ORDER GRANTING KPP ENERGY'S PETITION TO INTERVENE

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed the pleadings and record, the Commission makes the following findings:

- 1. On April 29, 2024, the Western Cooperative Electric Association, Inc. ("Western") filed an Application to update its Local Access Delivery Service ("LADS") tariff.¹
- 2. On May 7, 2024, KPP Energy, A Municipal Energy Agency ("KPP") filed its Petition to Intervene, explaining that KPP provides wholesale capacity, energy, and transmission service to its members, which are located in the Westar Energy transmission zone, the Sunflower Electric Power Corporation ("Sunflower") zone, and the Midwest Energy zone.² Western is a

member-owner of Sunflower.³ KPP is one of Western's wholesale local access customers, and as

such, pays the LADS rate. ⁴ Three of KPP's member cities are served by Western's facilities. ⁵

3. KPP and, ultimately, its members, will or may be bound by any Commission Order

or activity in this proceeding, and KPP and its members may be adversely affected thereby. KPP

asserts its interests are not represented adequately by any other party to this proceeding and its

intervention will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the proceedings.⁶

4. The Commission has broad discretion to grant a petition for intervention if it is in

the interest of justice, if the intervention will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the

proceedings, and if the party has stated facts demonstrating its legal rights, duties, and privileges,

immunities, or other legal interests may be substantially affected by the proceeding.⁷

5. The Commission finds KPP has demonstrated an interest in this proceeding.

Therefore, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-521, the Commission grants KPP's Petition to Intervene.

6. KPP will be added to the official service list. Service of pleadings, communications,

and correspondence should be delivered to counsel of record, as follows:
