This is a notice of a penalty assessment against B&H Landworks, LLC ("B&H Landworks") for violations of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on January 27, 2025, by a Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator. The Special Investigator identified ten (10) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety regulations. Penalties for the violations are assessed in accordance with the FY 2025 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2024. B&H Landworks has been assessed a \$850.00 penalty. For a full description of the penalties and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$850.00 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network ("KTRAN") system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order also requires a representative of B&H Landworks:

- a. To attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of the Order. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.
- b. To submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.
- c. To submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, and within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. You may request a hearing through the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and you must also mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an

original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.¹

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$850.00 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission"). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority, and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority, and jurisdiction.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-129a, 66-1,130, and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision, or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

4. B&H Landworks, LLC ("B&H Landworks" or "Carrier") is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5 and operates under USDOT number 3890201.

The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over B&H Landworks pursuant to K.S.A.
66-1,108b because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R.
82-4-3f.

6. On January 27, 2025, a Commission Transportation Staff ("Transportation Staff" or "Staff") Special Investigator ("SI") completed a safety compliance investigation of B&H Landworks. As a result of the compliance investigation, the SI identified ten (10) violations, set forth in four (4) counts of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations ("MCSRs"), which carry a penalty set forth in the FY2025 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.¹

7. On January 28, 2025, Transportation Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation ("R&R"), attached hereto as "Attachment A" and hereby incorporated by reference herein, recommending a penalty of \$850.00 to be issued to B&H Landworks based on the frequency, timeline, and severity of the violations discovered.

8. Specifically, pursuant to Staff's R&R, the Commission finds that B&H Landworks committed ten (10) violations of the following four (4) counts, discussed more fully in Staff's R&R:²

- a. Count 1: On November 21, 2024, B&H Landworks required or permitted its driver, Todd Landers, to operate a commercial driver's license required commercial motor vehicle (a 1992 Freightliner, VIN ending in 8602, GVWR 85,000 lbs.) in Kansas on a public road (intrastate commerce from Florence, Kansas, to Burns, Kansas) without providing evidence of having attended the required training prior to this transport, which resulted in one (1) violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.603, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of a penalty of \$100.00 is appropriate and in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.
- b. Count 2: On November 21, 2024, and again on December 3, 2024, B&H Landworks required or permitted its driver, Todd Landers, to operate a commercial driver's license required commercial motor vehicle (a 1992 Freightliner, VIN ending in 8602, GVWR 85,000 lbs.) in Kansas on a public road (intrastate commerce from Florence, Kansas, to Burns, Kansas) without first conducting an annual inquiry into the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse. B&H Landworks failed to conduct annual inquiries into drivers Todd Landers and Justin Jones, which resulted in two (2) violations of 49 C.F.R. 382.701(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of a penalty of \$250.00 is appropriate and in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.
- c. Count 3: On November 21, 2024, and again on December 3, 2024, B&H Landworks required or permitted its driver, Todd Landers, to operate a commercial driver's license required commercial motor vehicle (a 1992 Freightliner, VIN ending in 8602, GVWR 85,000 lbs.) in Kansas on a public road (intrastate commerce from

Florence, Kansas, to Burns, Kansas) without first maintaining a copy of the motor vehicle record or response from each State agency in the driver qualification file. B&H Landworks failed to provide the SI a copy of the motor vehicle records for drivers Todd Landers and Justin Jones, which resulted in two (2) violations of 49 C.F.R. 391.25(c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of a penalty of \$250.00 is appropriate and in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.

d. Count 4: On November 14, 20, 21, 22, 2024, and on December 3, 2024, B&H Landworks required or permitted its driver, Todd Landers, to operate a commercial driver's license required commercial motor vehicle (a 1992 Freightliner, VIN ending in 8602, GVWR 85,000 lbs.) in Kansas on a public road (intrastate commerce from Florence, Kansas, to Burns, Kansas) without first requiring its driver to prepare a record of duty status. As outlined in Staff's R&R, Todd Landers failed to prepare a record of duty status on five transports, which resulted in five (5) violations of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of a penalty of \$250.00 is appropriate and in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.

The Commission hereby adopts Staff's findings as contained in its January 28,
2025, R&R.

10. The Commission finds that B&H Landworks is required to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order.³ A schedule of the dates and locations for safety

seminars be found the Commission's website can on at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

11. The Commission further finds that B&H Landworks is required to submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") that is satisfactory to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.⁴

12. The Commission further finds that B&H Landworks is required to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order at a time agreeable to Staff.⁵

13. Failure to comply with the requirements of this Penalty Order shall result in suspension of B&H Landworks' motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁶

14. The Commission concludes the penalty of \$850.00 for the ten violations set forth above, and the additional three requirements set forth in paragraphs 10, 11, and 12 are just and reasonable.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

A. B&H Landworks is hereby assessed a \$850.00 civil penalty for ten (10) violations, set forth in four (4) counts of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative regulations, and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. B&H Landworks is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order.

C. B&H Landworks is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan ("CAP") that is satisfactory to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.

D. B&H Landworks is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order at a time agreeable to Staff.

E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Acting Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of B&H Landworks' right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.

