This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Ace Transports LLC (Ace Transports) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 22, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Michael Heenan. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2019 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on August 7, 2018. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Ace Transports has been assessed an \$1,100 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$1,100, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Ace Transports to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Ace Transports must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,100 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Ace Transports LLC (Ace Transports) has private operating authority with the Commission and further operates USDOT number 2365172.
- 5. Glenna Edwards attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on March 11, 2013, on behalf of Ace Transports.
- 6. Ace Transports is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, motor vehicles and construction.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on August 22, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Michael Heenan conducted a compliance review of the operations of Ace Transports. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified three (3) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On December 10, 2017, Ace Transports required or permitted its driver,
 Eric J. King, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2010
 Kenworth, VIN ending in 221356, GVWR 50,000 lbs., pulling a 2003

Wabash dry van trailer, VIN ending in 847844, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Chanute, Kansas to Colorado Springs, Colorado. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report Number KSHP04290100, dated December 10, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Ace Transport was using a driver that had a suspended commercial driver's license. The carrier's failure to require its driver to cease operations of commercial motor vehicles due to a suspended CDL is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 392.2 (K.S.A. 8-2,125), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

b. On January 3, 2018, Ace Transport required or permitted its driver, Billy G. Sutton, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2010 Kenworth, VIN ending in 221356, GVWR 50,000 lbs., pulling a 2003 Wabash dry van trailer, VIN ending in 822138, in interstate commerce from Salina, Kansas to Denver, Colorado. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated January 3, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Ace Transport failed to obtain its driver's motor vehicle record (MVR) within 30 days of employment. The carrier's failure to obtain MVRs on its drivers within 30 days of employment and maintain the MVRs in the driver qualification files pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51 is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.23(a)(1) and (b), adopted by K.A.R.

- 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.
- c. On August 4, 2018, Ace Transport required or permitted its driver, Tommy Dufoe, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2007 International, VIN ending in 485852, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Pittsburg, Kansas to Newton, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Log, dated August 4, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Ace Transport did not have proper "for-hire" Commission authority to operate from point-to-point in the state of Kansas. Its "for-hire" authority cancelled on April 17, 2013, and Transportation Staff requested the carrier to re-apply, but the carrier Ace Transports' commercial operations of motor never responded. vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Ace Transports committed three (3) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,100 for three (3) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Ace Transports be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that Ace Transports submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Ace Transports because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Ace Transports committed three (3) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Ace Transports LLC, of Cherryvale, KS is hereby assessed an \$1,100 civil penalty for three (3) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

- B. Ace Transports is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Ace Transports is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Ace Transports' right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$1,100 civil penalty against Ace Transports, and ordering a representative from Ace Transports to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.
- E. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney.

unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

- F. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,100 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$1,100 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.
- G. Failure to pay the \$1,100 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Ace Transports' motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.
- II. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012.

The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents.

Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site.




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
