

**APPLICATION OF KANSAS CITY POWER & LIGHT COMPANY
FOR APPROVAL OF A VARIANCE TO ITS LOW INCOME WEATHERIZATION
TARIFF**

COMES NOW Kansas City Power & Light Company (“KCP&L”), and hereby requests from the Kansas Corporation Commission (“Commission”) approval of its Low Income Weatherization – Variance tariff (“Schedule LIWV”), and a related modification to KCP&L’s Low Income Weatherization tariff (“Schedule LIW”). In support of this Application, KCP&L states as follows:

1. KCP&L is a vertically integrated electric public utility company under the jurisdiction of the Commission that is engaged in the generation, transmission, distribution and sale of electric energy to the public within the meaning of K.S.A. 66-104, in legally designated areas of Kansas. KCP&L holds a Certificate of Convenience and Authority issued by this Commission, authorizing KCP&L to engage in such utility business.

2. As part of the Stipulation and Agreement in Docket No. 04-KCPE-1025-GIE (“1025 S&A”), KCP&L agreed to develop, evaluate and potentially implement certain demand response, efficiency and affordability programs. Those programs as contemplated at the time of the execution and approval of the 1025 S&A are set forth in Appendix B of that agreement.

3. KCP&L's initial Schedule LIW was filed on October 31, 2005, in Docket No. 06-KCPE-497-TAR, and approved by the Commission in an Order issued December 9, 2005. On September 13, 2007, KCP&L filed an application requesting Commission approval of certain revisions to its Schedule LIW. Those changes were primarily intended to align the program administration cost, grant limits, and terminology with existing U.S. Department of Energy ("DOE") guidelines applicable to the social agencies administering the LIW Program in Kansas. The Commission approved KCP&L's proposed revisions by Order dated December 5, 2007.

4. KCP&L's existing Low Income Weatherization Program as defined under Schedule LIW ("LIW Program") assists residential Customers in reducing their energy usage by funding weatherization of homes of qualified Customers. This Variance is intended to enhance the existing LIW Program by assisting the Kansas-based Social Agencies which administer the Program in carrying out low income weatherization in accordance with the Federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009. The ARRA greatly expands the federal funding available for low income weatherization and increases the maximum funding available to weatherize each home. This Variance will allow funds allocated for the LIW Program to be spent for equipment, workforce, training, administration, space needs, and outreach to eligible customers as specified in the Schedule LIWV Description section. Attached as **Exhibit A** is a copy of the proposed Variance tariff, Schedule LIWV.

5. Funds spent under this Variance will be considered funds spent for the LIW Program and will be counted against the amounts allocated for the Program under Appendix B of the 1025 S&A. The amount of the Variance offered to each participating agency will be defined in an agreement between the Company and the Social Agency. The total amount available for use under this Variance shall be based upon the unused LIW Program funds from previous years

(roll-over amounts); however, such unused roll-over amounts will also remain available to the Agencies under the existing LIW Program. In other words, the Agencies may use the unused LIW Program roll-over amounts under either the existing LIW Program or, alternatively, under this Variance so long as the total amount does not exceed the total unused LIW Program funds as provided under the 1025 S&A. This Variance will end on December 31, 2009.

6. KCP&L has updated its Table of Contents of Rates to include Schedule LIWV as Sheet Number 6.1. Since the last update to KCP&L's Table of Contents, the Commission has approved other energy efficiency programs and rates for KCP&L that are not yet reflected in the Table of Contents. As such, KCP&L's amendment to its Table of Contents in this docket also makes the following changes: adds the Building Operator Certification Program, Energy Audit & Energy Saving Measures Rider, Low Income Affordable New Homes, Cool Homes Program, ENERGY STAR[®] New Homes, and Energy Efficiency Rider; deletes Net Metering. Attached as **Exhibit B** is a redlined copy showing the changes proposed to the Table of Contents tariff sheet. **Exhibit C** is a clean copy of the tariff sheet with the proposed changes incorporated.

