This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Ark Valley Tire and Service Inc d/b/a Ark Valley Tire Inc ("Ark Valley") for violations of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted from August 28, 2025, to September 8, 2025, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigators. The Special Investigators identified two (2) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety regulations. Penalties for the violations are assessed in accordance with the FY 2026 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on July 1, 2025. Ark Valley has been assessed a \$350.00 penalty. For a full description of the penalties and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$350.00 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network ("KTRAN") system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Commission's Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order also requires a representative of Ark Valley:

- a. To attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- b. To submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") to Commission Transportation Staff (Staff) within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.
- c. To submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Penalty Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, and within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. You may request a hearing through the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and you must also mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an

original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.¹

<u>IF YOU FAIL TO ACT</u>: Failure to pay the penalty of \$350.00 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission"). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority, and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority, and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130, and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision, or regulation of the Commission.

- 3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.
- 4. Ark Valley Tire and Service Inc d/b/a Ark Valley Tire Inc ("Ark Valley" or "Carrier") is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5 and operates under USDOT number 4174541.
- 5. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Ark Valley pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,108b because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.
- 6. From August 28, 2025, to September 8, 2025, Commission Staff Special Investigators ("SIs") completed a safety compliance investigation of Ark Valley. As a result of the compliance investigation, the SIs identified two (2) violations, set forth in two (2) counts of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations ("MCSRs"), which carries a penalty set forth in the FY2026 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.¹
- 7. On September 16, 2025, Commission Transportation Staff ("Staff") submitted its Report and Recommendation ("R&R"), attached hereto as "Attachment A" and hereby incorporated by reference herein, recommending a penalty of \$350.00 to be issued to Ark Valley based on the frequency, timeline, and severity of the violations discovered.
- 8. Specifically, pursuant to Staff's R&R, the Commission finds that Ark Valley committed two (2) violations of the following two (2) counts, discussed more fully in Staff's R&R:²

- a. Count 1: On March 31, 2025, Ark Valley required or permitted its driver, Myron Koehn, to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV) (a 2012 Freightliner, VIN ending in 9810, GVWR 33,000 lbs., in) in Kansas on a public road (Cimarron, Kansas to Lakin, Kansas) without first providing its driver with a written alcohol and controlled substances policy, resulting in one (1) violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.601, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of a penalty of \$100.00 is appropriate and in accordance with the FY2026 Penalty Matrix.
- b. Count 2: On March 31, 2025, Ark Valley required or permitted its driver, Myron Koehn, to operate a CDL-required CMV (a 2012 Freightliner, VIN ending in 9810, GVWR 33,000 lbs., in) in Kansas on a public road (Cimarron, Kansas to Lakin, Kansas) without maintaining the qualification of the inspector who performed the annual inspection on the 2012 Freightliner involved in this transport, resulting in one (1) violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.19(b), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of a penalty of \$250.00 is appropriate and in accordance with the FY2026 Penalty Matrix.
- 9. The Commission hereby adopts Staff's September 16, 2025, R&R as additional findings.
- 10. The Commission finds that Ark Valley is required to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order.³ A schedule of the dates and locations for safety

seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

- 11. The Commission further finds that Ark Valley is required to submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") that is satisfactory to Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.⁴
- 12. The Commission further finds that Ark Valley is required to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order at a time agreeable to Staff.⁵
- 13. Failure to comply with the requirements of this Penalty Order shall result in the suspension of Ark Valley' motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁶
- 14. The Commission concludes the penalty of \$350.00 for the two (2) violations set forth above, and the additional three requirements set forth in paragraphs 10, 11, and 12 are just and reasonable.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

A. Ark Valley Tire and Service Inc d/b/a Ark Valley Tire Inc is hereby assessed a \$350.00 civil penalty for two (2) violations, set forth in the two (2) counts of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative regulations, and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

- B. Ark Valley is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days of the date of this Order.
- C. Ark Valley is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan ("CAP") that is satisfactory to Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.
- D. Ark Valley is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order at a time agreeable to Staff.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Ark Valley' right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- F. If a request for a hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500.00, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its

attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such

waiver is in the public interest. For civil penalties of \$500.00 or less, a corporation may appear

by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.⁸

If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$350.00 is due G.

thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$350.00 must be made through

your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory

Assistance Network ("KTRAN") system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have

an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

Н. Failure of Ark Valley to perform, pay, or fully comply with the provisions of this

Order, including but not limited to Ordering Clauses A through D, above, will result in suspension

of Ark Valley' motor carrier operating authority without further notice. 9 Additionally, the

enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies

available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

the Revocation of Motor Carrier Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Ark Valley Tire Inc (Ark Valley) is a motor carrier (MC) possessing private operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling tire pieces. Ark Valley Tire Inc operates under USDOT 4174541. From August 28, 2025, to September 8, 2025, Commission Staff Special Investigators (SIs) completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Ark Valley. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SIs identified two (2) violations, set forth as two (2) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2026 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SIs, staff recommends penalty of \$350 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On August 28, 2025, Commission Staff SIs conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Ark Valley. The investigation covers a 365-day period and any previous compliance review. Each specific count is detailed below.

Count One (1 of 2)

Authority: K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

Relevant Statutes: 49 C.F.R 382.601 states: "Each employer shall provide educational materials that explain the requirements of this part and the employer's policies and procedures with respect to meeting these requirements.

- (1) The employer shall ensure that a copy of these materials is distributed to each driver prior to the start of alcohol and controlled substances testing under this part and to each driver subsequently hired or transferred into a position requiring driving a commercial motor vehicle.
- (2) Each employer shall provide written notice to representatives of employee organizations of the availability of this information.

<u>Material Facts and Supporting Documents:</u> On March 31, 2025, Ark Valley required or permitted its driver, Myron Koehn, to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2012 Freightliner, VIN ending in 9810, GVWR 33,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Cimarron, Kansas to Lakin, Kansas. This transport is evidenced by driver, Myron Koehn's timecard, attached hereto as **Exhibit 2**.

<u>Violation</u>: Ark Valley failed to provide a complete Drug & Alcohol policy that meets all the requirements of 382.601(b)1-12, which is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.601(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c. (Exhibit 1, Page 3). One (1) violation discovered. (Exhibit 1, Page 11). <u>Recommendation:</u> Staff recommends a fine of \$100, in accordance with the FY2026 Penalty Matrix.

Count Two (2 of 2)

<u>Authority:</u> K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

Relevant Statutes: 49 C.F.R. 396.19 states: "Motor carriers and intermodal equipment providers must retain evidence of that individual's qualifications under this section. They must retain this evidence for the period during which that individual is performing annual motor vehicle inspections for the motor carrier or intermodal equipment provider, and for one year thereafter." **Material Facts and Supporting Documents**: This violation took place during the transport on March 31, 2025, described in Count One, above. The 2012 Freightliner involved in this transport had been inspected by Rodney Staats. A copy of the Record of Annual Inspection is attached hereto as **Exhibit 3**. The MC had no record of the inspector qualifications for Inspector Rodney Staats.

<u>Violation</u>: Ark Valley failed to provide evidence of inspector qualifications for inspector Rodney Staats, which is a violation of 396.19(b) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 6**). One (1) violation discovered (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 11**).

Recommendation: Staff recommends a \$250.00, in accordance with the FY2026 Penalty Matrix.

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find Ark Valley Tire Inc committed two (2) violations, set forth as two (2) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the

Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$350 for two (2) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends Ark Valley Tire Inc require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of the Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends Ark Valley Tire Inc submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that Ark Valley Tire Inc submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.
