ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission") for consideration and decision. Having reviewed the pleadings and record, the Commission makes the following findings:

I. Background

- 1. On August 20, 2019, Black Hills/Kansas Gas Utility Company, LLC, d/b/a Black Hills Energy ("Black Hills") filed an Application requesting permission for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity in Morton County, Kansas.¹
- 2. Black Hills requests that it be granted permission to operating as a natural gas public utility in the following described territory to wit:

North Half (N/2), Section 9, Township 35 South, Range 42 West

All of Sections 1-3, 10-15 and 22-24, Township 35 South Range 42 West

All in Morton County Kansas. ²

3. On November 5, 2019, the Commission Staff ("Staff") submitted its Report and Recommendation dated November 5, 2019, recommending the Commission grant Black Hills' request for permission to operate as a natural gas public utility in the territory described in paragraph 2 above.³

II. Legal Standards and Discussion

- 4. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-131, the Commission has jurisdiction to grant a Certificate to any public utility seeking to transact business in the State of Kansas. The standard for granting a certificate under K.S.A. 66-131 is that public convenience and necessity will be promoted by the granting of a certificate. K.S.A. 66-1,201 et seq., more specifically, gives the Commission full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control natural gas public utilities and is authorized to do anything necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 5. Black Hills has executed an Asset Purchase Agreement with Oneok Partners ("Oneok") to purchase three miles of pipeline used to move gas to the city gate of Elkhart, Kansas called the Elkhart Lateral.⁴ The Elkhart Lateral is not currently a regulated line and there are no customers currently being served natural gas.
- 6. The Elkhart Lateral will benefit Black Hills' Kansas customers by lowering purchase gas costs by eliminating transportation costs on Oneok by approximately \$42,000 per year and will allow for expansion of natural gas service in the newly certificated area. The nearest processed line is approximately seven miles away.⁵

7. Based on the foregoing information, and the absence of any objection, Staff recommends the Commission find that public convenience will be promoted by the granting Black Hill's Application to operate as a natural gas public utility in the portion of land described above in paragraph 2.

III. Findings and Conclusion

- 8. The Commission finds pursuant to K.S.A. 66-131, public convenience and necessity will be promoted by granting the Black Hill's Application for permission to operate as a natural gas public utility in the area described above in paragraph 2.
- 9. The Commission adopts Staff's Report and Recommendation dated November 5, 2019, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference.

THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- A. Black Hill's Application requesting permission for Certificate of Convenience and Necessity is granted pursuant to K.S.A. 66-131.
- B. Any party may file and serve a petition for reconsideration pursuant to the requirements and time limits established by K.S.A. 77-529(a)(1).⁶
- C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further order or orders, as it may deem necessary.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In Docket 20-BHCG-088-COC, Black Hills/Kansas Gas Utility Company, LLC, d/b/a Black Hills Energy (Black Hills) filed the above-captioned Application requesting to expand their certified territory in Morton County, Kansas.

Staff recommends that the Commission grant this Application.

BACKGROUND:

On August 20, 2019, Black Hills filed Docket 20-BHCG-088-COC, wishing to expand their Natural Gas Certificate in Morton County.

Black Hills has executed an Asset Purchase Agreement with the Oneok Partners (Oneok) to purchase three miles of pipeline used to move unprocessed gathering gas to the city gate of Elkhart, Kansas (Elkhart Lateral). The Elkhart Lateral is not currently a regulated line, and there are no customers currently being served natural gas on the Elkhart Lateral.

ANALYSIS:

The Elkhart Lateral will benefit Black Hills' Kansas customers by lowering gas cost by eliminating transportation cost on Oneok by approximately \$42,000 per year and by providing a high-pressure source to allow for expansion of natural gas service in the area proposed in their Application. The nearest processed line is approximately seven miles away.

Staff has reviewed Black Hills Application and has confirmed the legal description included in the Application is accurately depicted on the map attached to the Application. Staff has also confirmed that the attached legal description, marked attachment A, is not in conflict with the Commission's Certificate records.

The Commission action date is February 15, 2020.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Commission grant this Application. Upon approval, the updated territory descriptions will be reflected in the Commission's certified territory map.