7. KCP&L's existing LIW Schedule is also being modified as a result of this application to add a reference to the LIWV tariff. Since the LIW Schedule needed to be modified for this purpose, KCP&L took the opportunity to make a few "clean-up" changes, as well. Attached as **Exhibit D** is a redlined copy showing changes proposed to the LIW tariff. **Exhibit E** is a clean copy of the tariff sheet with the proposed changes incorporated.

PURPOSE:

This Variance (Variance) to the Company's Low Income Weatherization Program (LIW Program) (Schedule 6) is intended to enhance weatherization of qualified Customers' homes and subsequently reduce their energy usage. This Variance will assist the Kansas-based Social Service Agencies (Agencies) to carry out the LIW in accordance with the Federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009. The ARRA enhances the Low Income Weatherization Assistance Program (LIWAP) administered by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) through the Kansas Housing Resource Council (KHRC). The ARRA greatly expands the Federal funding available to LIWAP and increases the average funding available to weatherize a home. This Variance will allow LIWAP Agencies to redirect funds allocated for 2009 as LIW Program weatherization funds as specified in **DESCRIPTION**.

The Company's participation in the LIW Program is limited to the funds set forth in Appendix B, described in the "Affordability" section referring to Low Income Weatherization in the Stipulation and Agreement approved by the Kansas Corporation Commission (Commission) in Docket No. 04-KCPE-1025-GIE. Funds spent using this Variance will be considered as funds spent for the LIW Program.

DEFINITIONS:

LIW Program – The Company's Low Income Weatherization Program described in Tariff Schedule 6.

LIWAP – Low Income Weatherization Assistance Program (LIWAP) administered by the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) through the Kansas Housing Resource Council (KHRC).

Agency – The Kansas-based Social Service Agency that provides the LIWAP in an area of the state.

AVAILABILITY:

Weatherization provided to eligible Customers will be enhanced beyond what is provided under the LIW as a result of the ARRA and this Variance.

ADMINISTRATION:

The LIW Program will continue to be administrated by the Agencies. The funding under the Variance is available to the Agencies.

TERM:

This Variance starts on the effective date of this tariff and continues through December 31, 2009.

DESCRIPTION:

Agencies that administer the LIWAP may use the Variance funds for expenditures as categorized below. Requests for payment must include notation of the appropriate category.

- b. Combustion Gas Detector
- c. Carbon Monoxide/Combustion Gas Monitor

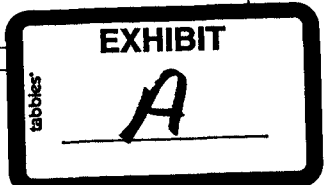

FUNDING:


The total amount of the Variance offered to a participating Agency will be defined in the agreement between the Company and the Agency. The current LIW Program will remain available to the Agencies under Schedule 6. The total of the Variance and LIW Program funds will not exceed the LIW Program-to-date allocation available through 2009.

REPORTING AND EVALUATION:

The Agencies that administer funds under the Variance, will submit a monthly report(s) to the Company and KHRC. Each report will provide an accounting of the funds received and spent monthly during the Variance Term. The report will include the following information:

- a: Funds provided by the Company and spent on each of the categories defined above;
- b: Residences weatherized for the Company's Customers;
- c: Total number of weatherization jobs completed; and
- d: Total number of weatherization jobs "in progress" at the end of the Variance Term.

At the end of the Variance Term the Company and KHRC will provide a report to the Kansas Corporation Commission Staff (Staff) that will summarize and evaluate the effect of the Variance. The reports shall be subject to audit by the Staff.

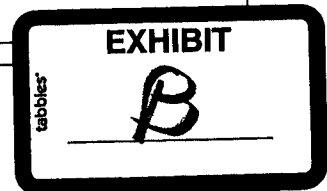

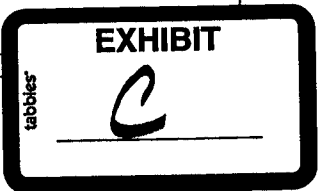

The report shall be subject to audit by Commission Staff.

PROGRAM FUNDING:

To the extent the funds set forth in Appendix B for the Low-Income Weatherization Program exceeds the total cost expended on the Program, the amount of excess shall be "rolled over" to be utilized for the weatherization Program in the succeeding year.
