

#### **DIRECT TESTIMONY OF RONALD D. BRIDGEWATER**

#### 1 I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

- 2 Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS.
- 3 A. My name is Ronald D. Bridgewater. My business address is 100 West Fifth Street, Tulsa
  4 Oklahoma 74103.

#### 5 Q. BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED AND IN WHAT CAPACITY?

6 A. I am employed by ONEOK, Inc. as Vice President of Asset Management and Engineering.

#### 7 Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR EDUCATIONAL BACKGROUND AND PROFESSIONAL

#### 8 **EXPERIENCE.**

9 A. I earned a Bachelors degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Missouri in

10 1988. Upon graduation I began employment with KPL Gas Service Company, the predecessor

11 to Kansas Gas Service, as a Distribution Engineer. Since then, my entire career has been

12 devoted to work in the natural gas industry. I have held several positions in the areas of

13 engineering, regulatory compliance, and operations management. I was named Vice President

14 of Asset Management and Engineering for ONEOK, Inc.'s distribution companies effective

15 January 1, 2013. Prior to that position, I was Vice President of Kansas Gas Service East

16 Region Operations.

#### 17 Q. HAVE YOU PREVIOUSLY TESTIFIED BEFORE THE COMMISSION?

DIRECT TESTIMONY OF RONALD D. BRIDGEWATER

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2 A. Yes. I have testified before the Kansas Corporation Commission ("Commission") on
3 numerous occasions.

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#### 4 Q. WHAT IS THE SCOPE OF YOUR TESTIMONY?

5 A. I am providing testimony in support of ONEOK, Inc.'s ("ONEOK") request for the 6 Commission to issue an order authorizing ONEOK to implement its reorganization plan. 7 ONEOK is proposing to place its natural gas utility distribution business into a separate 8 corporation in order to create two independent publicly traded companies. The name of the 9 new corporation will be ONE Gas, Inc. ("ONE Gas"). In my testimony below, I explain how 10 the reorganization will allow Kansas Gas Service to continue to provide safe and reliable 11 service to its customers in Kansas.

#### 12 II. KANSAS GAS SERVICE'S OPERATIONS UNDER ONE GAS

#### 13 Q. HOW WILL KANSAS GAS SERVICE CONDUCT ITS OPERATIONS IN KANSAS

#### 14 FOLLOWING THE REORGANIZATION?

15 A. Kansas Gas Service, as a division of ONE Gas, will conduct its operations in the same manner as it did prior to the reorganization. The employees who provide natural gas transmission and 16 17 distribution service to customers in Kansas today will be the same employees who provide 18 natural gas transmission and distribution service after the reorganization. Kansas Gas Service 19 operations centers in Topeka, Overland Park, Wichita, Hutchinson, Salina, Leavenworth, 20 Pittsburg and other communities in Kansas will continue to provide natural gas distribution 21 services to our customers. Kansas Gas Service will continue to have its information center in 22 Topeka Kansas. Kansas Gas Service workers who are members of the International

1 Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) and the United Steel Workers (USW) will 2 continue to provide natural gas service to our customers pursuant to our collective bargaining 3 agreements with the unions. Kansas Gas Service will continue to honor its franchise 4 agreements with all the communities in which it operates. Kansas Gas Service will continue 5 to buy natural gas for resale to its customers and will assume responsibility for all gas purchase 6 contracts and transportation agreements which Kansas Gas Service had entered to acquire 7 natural gas for delivery to its sales customers. Contracts which Kansas Gas Service had entered 8 with third party vendors to support our operational and construction activities will remain in 9 place with Kansas Gas Service after the reorganization. From an operational perspective, 10 Kansas Gas Service's customers in Kansas will see no difference in how our operations are 11 conducted. The telephone numbers to call for customer inquiries will be the same, the trucks 12 will be the same and the employee getting out of the truck to serve our customers and operate 13 our system will be the same.

