOT 961931. On September 15, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigator SI Doug Handy completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SI identified five (5) violations, accounting for three (3) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SI, staff recommends penalty of \$1,050 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On September 15, 2023, Commission Staff SI Doug Handy conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc. The investigation covers a 365 day period as well as previous compliance investigations. Each specific count is detailed below.

Count One (1 of 3)

<u>Juris diction</u>: Pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 382.701(b)(1) adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The Motor Carrier must conduct an annual inquiry into its drivers with the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse (DACH).

Supporting Documentation: On July 30, 2023, The Golden Belt Cooperative Association, Inc required or permitted its driver, Ryan Grogan, to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2011 Kenworth, VIN ending in 0323, GVWR 36,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around Ellis, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by a BOL #22993, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**, and a copy of the Motor Carrier DACH report, attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**. On the DACH report, a query was attempted on November 3, 2022, but the report states "Result Not Available Driver Not Verified." This indicates the query was not completed. The MC would be required to follow up to complete the query.

<u>Violation</u>: The Golden Belt Cooperative Association, Inc failed to conduct an annual query (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 3**). There were three (3) violations discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$300.00.

Count Two (2 of 3)

<u>Juris diction</u>: Jurisdiction: K.S.A. 66-1,142b, and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The Motor Carrier are required to attend a Commission-Sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of penalty order.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> The MC was ordered to attend a KCC safety seminar in the Penalty Order issued November 9, 2021 in Docket No. 22-TRAM-201-PEN.

<u>Violation:</u> The Golden Belt Cooperative Association, Inc failed to attend a KCC Safety Seminar as required by Commission Penalty Order issued in Docket No. 22-TRAM-201-PEN on November 9, 2021 (Exhibit 1, Page 3). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Three (3 of 3)

<u>Juris diction</u>: Pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 396.17(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The Motor Carrier shall obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The inspection shall be retained by the Motor Carrier pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 396.21(b).

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> During the transportation described in Count One, above, the Motor Carrier failed to conduct the annual vehicle inspection prior to July 30, 2023. The MC provided the SI with an annual vehicle inspection report dated August 24, 2023, attached hereto as **Exhibit** 4. The carrier was unable to provide any annual inspections prior to this date.

<u>Violation</u>: The Golden Belt Cooperative Association, Inc used a commercial motor vehicle not periodically inspected (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 3**). One (1) violation was discovered.


Recommendation: Staff deems this violation to be intentional and therefore recommends an enhanced violation of \$500, due to the same violation being discovered in the previous compliance investigation conducted on October 29, 2021 and penalized in the Penalty Order issued November 9, 2021 in Docket No. 22-TRAM-201-PEN.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc committed five (5) violations, accounting for three (3) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,050 for five (5) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Finally, Staff recommends that The Golden Belt Cooperative Association Inc submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

Please review, verify and update your contact information, Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT) and Power Unit (PU) data to ensure that it is current and accurate, since it is used in the new Carrier Safety Measurement System. You should access the system, review all the information and press the submit button. Once you've done this, the system will record that you've reviewed the information and you will be in compliance with the biennial update requirement.

6. Clearinghouse Annual Query

Ensure annual queries are conducted in the Clearinghouse at least once per year. You may conduct a full or limited query to fulfill this requirement.

7. Clearinghouse Driver Consent

Ensure driver consent has been obtained and is on file before conducting a limited query.

8. Annual Inspections

Ensure that all commercial motor vehicles, which would include trailers as well as power units, have a current Annual Inspection as required by 396.17.

9. KCC Safety Seminar

Motor carriers are responsible for complying with all tasks ordered by the Commission in its Penalty Order. In addition to paying any civil fines issued, you are also required to attend a Commission sponsored safety seminar. Failure to fulfill this requirement may lead to the issuance of further penalties or other repercussions, including revocation of authority to operate intrastate in Kansas.

10. CAP to Commission

The KCC requires that you prepare a corrective action plan, addressing the measures taken to correct all the violations identified within this report. Submit this letter within 30 days outlining the carrier s updated changes to their policies and procedures regarding all listed violations. Explain in detail how, as a carrier representative, you will rectify these deficiencies and prevent their reoccurrence going forward. Include any supporting documentation and evidence as indicated in the recommendations above, (example: vehicle inspections performed, proof of drug and alcohol testing in place, etc.) necessary to prove that corrective action has been taken. 



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
