This is a notice of a penalty assessment against MYL Trucking LLC (MYL Trucking LLC) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted from May 10 through May 24, 2023, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigators, Erica Pargas and Penny Fryback. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2023 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 28, 2022. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

**IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:** MYL Trucking LLC has been assessed a \$13,300 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$13,300, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of MYL Trucking LLC to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <a href="http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm">http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety\_meetings.htm</a>.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. MYL Trucking LLC must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. 1

**IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:** Failure to pay the penalty of \$13,300 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

### PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. From May 10 through May 24, 2023, Commission Staff Special Investigators (SIs) Erica Pargas and Penny Fryback, completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of MYL Trucking LLC (MYL Trucking LLC or Carrier). MYL Trucking LLC is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 3546573.
- 2. On May 25, 2023, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) issued the Carrier an unsatisfactory safety rating letter based on the findings of Staff's investigation. The letter gave MYL Trucking LLC sixty (60) days to improve its safety rating. On July 25, 2023, the FMCSA placed the Carrier "out-of-service" after its Unsatisfactory Rating became final. The "out-of-service" designation prohibited the Carrier from operating in interstate commerce. The Commission issued an Emergency Suspension Order on August 3, 2023, suspending the Carrier from intrastate motor carrier operations as well based on the FMCSA's suspension.

- 3. On June 8, 2023, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation (R&R), dated, attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$13,300 to be issued to MYL Trucking LLC based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigations, SIs Erica Pargas and Penny Fryback identified sixty-eight (68) violation(s), accounting for sixteen (16) count(s), of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2023 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.<sup>2</sup>
- 4. Additionally, Staff recommends that MYL Trucking LLC be required to have a representative responsibility for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.<sup>3</sup> A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at <a href="http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety">http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety</a> meetings.htm.
- 5. Staff further recommends MYL Trucking LLC submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.<sup>4</sup>
- 6. Finally, Staff recommends that MYL Trucking LLC submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.<sup>5</sup>

Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

- 7. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 8. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.
- 9. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

# IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. MYL Trucking LLC, of Lakin, KS is hereby assessed a \$13,300 civil penalty for sixty-eight (68) violation(s), accounting for sixteen (16) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. MYL Trucking LLC is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90)

days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.

- C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.
- D. MYL Trucking LLC is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of MYL Trucking LLC's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney,

unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is

in the public interest.6

G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$13,300 is due

in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$13,300 must be made

through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking

Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You

must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$13,300 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of

service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may

result in suspension of MYL Trucking LLC's motor carrier operating authority without further

notice.7 Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited

to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and

any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

MYL Trucking LLC (MYL Trucking LLC or Carrier) is a motor carrier possessing public for-hire operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling grain, feed, hay, and aggregates. MYL Trucking LLC operates under USDOT 3546573. From May 10 to May 24, 2023, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigators (SIs) Erica Pargas and Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of MYL Trucking LLC. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SIs identified sixty-eight (68) violation(s) accounting for sixteen (16) specific count(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2023 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SIs, staff recommends penalty of \$13,300 be issued to the MC.

On May 25, 2023, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) issued the Carrier an unsatisfactory safety rating letter based on the findings of Staff's investigation. The letter gave MYL Trucking LLC sixty (60) days to improve its safety rating. On July 25, 2023, the FMCSA placed the Carrier "out-of-service" after its Unsatisfactory Rating became final. The "out-of-service" designation prohibited the Carrier from operating in interstate commerce. The Commission issued an Emergency Suspension Order on August 3, 2023, suspending the Carrier from intrastate motor carrier operations as well based on the FMCSA's suspension.

#### **DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:**

From May 10 to May 24, 2023, SIs Erica Pargas and Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of MYL Trucking LLC. The investigation covers a 365 day period. Each specific count is described in detail below:

#### Count One (1 of 16)

<u>Jurisdiction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 387.7(d), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3n, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must produce from its principal place of business the required proof of financial responsibility.

Supporting Documentation: On September 30, 2022, MYL Trucking LLC permitted its diver to operate a Commercial Driver License (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2003 Kenworth truck, VIN ending 8699, gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2008 Timpte trailer, VIN ending in 7625, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Lamar, Coloardo to Dighton, Kansas. During this transport the driver was involved in a DOT recordable accident and received a citation for failure to yield. This transport is evidenced by a Driver Vehicle Examination Report Number KSHP03794557, attached hereto as Exhibit 2. A copy of the MC's Certificate of Liability Insurance in attached hereto as Exhibit 3. The Commercial General Liability section is blank indicating the carrier did not possess commercial insurance.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to produce required proof of financial responsibility. The MC was operating using personal auto insurance (**Exhibit 1, page 3**). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

#### Count Two (2 of 16)

<u>Juris diction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 396.9, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC shall not allow the operations of a commercial motor vehicle(s) that has been declared and marked as "out-of-service," without it being repaired.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count one, above. The MC was found operating the same vehicles without having corrected the "out-of-service" violations during an inspection that took place on November 9, 2022, evidenced by a Driver Vehicle Examination Report Number KSHP03794590, attached hereto as Exhibit 4.

