This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Hatfield Trucking, LLC (Hatfield Trucking) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on February 6, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Jared Smith. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

**IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:** Hatfield Trucking has been assessed a \$500 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$500, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Hatfield Trucking to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <a href="http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm">http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm</a>. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

**IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing.** A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Hatfield Trucking must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-542.

**IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:** Failure to pay the penalty of \$500 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

### PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

#### I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

### II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Hatfield Trucking, LLC (Hatfield Trucking) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates USDOT number 785246.
- 5. Peggy Hatfield attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on December 15, 2008, on behalf of Hatfield Trucking.
- 6. Hatfield Trucking is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, grain, feed, hay and commodities dry bulk.

### III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on February 6, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Jared Smith conducted a compliance review of the operations of Hatfield Trucking. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
  - a. On June 2, 2017, Hatfield Trucking required or permitted its driver, Gilbert Retamoza-Guzman, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1999 Kenworth, VIN ending in 792606, GVWR 50,000 lbs., pulling a 2002 Wilson trailer, VIN ending in 235060, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Benkelman, Nebraska to Leoti, Kansas. This trip is

evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report Number NEQE00004972, dated June 2, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Hatfield Trucking failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. The special investigator found three violations of this type. Further, this carrier was cited for the same violation in a compliance review conducted on April 15, 2016. Hatfield Trucking's failure to inquire into its drivers' MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain copies of the MVRs in the driver qualification files is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

### IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Hatfield Trucking committed one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$500 for one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Hatfield Trucking be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this

Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at <a href="http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety\_meetings.htm">http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety\_meetings.htm</a>.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Hatfield Trucking submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

### V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Hatfield Trucking because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Hatfield Trucking committed one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

### THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Hatfield Trucking, LLC, of Colby, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$500 civil penalty for one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Hatfield Trucking is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.

- C. Hatfield Trucking is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. On February 27, 2018, this Penalty Order was mailed to Hatfield Trucking via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105744202. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Hatfield Trucking's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$500 civil penalty against Hatfield Trucking, and ordering a representative from Hatfield Trucking to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived

by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public

interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less

than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A.

2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$500 is due in G

thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$500 must be made through

your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at

https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$500 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service

of this Penalty Order, see K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this

Order, may result in suspension of Hatfield Trucking's motor carrier operating authority without

further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not

limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders,

and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the I.

purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.



### Safety Management Process Breakdowns and Remedies

 FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance. Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012.

The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents.

Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases, (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)). so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels, and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site.

- · Understand Why Compliance Saves Time and Money. Compliance with FMCSRs will not only save lives, but also saves your business time and money. Tracking how much your business spends on non-compliance activities can help you understand the many benefits of compliance to your business and why safety is good business.
- · Document and Follow Through on Action Plans Document and follow through on action plans to ensure the actions you are taking are creating improvement in safety management and compliance.
- NOTICE A pattern and/or repeated violations of the same or related acute or critical regulations (violations of the same Part in Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations) will cause the maximum penalties allowed by law to be assessed under Section 222 of the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999 (MCSIA). A pattern of violations means two or more violations of acute and/or critical regulations in three or more Parts of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered during any eligible investigation. Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period
- NOTICE. 49 CFR Part 391.23 requires prospective employers to, at a minimum, investigate a driver's employment information, crash record, and alcohol and controlled substances history from all employers the driver worked for within the previous 3 years.

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). Records are available 24 hours a day via Web request. Motor carriers should visit the following website for more information http://www.psp.fmcsa.dot.gov/Pages/default.aspx

violations identified within this report. Submit this letter within 30 days outlining the carrier's updated changes to their policies and procedures regarding all listed violations. Explain in detail how, as a carrier representative, you will rectify these deficiencies and prevent their reoccurrence going forward. Include any supporting documentation and evidence as indicated in the recommendations above, (example—vehicle inspections performed, proof of drug and alcohol testing in place, etc.) necessary to prove that corrective action has been taken. ### 3. DRIVER FITNESS BASIC PROCESS BREAKDOWN Monitoring and Tracking

DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Hatfield Trucking LLC's violations occurred due to a breakdown regarding the monitoring and tracking elements within this section. Carrier has established organized driver qualification files for each driver. However, you must develop a better method for ensuring that all required documentation is completed and in the driver qualification file. It is incumbent upon the carrier to execute all annual requirements for their commercial motor vehicle drivers. You need to check with former employers to make sure new hires did not have any alcohol or substance abuse violations during the previous 3 years of employment.

BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES: Develop a method for ensuring that all MVR's are completed annually, in addition make sure that you have drivers complete a listing of driver violations when you run the MVRs. Then sign the certificate qualifying them for another year if they meet the standards. Utilize pages 12 and 13 of KCC's Redbook provided to check to see if a driver has violated the alcohol and controlled substance prohibitions under part 382 or 49CFR part 40. This form must be completed within 30 days of hiring a new driver.

Implement Safety Improvement Practices. The following are recommended practices related to Monitoring and Tracking Processes.

- Implement an effective process for monitoring and documenting all drivers' job functions, training, qualifications, renewal dates, disclosed medical conditions, and operational restrictions, including those of drivers on a waiver program or with impairments that may be satisfied by a Skill Performance Evaluation certificate, to ensure that assignments are covered by qualified drivers.
- Review and retain each driver's Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) at least annually to ensure compliance with company policies, Federal regulations, and State and local laws and ordinances related to driver fitness. If a driver seems to have numerous violations, the MVR should be reviewed more often. Random MVR checks in addition to annual checks are also effective. File the MVR in each driver's driver qualification file after review.
- Maintain each driver's investigation history file in a secure location with limited and controlled access for as long as the driver is employed and for three years thereafter.
- Maintain roadside inspection reports, moving violation records, training records, the Commercial Driver's License (CDL), the dispatch schedule, bills of lading, and the medical report to help evaluate the performance of all staff involved in qualifying drivers (dispatchers and managers) and the effectiveness of the policies and procedures.
- Implement a system for keeping accurate records of employee driver fitness training needs, such as entry-level
  and HAZMAT training, and completed training, via software, a checklist in the driver's file, and/or another
  appropriate method.
- Evaluate personnel who are monitoring driver fitness performance by making sure they are reviewing driver-assignment and qualification files, applying the performance standards fairly, consistently, and equitably, and documenting the evaluations.
- Regularly evaluate the company's driver fitness-related inspection results via the Federal Motor Carner Safety
  Administration's (FMCSA) website at http://ai.fmcsa.dot.gov/SMS Assess violations for process breakdowns and
  how to remedy them. Use data to help implement an effective process beyond self-reporting to monitor, document,
  and evaluate compliance with driver-fitness regulations and company policies.
- When monitoring and tracking any driver-fitness-related issue, always assess whether it is individual or represents a systemic breakdown in one of the Safety Management Processes (Policies and Procedures, Roles and Responsibilities, etc.)

I understand that failure to satisfactorily remedy the above-listed requirements, and/or failure to comply with Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes and Regulations could result in the suspension of Hatfield Trucking LLC's operating authority and/or the impoundment of Hatfield Trucking LLC's commercial motor vehicles.