### 14 Q. HOW WILL CORPORATE SERVICES BE PROVIDED BY ONE GAS TO KANSAS 15 GAS SERVICE?

16 A. The same services will continue to be provided by the ONE Gas corporate office as were 17 provided by the ONEOK corporate office before the reorganization. The ONE Gas corporate 18 office will continue to provide various services including human resources, legal, accounting, 19 tax, investor relations, communications, treasury and information technology. As discussed 20 in Mr. Dittemore's testimony, the cost of these services will be allocated among the Kansas, 21 Texas and Oklahoma utility divisions of ONE Gas pursuant to a Cost Allocation Manual 22 ("CAM"), which will be virtually the same as the CAM used by ONEOK and Kansas Gas 1 Service and currently on file with the Commission.

## 2 Q. WILL KANSAS GAS SERVICE, A DIVISION OF ONE GAS, CONTINUE TO BE 3 SUBJECT TO THE COMMISSION'S JURISDICTION FOR MATTERS OF SAFETY 4 AND RELIABILITY?

5 A. Yes. Kansas Gas Service/ONE Gas will adopt the Operation and Maintenance Manuals
currently in place for Kansas Gas Service/ONEOK. The procedures and practices set forth in
the manuals will continue to be the procedures and practices of Kansas Gas Service. As we
have in the past, the manuals will continue to be reviewed and analyzed to determine ways in
which our practices and procedures can be improved to enhance public safety and reliability.

## BARE STEEL SERVICE LINES PER YEAR AS ADDRESSED IN DOCKET NO. 11-KGSG-177-TAR?

WILL KANSAS GAS SERVICE CONTINUE ITS PROGRAM TO REPLACE 10,000

### 13 A. Yes, Kansas Gas Service will continue its bare steel service line replacement program as addressed in that docket.

### 15 Q. WILL KANSAS GAS SERVICE CONTINUE ITS PROGRAM TO REPLACE CAST 16 IRON PIPE AS ADDRESSED IN DOCKET NO. 12-KGSG-721-TAR?

Yes, Kansas Gas Service will continue its cast iron replacement program. The program has
been proceeding well and we expect that by the end of this calendar year, only 87 miles of cast
iron pipe will remain in operation compared to the 108 miles in operation when the docket was
filed in the spring of 2012. Executing on all of our safety programs is a core principal of
Kansas Gas Service and ONEOK, and it will be the same for ONE Gas. Safety will not be
compromised as a result of the reorganization.

## Q. WILL KANSAS GAS SERVICE CONTINUE ITS INTEGRITY MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS TO ADDRESS DISTRIBUTION PIPELINE AND TRANSMISSION PIPELINE INTEGRITY MANAGEMENT?

4 A. Yes. Kansas Gas Service will continue to address pipeline integrity through adherence to the
existing distribution integrity management plan (DIMP) and existing transmission integrity
management plan (IMP) included in Kansas Gas Service's Operation and Maintenance
Manuals. These programs will be continued without change due to the reorganization.

## 8 Q. WILL KANSAS GAS SERVICE CONTINUE ITS CONTROL ROOM 9 MANAGEMENT PROGRAM?

10 A. Yes. Kansas Gas Service will continue its control room management practices through
 adherence to the existing Kansas Gas Service Control Room Management Plan included in
 Kansas Gas Service's Operations and Maintenance Manuals. The program will not change due
 to the reorganization.

# 14 Q. MR. BRIDGEWATER, DO YOU HAVE ANY OTHER COMMENTS THAT YOU 15 WOULD LIKE TO MAKE TO THE COMMISSION REGARDING THE PROPOSED 16 REORGANIZATION AND COMMISSION OVERSIGHT OF KANSAS GAS 17 SERVICE, A DIVISION OF ONE GAS?

18 A. The most important thing the Commission should know is that from an operational standpoint, 19 the reorganization will not change Kansas Gas Service's commitment to provide safe, reliable 20 and efficient natural gas service. The people the Commission contacted the day before the 21 transaction closes will be the same people the Commission will engage the day after the 22 transaction closes. With this transaction, the Commission is not dealing with a new, unknown,

1	outside buyer who may be unfamiliar with the day to day operations of Kansas Gas Service.
2	If the Commission Pipeline Safety Staff has operational questions, they will contact the same
3	people they call today. There is no new buyer and therefore no learning curve associated with
4	this transaction. The people of Kansas Gas Service and ONE Gas are steeped in a long
5	tradition of operating our physical plant in Kansas in a safe and efficient manner and we intend
6	to continue that tradition after the reorganization is complete.
