This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on April 22, 2013, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Larry Baumchen. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$3,000 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. Payment is to be mailed to the Fiscal Section of the Kansas Corporation Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by calling the Fiscal Office at 785-271-3274.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 12 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. A Request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operations.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. KC Granite & Cabinetry, LLC (KC Granite & Cabinetry) operates under USDOT number 2365081.
 - 5. KC Granite & Cabinetry is a private motor carrier.
 - 6. KC Granite & Cabinetry primarily hauls countertops and cabinets.

III. STAFF'S STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on April 22, 2013, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Larry Baumchen conducted a compliance review of the operations of KC Granite & Cabinetry. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Baumchen identified six (6) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On or about September 26, 2012, KC Granite & Cabinetry required or permitted its driver, Tin Y. Tai, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2006 Ford, VIN _______, on an intrastate trip from Lenexa, Kansas, to Wichita, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by the Driver/Vehicle Examination Report contained herein as Attachment "B." At the time of this transportation, KC Granite & Cabinetry required or permitted its driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle without the

- proper Commission authority. The carrier's commercial operation of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h and authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- b. On or about March 20, 2013, KC Granite & Cabinetry required or permitted its driver, Armando Borunda-Andrade, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2002 Ford, VIN on an intrastate trip from Lenexa, Kansas, to Olathe, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by the Driver/Vehicle Examination Report contained herein as Attachment "C." At the time of this transportation, KC Granite & Cabinetry failed to maintain a driver qualification file for Mr. Borunda-Andrade. KC Granite & Cabinetry's failure to maintain a driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.51(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,129. The Special Investigator noted two violations of this type. Staff recommends a fine of \$800.
- c. At the time of the transportation described in paragraph "b" above, KC Granite & Cabinetry failed to require its driver to make a record of duty status for March 20, 2013. KC Granite & Cabinetry's failure to require its drivers to record records of duty status for each 24-hour period, or in the alternative to maintain and retain time records described in 49 C.F.R. 395.1(e) under the short haul exemption, using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) and to submit the original record to the motor carrier

- within 13 days of creation is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a) as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a and authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine in the amount of \$500.
- d. At the time of the transportation described in paragraph "b" above, KC Granite & Cabinetry failed to maintain minimum records of inspection and vehicle maintenance for the 2002 Ford. KC Granite & Cabinetry's failure to maintain the required vehicle inspection records and vehicle maintenance records for 30 days is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.3(b), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j and as authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- e. At the time of the transportation described in paragraph "b" above, KC Granite & Cabinetry required or permitted its driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle without first completing a driver vehicle inspection report (DVIR). KC Granite & Cabinetry's failure to require each of its drivers to prepare a DVIR in writing, at the completion of each day's work, on each vehicle operated and to submit copies of the reports to the motor carrier for action and record retention is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.11(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$200.
- f. At the time of the transportation described in paragraph "b" above, KC Granite & Cabinetry failed obtain and document a successful periodic (annual) inspection on the commercial motor vehicle during the preceding 12-month period. This violation is evidenced by the absence of a periodic

(annual) inspection report in the maintenance file of the vehicle at the time of the compliance review. KC Granite & Cabinetry's failure to conduct periodic (annual) inspections on commercial motor vehicles is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.17(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find KC Granite & Cabinetry committed six (6) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$3,000 for six (6) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that KC Granite & Cabinetry be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that KC Granite & Cabinetry submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next twelve (12) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over KC Granite & Cabinetry because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 66-1,108.

13. The Commission finds KC Granite & Cabinetry committed six (6) violations of Kansas law that govern motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. KC Granite & Cabinetry, LLC, of Lenexa, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$3,000 civil penalty for six (6) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. KC Granite & Cabinetry is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, KC Granite & Cabinetry is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next twelve (12) months.
- C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Executive Director, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of KC Granite & Cabinetry's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$3,000 civil penalty against KC Granite & Cabinetry, and ordering KC Granite & Cabinetry to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with

written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within twelve (12) months from the date of service of this Order.

- D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. A corporation shall not be permitted to enter an appearance, except by its attorney.
- E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Fiscal Section of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.
- F. Failure to pay the \$3,000 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in revocation of KC Granite & Cabinetry's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.
- G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further order or orders as it may deem necessary.

- 7. Be sure to conduct the required road test or place a copy of the drivers CDL in the drivers qualification file before allowing a driver to driver a commercial motor vehicle.
- 8. Drivers may not driver in intra or inter state commerce until they have received a medical exam and certificate
- 9. Employment Application must contain information about accident history and previous DOT regulated employment for the past three years.
- 10. Drivers who utilize the 100/150 air mile exemption must have time records that list the following: Start time--End Time--Total hours worked each day--all other terms of the exemption must be met.
- 11. Establish and adhere to a program that identifies the dates of nature of inspection/maintenance and repair procedures for each commercial motor vehicle in your fleet.
- 12. Establish a complete file for each vehicle. Record all inspection, maintenance and repair operations performed. Records for each vehicle should be kept in its own folder and include the following identifiers for each vehicle on the file: company number, make, serial (VIN) number, year and tire size. Send a complete maintenance file for the 2002 Ford and the 2004 Ford within fifteen days to:

The mailing address is: 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604-4027. Please include the DOT# for your carrier on this correspondence.
- 17. FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012.

The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents.

Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately

identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site.

The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.


