PREHEARING OFFICER ORDER CANCELLING HEARING

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. The Commission has designated Samuel Feather, Deputy General Counsel, to act as Prehearing Officer in this proceeding. Having reviewed the files and records, and being duly advised, the Prehearing Officer makes the following findings:

Background

- 1. On August 22, 2017, Operator was penalized \$1,500 for violations of K.A.R. 82-3-600, 603, 603(a), 604(b), and 604(d). Operator was directed to file an Application for Surface Pit (CDP-1) Form, a Closure of Surface Pit (CDP-4) Form, and a Waste Transfer (CDP-5) Form.
 - 2. On September 25, 2017, Operator timely requested a hearing.
- 3. On January 24, 2018, the Prehearing Officer issued an order setting a February 19, 2018 deadline for Staff's testimony; a February 26, 2018 deadline for Operator's testimony; a March 5, 2018 deadline for rebuttal testimony; and an evidentiary hearing for March 15, 2018.
- 4. On February 19, 2018, Staff filed a Motion to Cancel Procedural Schedule or Continue Procedural Deadlines (Staff's Motion). Staff indicated it had reached a settlement with

Operator which would be filed shortly.² Consequently, Staff requested the procedural deadlines

either be cancelled or adjusted.³ Furthermore, Staff indicated the Operator did not oppose its

motion.4

Findings and Conclusions

In light of the settlement agreement described in Staff's Motion, the Prehearing 5.

Officer finds the procedural schedule set in the Prehearing Officer Order Continuing Procedural

Deadlines and Evidentiary Hearing dated January 24, 2018 is no longer necessary, and should be

cancelled.

Procedural Deadlines and Evidentiary Hearing dated January 24, 2018 is cancelled.
