This is a notice of a penalty assessment against A&B Transportation LLC (A&B Transportation) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on September 16, 2022, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Matt Adams. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 29, 2023. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: A&B Transportation has been assessed an \$8,250 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$8,250, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of A&B Transportation to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. A&B Transportation must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. ¹

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$8,250 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. On September 16, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Matt Adams, completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of A&B Transportation LLC (A&B Transportation or Carrier). A&B Transportation is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5, and operates under USDOT number 3481568.
- 2. On August 1, 2023, Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation (R&R), dated, attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference, recommending a penalty of \$8,250 to be issued to A&B Transportation based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered. Staff's R&R indicates that as a result of the safety compliance investigations, SI Matt Adams identified seventy-two (72) violation(s),

accounting for nine (9) count(s), of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2024 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.²

- 3. Additionally, Staff recommends that A&B Transportation be required to have a representative responsibility for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.³ A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 4. Staff further recommends A&B Transportation submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.⁴
- 5. Finally, Staff recommends that A&B Transportation submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.⁵ Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- 6. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112g and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in

Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

- 7. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.
- 8. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

IT IS THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. A&B Transportation LLC, of Kansas City, KS is hereby assessed a \$8,250 civil penalty for seventy-two (72) violation(s), accounting for nine (9) count(s), of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. A&B Transportation is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting

the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. A&B Transportation is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of A&B Transportation's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁶
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$8,250 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$8,250 must be made

through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$8,250 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of A&B Transportation's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁷ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

of Motor Carrier Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

A&B Transportation LLC (A&B Transportation) is a motor carrier (MC) possessing public for-hire operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling general freight. A&B Transportation operates under USDOT 3481568. On September 16, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator (SI) Matt Adams conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of A&B Transportation. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SI identified seventy-two (72) violations, accounting for nine (9) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2023 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SI, Staff recommends a penalty of \$8,250 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On September 16, 2022, Commission Staff SI Matt Adams conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of A&B Transportation. The investigation covers a 365 day period. Each specific count is described in detail below:

Count One (1 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 382.601, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must provide it's alcohol and controlled substance written policy that complies with 49 C.F.R. 382.601(b) to each of its CDL drivers prior to testing and having the driver sign an acknowledgement page to retain in the driver's qualification file.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> On May 21, 2022, A&B Transportation required or permitted its driver to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2014 Freightliner Cascadia, VIN ending in 2505, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a Hyundai trailer, VIN ending in 3782, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Kansas City, Kansas to Memphis, Tennessee. This transport is evidenced by Bill of Lading Number OKC5-116C4D1G3, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**.

<u>Violation:</u> A&B Transportation failed to provide a written alcohol and controlled substance policy to its drivers. Four (4) violations were discovered (Exhibit 1, Page 3). Four (4) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Two (2 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 382.701(d), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must not use a driver that was prohibited from performing safety sensitive functions in the Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse.

Supporting Documentation: On October 11, 2022, A&B Transportation required or permitted its driver to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2015 Freightliner Cascadia, VIN ending in 7323, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2020 Hyundai trailer, VIN ending in 3005, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Kansas to Minnesota. This transport is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report Number IA000TT6LNVZ, attached hereto as Exhibit 3. At the time of this transport, the driver was involved in an accident when a passenger vehicle rear ended his vehicle.

<u>Violation:</u> A&B Transportation was using a prohibited driver to perform safety sensitive functions (Exhibit 1, Page 3). One (1) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff considers this to be an intentional violation and therefore recommends an enhanced fine of \$3,500.

Count Three (3 of 9)

Jurisdiction: 49 C.F.R. 382.701(d), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC must make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> On March 23, 2022, A&B Transportation required or permitted its driver to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2015 Freightliner truck, VIN ending in 6989, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from

Franklin, Illinois to Edgerton, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Bill of Lading Number MKC4-114FZC1Q5, attached hereto as **Exhibit 4**. At the time of this transport, the driver was involved in an accident when a passenger vehicle rear ended his vehicle.

