SUSPENSION ORDER: JUNE 8, 2020

NOW, the above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed its files and records and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission makes the following findings:

1. On October 10, 2019, Southern Pioneer Electric Company ("Southern Pioneer") filed an Application with the Commission to initiate its next rate case by requesting the Commission approve certain changes in its electric service.¹

2. K.S.A. 66-117(c) states in part: "The commission shall not delay the effective date of the proposed change in rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule of charges, or in any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of any such public utility or common carrier, more than 240 days beyond the date the public utility or common carrier filed its application requesting the proposed change. If the commission does not suspend the proposed schedule within 30 days of the date the same is filed by the public utility or common carrier, such proposed schedule shall be deemed approved by the commission and shall take effect on the proposed effective date."

3. A full investigation of the proposed changes to Southern Pioneer's electric service, which may result in further proceedings, is deemed necessary and proper. Absent suspension of the proposed changes to electric service found in Southern Pioneer's Application, Commission Staff is without sufficient time to fully review, consider, and analyze whether the requested changes should be approved.

4. The Commission finds and concludes that suspension of any potential effectiveness of the changes to service, as outlined in the Application submitted by Southern Pioneer, is required to allow sufficient time for full investigation of this matter. The effective date of the rates and/or terms proposed shall be suspended for a period not to exceed 240 days from the date the application was made, October 10, 2019, until June 8, 2020.² A Commission decision may be issued before such date.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

A. Any decision regarding Southern Pioneer's Application shall be deferred untilJune 8, 2020. The Commission may issue a decision before such date.

B. The parties have fifteen (15) days, plus three (3) days if service of this order is by mail, from the date this order was served in which to petition the Commission for reconsideration of any issue or issues decided herein. K.S.A. 66-118b; K.S.A. 77-529(a)(1).

C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties for the purpose of issuing such further order, or orders, as it may deem necessary.

 $^{^{2}}$ ² K.A.R. 82-1-217 states that the last day of a time period shall be included in time computation, so long as the last day is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. In situations where the last day included in time computation falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the event period shall run until the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday. The 240-day count ends on Saturday, June 6. In accordance with regulations, this docket is suspended until Monday, June 8, which is the first day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.
