This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Oscar Hernandez (Oscar Hernandez) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 16, 2019, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2020 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on July 16, 2019. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Oscar Hernandez has been assessed a \$1,300 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$1,300, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Oscar Hernandez to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Oscar Hernandez must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$1,300 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

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The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. **JURISDICTION**

Pursuant to K.A.R. 82-4-1b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1. 1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.A.R. 82-4-1, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Oscar Hernandez (Oscar Hernandez) operates under USDOT number 1475307.

5. Oscar Hernandez attended the Procedures for Safety Compliance Seminar presented by the Kansas Corporation Commission, on July 29, 2019, on behalf of Oscar Hernandez.

6. Oscar Hernandez is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls road materials.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on August 16, 2019, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of Oscar Hernandez. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

a. On July 16, 2019, Oscar Hernandez required or permitted its driver, Oscar Hernandez-Mendoza, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 641113, GVWR 56,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Alma, Oklahoma to Great Bend, Kansas. This

trip is evidenced by a Driver's Daily Log, dated July 16, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Oscar Hernandez had not paid his 2019 Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees. The carrier's failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicle(s) operating in interstate commerce and to pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as set out in 49 C.F.R. 367.60, is a violation of K.A.R. 82-4-30a, authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$300.

- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a, above, Oscar Hernandez did not obtain a fuel permit for Kansas or obtain an IFTA license as he made five trips to Oklahoma during the month of July. The carrier's failure to obtain a fuel permit for Kansas or obtain an IFTA license is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 392.2 and adopted by K.A.R. 79-34,102. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- c. On July 8, 2019, Oscar Hernandez required or permitted its driver, Oscar Hernandez-Mendoza, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Peterbilt, VIN ending in 641113, GVWR 56,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Alva, Oklahoma. This trip is evidenced by a Driver's Daily Log, dated July 8, 2019, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Oscar Hernandez had not obtained a pre-employment alcohol and controlled substance test with a

negative result for its driver. The carrier's failure to require its driver to submit to a pre-employment alcohol and/or controlled substances USDOT regulated test and to obtain a negative test result within 30 days of him/her employment and prior to requiring or permitting him/her to operate a commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

d. During the transportation described in paragraph c, above, Oscar Hernandez-Mendoza drover more than 11 hours following his last 10 hour break. The carrier's failure to require its driver to cease driving after the 11th hour during the 14-hour consecutive hours of driving time after coming on duty following 10 consecutive hours off duty is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(i), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Oscar Hernandez committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,300 for four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Oscar Hernandez be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Oscar Hernandez submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Oscar Hernandez because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.A.R. 82-4-1.

13. The Commission finds Oscar Hernandez committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Oscar Hernandez, of Garden City, KS is hereby assessed a \$1,300 civil penalty for four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. Oscar Hernandez is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.

C. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order.

D. Oscar Hernandez is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.

E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Oscar Hernandez's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$1,300 civil penalty against Oscar Hernandez, and ordering a representative from Oscar Hernandez to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.

F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is

in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$1,300 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$1,300 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$1,300 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Oscar Hernandez's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.




