RESPONSE TO MOTION TO AMEND APPLICATION AND FOR SUMMARY PROCEEDINGS

Comes now the Staff of the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Staff and Commission, respectively) in response to the Motion to Amend Application and for Summary Proceedings filed on behalf of Palomino Petroleum, Inc. (Operator). In support of Staff's response, Staff states the following:

- 1. On December 30, 2020, Operator filed an application for a well location exception for its proposed Spectre #1 well.¹
 - 2. Notice was properly served and met the requirements of K.A.R. 82-3-135a.
- 3. Between January 20, 2021, and January 27, 2021, Pickrell Drilling Co., Inc. and Norstar Petroleum, Inc. filed a Motion to Intervene and Protest Operator's Application.
- 4. On March 23, 2021, Operator filed its Motion to Amend Application and for Summary Proceedings (Motion), wherein Operator requested that paragraph 10 of its original application be amended to request a maximum allowable of 58 bbl/day for its proposed Spectre #1 well, and for the Commission to consider approving the application as amended through summary proceedings as an alternative to holding a formal evidentiary hearing as provided by the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act (KAPA).²

5. On March 25, 2021, Pickrell Drilling Co., Inc. and Norstar Petroleum, Inc. filed a

Motion to Withdraw Protest Without Prejudice.

6.

Staff has had the opportunity to completely review the Operator's Application in

this matter. Staff believes Operator has provided sufficient evidence to support their claim that the

drilling location is at the optimum geologic location. Operator has identified a positive subsurface

structure similar to ones in the area that have been known to produce economical quantities of oil.

If Operator is not granted an exception to drill the Spectre #1, then possible economic quantities

of oil or gas will be left in the ground, causing waste. Staff also believes the amended allowable

of 58 bbl/day should reasonably protect correlative rights. Staff also believes the applicant has

provided sufficient reasoning for a lack of unitizing adjacent leases in this situation.

7. As such, Staff has no objection to Operator's Motion because it believes Operator's

Application as amended would in fact prevent waste and protect correlative rights. Additionally,

there are no apparent pollution issues. Therefore, Staff is satisfied that the grant of such

Application as amended complies with the applicable statutory and regulatory requirements, and

qualifies for summary proceedings under K.S.A. 77-537.

In Conclusion, for the reasons described above, Staff recommends approval of Operator's

Application for a location exception at its proposed Spectre #1 well as amended with a respective

allowable of 58 bbl/day in order to prevent waste and protect correlative rights.