<u>Violation:</u> On September 30, 2022, MYL Trucking LLC's trailer was declared out-of-service by the Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP). However, on November 9, 2022, the trailer previously declared out-of-service was again inspected by the KHP, see **Exhibit 4.** The Carrier had no proof or documentation the out-of-service violations had been repaired or corrected prior to their operation. The same or similar out-of-service violations were found in the November 9 inspection as in the September 30 inspection (**Exhibit 1, page 3**). One (1) violation was discovered.

<u>Recommendations:</u> Staff considers this to be an intentional violation and therefore recommends an enhanced fine of \$3,000.

#### Count Three (3 of 16)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC must require its driver to submit to a pre-employment controlled substances USDOT regulated test and to obtain a negative test result prior to requiring or permitting the driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> On December 12, 2022, MYL Trucking LLC permitted its diver to operate CDL-required CMV, a 2003 Kenworth truck, VIN ending 8699, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Kearney, Nebraska to Scott City, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Scale Ticket No. 0616851 attached hereto as **Exhibit 5**.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to obtain a pre-employment test on the driver involved in this transport (**Exhibit 1**, pages 3 to 4). Two (2) violations were discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

#### Count Four (4 of 16)

<u>Jurisdiction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 391.41, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must confirm that its driver is medically examined and certified prior to operation of a commercial motor vehicle and maintain documentation of the medical certificate in the driver qualification file pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51.

Supporting Documentation: On February 1, 2023, MYL Trucking LLC permitted its diver to operate CDL-required CMV, a 2009 International truck, VIN ending 4117, GVWR 53,200 lbs., in interstate commerce from Bertrand, Nebraska to Scott City, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Truck Shipment Lading No. 62489 attached hereto as Exhibit 6.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to require the driver involved in this transport to be medically examined and certified prior to operating a commercial motor vehicle. The carrier could not provide a medical certificate for this driver. (**Exhibit 1, pages 4**). Two (2) violations were discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

### Count Five (5 of 16)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 391.51(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC must maintain a driver qualification file pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51. <u>Supporting Documentation:</u> This violation took place during the transport described in count three, above.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to maintain a driver qualification file on the drive involved in this transport (**Exhibit 1**, pages 4 to 5). Two (2) violations was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

#### Count Six (6 of 16)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 395.8, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Intent of Law: The MC shall require its driver to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count three, above.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to require its driver to make a record of duty status (**Exhibit** 1, page 5). Twenty-four (24) violations was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

#### Count Seven (7 of 16)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 396.3, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Intent of Law: The MC shall systematically inspect, repair, and maintain, or cause to be systematically inspected, repaired, and maintained, all commercial motor vehicles subject to its control and maintain required records of such.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count three, above.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC was unable to provide a maintenance file for the vehicle involved in this transport (**Exhibit 1**, page 5). Two (2) violations was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

## Count Eight (8 of 16)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 396.17, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Intent of Law: The MC shall obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. The inspection shall be retained by the MC pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 396.21(b).

Supporting Documentation: On November 25, 2022, MYL Trucking LLC permitted its diver to operate CDL-required CMV, a 2009 International truck, VIN ending 4117, GVWR 53,200 lbs., in interstate commerce from Bertrand, Nebraska to Scott City, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Ticket Number 0009238 attached hereto as Exhibit 7.

<u>Violation</u>: MYL Trucking LLC could not provide any documentation or record of an annual inspection for the vehicle involved in this transport (**Exhibit 1**, pages 5 to 6). Four (4) violations were discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

#### Count Nine (9 of 16)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), (b) and (d), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

Intent of Law: The MC must require its drivers to submit to a post-accident test for alcohol within the first two hours or up to eight hours when a post-accident controlled substance test is required for controlled substances within thirty-two hours when a post-accident controlled substance test is required.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count

one, above.

Violation: MYL Trucking LLC failed to conduct post-accident testing for alcohol and controlled substances on its driver after a DOT recordable accident occurred during this transport (Exhibit 1, pages 6 to 7). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

#### **Count Ten (10 of 16)**

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 382.305(i)(2), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

Intent of Law: The MC must ensure each driver selected for random alcohol and controlled substance testing has an equal chance of being selected each time selections are made.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count four, above. The MC's Eligible Donor List is attached hereto as Exhibit 8.

Violation: MYL Trucking LLC failed to remove a terminated driver and add two recently hired drivers to the random drug testing pool. (Exhibit 1, page 7). Three (3) violation were discovered. Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

## Count Eleven (11 of 16)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 382.601, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Intent of Law: The MC must provide it's alcohol and controlled substance written policy that complies with 49 C.F.R. 382.601(b) to each of its CDL drivers prior to testing and having the driver sign an acknowledgement page to retain in the driver's qualification file.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count three, above.

Violation: MYL Trucking LLC failed to provide drivers with a copy of the MC's written alcohol and controlled substance policy (Exhibit 1, page 7). Two (2) violations was discovered. Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

## Count Twelve (12 of 16)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 382.701(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

Intent of Law: The MC must conduct a pre-employment inquiry into its drivers with the FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count three, above. A copy of the Queries History from the MC's DACH profile in attached as Exhibit 9. There is no history of a query for Luis Zaragoza Martinez, the driver used on this transport.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to conduct a pre-employment inquiry into the driver involved in this transport prior to allowing the driver to operate a CMV. The MC could not provide any documentation of a pre-employment inquiry on this driver (Exhibit 1, pages 7 to 8). Two (2) violations was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$650.