<u>Violation</u>: The MC failed to provide obtain or provide SI with MVRs for the driver which covered the 12 months preceding this transport (**Exhibit 1, Page 4**). One (1) violation were discovered **Recommendation**: Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

Count Four (4 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 395.3, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall require its drivers to cease driving operations after a period of fourteen (14) consecutive hours after coming on duty following ten (10) consecutive hours off duty.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above.

<u>Violation:</u> A&B Transportation permitted its driver to drive beyond fourteen (14) hours. (Exhibit 1, Pages 5-6). Two (2) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Five (5 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction</u>: 49 C.F.R. 395.3, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall not require its driver to drive over eleven (11) hours during one 14-hour driving period after coming on duty following 10 consecutive hours off duty.

<u>Supporting Documentation</u>: This violation took place during the transport described in Count One, above.

<u>Violation:</u> A&B Transportation permitted its driver to drive after eleven (11) hours. (**Exhibit 1, Pages 6**). Two (2) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Six (6 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(ii), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall require a "rest break" of at least thirty (30) minutes for its drivers if more than eight (8) hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off-duty or sleeperberth period.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> On August 8, 2022, A&B Transportation required or permitted its driver to operate a CDL-required CMV, a 2014 Freightliner Cascadia, VIN ending in W2505, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a Hyundai trailer, GVWR 68,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Crest Hill, Illinois, to Lenexa, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Bill of Lading Number OKC5-116C4D1G3, attached hereto as **Exhibit 5**.

<u>Violation:</u> A&B Transportation permitted its driver to drive without a 30 minute interruption of driving after eight accrued hours of driving. (Exhibit 1, Pages 6). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

Count Seven (7 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1.129.

Intent of Law: No MC or driver may make a false report in connection with a duty status.

Supporting Documentation: On March 22, 2022, A&B Transportation required or permitted its driver to operate a CDL-required CMV, a 2015 Freightliner Cascadia, VIN ending in 6989, GVWR 52,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Franklin, Illinois, to Edgerton, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Bill of Lading Number MKC4-114FZC1Q5, attached hereto as **Exhibit 6**.

<u>Violation:</u> A&B Transportation permitted its driver to driver to make a false record of duty status. The driver logged driving time as off-duty for extended portions of this transport. (Exhibit 1, Pages 6 to 7). One (1) violation was discovered.

Recommendation: Staff considers this to be an intentional violation and therefore recommends an enhanced fine of \$2,000.

Count Eight (8 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 395.8, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. <u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall not require its driver to drive in excess of seventy (70) hours in a period of eight (8) consecutive days.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> In July, 2022, A&B Transportation required or permitted its driver to operate a CDL-required CMV, a 2008 Freightliner truck, 3365, GVWR 26,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce multiple times within the state of Kansas. This transport is evidenced by undated time sheets, attached hereto as **Exhibit 7**.

<u>Violation</u>: A&B Transportation permitted its driver to create time sheets that recorded only the driver's time in, time out and total hours. The time sheets did not indicate the date, month or off-duty time and only included the driver's first name on two of the three time sheets. (Exhibit 1, Pages 7). Thirty (30) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

Count Nine (9 of 9)

<u>Jurisdiction:</u> 49 C.F.R. 395.8(k), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129.

<u>Intent of Law</u>: The MC shall obtain from its drivers and retain supporting documents and the record of duty status for a period of six (6) months.

<u>Supporting Documentation:</u> This violation took place during the transport described in Count Eight, above.

<u>Violation:</u> A&B Transportation failed to preserve supporting documents for loads hauled by the carrier. (Exhibit 1, Pages 3). Thirty (30) violations were discovered.

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$900.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find A&B Transportation committed seventy-two (72) violation(s) accounting for nine (9) specific counts of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$5,550 for nine (9) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends A&B Transportation require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends A&B Transportation submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that A&B Transportation submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.