F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500.00, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless

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waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁷ For civil penalties of \$500.00 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.⁸

G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$850.00 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$850.00 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network ("KTRAN") system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure of B&H Landworks to perform, pay, or fully comply with the provisions of this Order, including but not limited to Ordering Clauses A through D, above, will result in suspension of B&H Landworks' motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁹ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

In the Matter of the Investigation of **B&H Landworks**, **LLC of Augusta**, **Kansas** Regarding the Violation of the Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations and the Commission's Authority to Impose Penalties, Sanctions and/or the Revocation of Motor Carrier Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

B&H Landworks, LLC ("B&H Landworks") is a motor carrier ("MC") possessing public for-hire operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling dirt, rock, and aggregate. B&H Landworks LLC operates under USDOT 3890201.

On January 27, 2025, a Commission Staff Special Investigator ("SI") completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of B&H Landworks, LLC. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SI identified ten (10) violations, set forth in four (4) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations ("MCSRs"), which carries a penalty according to the FY2025 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SI, Staff recommends a penalty of \$850.00 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On January 27, 2025, a Commission Staff SI conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of B&H Landworks. The investigation covers a 365-day period and any previous compliance review. Each specific count is detailed below.

Count One: (1 of 4)

Authority: K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

Relevant Statutes: 49 C.F.R 382.603 states: "Each employer shall ensure that all persons designated to supervise drivers receive at least 60 minutes of training on alcohol misuse and receive at least an additional 60 minutes of training on controlled substances use. The training will be used by the supervisors to determine whether reasonable suspicion exists to require a driver to undergo testing under § 382.307. The training shall include the physical, behavioral, speech, and performance indicators of probable alcohol misuse and use of controlled substances. Recurrent training for supervisory personnel is not required."

Material Facts and Supporting Documentation: On November 21, 2024, B&H Landworks required or permitted its driver, Todd Landers, to operate a commercial driver's license ("CDL") required commercial motor vehicle ("CMV"), a 1992 Freightliner, VIN ending in 8602, GVWR 85,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Florence, Kansas to Burns, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by a load ticket # 762136 and 762157, attached hereto as Exhibit 2. The MC did not provide evidence of having attended the required training prior to this

2. The MC did not provide evidence of having attended the required training prior to this transport.

Violation: B&H Landworks failed to provide evidence of having attended the required training (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 3**). This is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.603, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c. One (1) violation was discovered (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 9**).

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$100.00 in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.

Count Two: (2 of 4)

Authority: K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

<u>Relevant Statutes</u>: 49 C.F.R 382.701 (b) states: "Employers must conduct a query of the Clearinghouse at least once per year for information for all employees subject to controlled substance and alcohol testing under this part to determine whether information exists in the Clearinghouse about those employees."

Supporting Documentation: This violation took place during the transport on November 11, 2024, described in Count One, above. A copy of the MCs FMCSA Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse ("DACH") report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 3.** The report does not state an annual inquiry into driver Todd Landers or Justin Jones was completed.

Violation: B&H Landwork failed to conduct an annual inquiry in the DACH for its drivers, which is a violation of 49 C.F.R 382.701 (b), adopted by K.A.R 82-4-3c (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 3**). Two (2) violations were discovered (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 9**).

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.00 in accordance with the FY 2025 Penalty Matrix.

Count Three: (3 of 4)

Authority: K.S.A.66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

Relevant Statues: 49 C.F.R 391.25 states: "Except as provided in subpart G of this part, each motor carrier shall, at least once every 12 months, make an inquiry to obtain the motor vehicle record of each driver it employs, covering at least the preceding 12 months, to each driver's licensing authority where the driver held a commercial motor vehicle operator's license or permit during the time period. "

<u>Material Facts and Supporting Documentation</u>: This violation took place during the transport on November 11, 2024, described in Count One, above. The MC failed to have a motor vehicle record ("MVR") on file for drivers Todd Landers or Justin Jones prior to December 9, 2024.

<u>Violation</u>: B&H Landworks failed to maintain a copy of the MVR or response from each State agency in the driver qualification file, which is a violation of 49 C.F.R

391.25(c)(1), adopted by K.A.R 82-4-3g (Exhibit 1, Pages 3 to 4). Two (2) violations discovered (Exhibit 1, Page 9).

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.00 in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.

Count Four: (4 of 4)

Authority: K.S.A.66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

Relevant Statutes: 49 C.F.R 395.8 (a) states: "Except for a private motor carrier of passengers (nonbusiness), as defined in § 390.5 of this sub chapter, a motor carrier subject to the requirements of this part must require each driver used by the motor carrier to record the driver's duty status for each 24-hour period using the method prescribed in paragraphs (a)(1)(i) through (iii) of this section, as applicable".

<u>Material Facts and Supporting Documentation</u>: This violation took place during the transport on November 11, 2024, described in Count One, above. At the time of this transport the MC failed to require its driver, Todd Landers, to prepare a record of duty status as required by 395.8. Todd Landers failed to prepare a record of duty status on November 14, 20, 21, 22, 2024 and December 3, 2024.

<u>Violation</u>: B&H Landworks failed to require its driver to prepare a record of duty status as required, which is a violation of 49 C.F.R 395.8 (a)(1), adopted by K.A.R 82-4-3a (Exhibit 1, Page 4). Five (5) violations discovered (Exhibit 1, Page 9).

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$250.00 in accordance with the FY 2025 Penalty Matrix.

<u>RECOMMENDATION</u>:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find B&H Landworks, LLC committed ten (10) violations, set forth as four (4) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations ("FMCSRs"), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations ("K.A.R.s"), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$850.00 for ten (10) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends B&H Landworks, LLC require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of the Order. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at <u>http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>.

Staff further recommends B&H Landworks, LLC submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that B&H Landworks, LLC submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.