### Count Thirteen (13 of 16)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 391.23, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Intent of Law: The MC must obtain its driver's motor vehicle records (MVRs) within 30 days of employment and maintain the MVRs in the driver qualification files pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 391.51. Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count one, above.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to obtain an MVR within 30 days of hiring and allowing its driver to operate a CMV (Exhibit 1, page 8). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

#### Count Fourteen (14 of 16)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> K.S.A. 8-2,134(c), K.S.A 8-2,125, *et. seq.*, and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC must not allow its driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle if the driver has been a resident of Kansas for over thirty days and has not obtained a valid, Class A CDL issued by the state of Kansas.

Supporting Documentation: On February 27, 2023, MYL Trucking LLC permitted its diver to operate CDL-required CMV, a 2003 Kenworth truck, VIN ending 1891, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Pence, Kansas to Downs, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by a scale ticket attached hereto as Exhibit 10. Additionally, an MYL Trucking LLC driver list, which includes a hire date of January 1, 2022 for Octavio Pena, the driver involved in this transport, is attached hereto as Exhibit 11.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC allowed its driver to operate without a valid U.S. CDL. At the time of this transport the driver was operating on a Mexican CDL. The driver had been hired and therefore resided in Kansas as of January 1, 2022, yet was still operating using a Mexican CDL fourteen months later (**Exhibit 1**, pages 8 to 9). Three (3) violations were discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

## Count Fifteen (15 of 16)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> K.S.A. 8-1901, et. seq., and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

Intent of Law: The MC must require its drivers to stay within the legal gross weight limits for vehicles pursuant to K.S.A. 8-1909.

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport described in count four, above.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC hauled an amount over the allowed gross weight of 85,500 lbs. The ticket lists the gross weight of the vehicle on this trip as 95,400 lbs. (**Exhibit 1, page 9**). Seventeen (17) violation were discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$3,000.

#### Count Sixteen (16 of 16)

<u>Juris diction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a)(1)(iv) and 49 C.F.R. 395 Subpart B, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law:</u> The MC shall require its driver to keep records of duty status using an electronic logging device (ELD).

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> This violation took place during the transport described in count four, above.

<u>Violation:</u> MYL Trucking LLC failed to require its driver to record his hours of service using an ELD. (Exhibit 1, pages 9 to 10). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendations: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find MYL Trucking LLC committed sixty-eight (68) violation(s), accounting for sixteen (16) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$13,300 for sixty-eight (68) violation(s), accounting for sixteen (16) specific counts, of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends that MYL Trucking LLC require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at <a href="http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety">http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety</a> meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends MYL Trucking LLC submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that MYL Trucking LLC submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.



## **Specific Recommended Remedies**

# To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Monitoring and Tracking:

- 1. Implement an effective process for monitoring, tracking, and evaluating all drivers' compliance with Hours-of-Service (HOS) regulations and company policies.
- 2. Promptly review all Records of Duty Status (RODS) for Hours-of-Service (HOS) violations and falsification. Look for discrepancies by comparing driver logs with their "check-in" calls and other supporting documents.
- 3. Maintain roadside inspection, Records of Duty Status (RODS), supporting documents, dispatch schedules, and communication records to help evaluate the performance of all staff (drivers, dispatchers, and managers) involved in Hours of Service (HOS) and the effectiveness of compliance with HOS policies, procedures, and regulations.

### **BASIC: Driver Fitness**

**Process Breakdown: Qualification and Hiring** 

MYL Trucking LLC will ensure drivers are qualified by gathering all the proper documents required for a Driver Qualification file, conducting pre-employment tests and queries, and running MVR's, ensuring drivers are medically qualified prior to allowing drivers to operate a CMV.

## **Specific Recommended Remedies**

# To implement Safety Improvement Practices, the following list are recommended practices related to Qualification and Hiring:

- 1. Ensure that Motor Vehicle Records (MVRs) from States issuing Commercial Driver's Licenses (CDLs) are reviewed for driver-fitness-related violations of all prospective drivers for the last three years.
- 2. Ensure that drivers are qualified by querying applicants, checking with previous employers and references, and obtaining necessary documents regarding driver fitness, such as those pertaining to previous violations, Commercial Driver's License (CDL), medical qualifications, operational qualifications from training, and relevant experience.
- Review and evaluate gaps in employment, frequent job changes, incomplete applications, within-company applications and reassignments, operational limitations such as those pertaining to long-combination vehicles (LCVs) and HAZMAT, physical impairments, and controlled-substance and alcohol involvement.
- 4. Check the Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) to ensure that drivers have the proper class of license and "P" or "S" endorsement, and to see if the applicable endorsement on the license has a specific restriction, such as an air-brake restriction.
- 5. Ensure that the employment application captures all information required by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), such as whether the driver can handle the physical requirements of the job.


