# APPLICATION OF KANSAS CITY POWER & LIGHT COMPANY FOR APPROVAL OF ITS 2014 ENERGY EFFICIENCY RIDER

COMES NOW Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCP&L"), and hereby requests from the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission") approval of KCP&L's 2014 Energy Efficiency Rider ("EE Rider"), to recover costs incurred January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013 ("2013 Program Costs"). In furtherance of this Application, KCP&L states as follows:

- 1. KCP&L is a vertically integrated electric public utility company under the jurisdiction of the Commission that is engaged in the generation, transmission, distribution and sale of electric energy to the public within the meaning of K.S.A. 66-104, in legally designated areas of Kansas. KCP&L holds a Certificate of Convenience and Authority issued by this Commission, authorizing KCP&L to engage in such utility business. KCP&L has previously filed with the Commission certified copies of its Articles of Incorporation under which it was organized, and its Certificate of Registration as a Foreign Corporation authorized to do business in Kansas, and all amendments thereto and restatements thereof, and the same are incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. On November 20, 2007 the Commission approved a Stipulation and Agreement in Docket No. 07-KCPE-905-RTS ("905 S&A"), that provides KCP&L the ability to recover

energy efficiency program costs through an EE Rider. The 905 S&A requires KCP&L to make its EE Rider filings by March 31 of each year.

- 3. Pursuant to Commission order, KCP&L hereby files for Commission approval its 2014 EE Rider to recover energy efficiency program costs incurred from January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013. This EE Rider will be effective from July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015. In order for the new EE Rider to be implemented by the effective date of July 1, 2014, KCP&L respectfully requests the Commission issue an order on this Application no later than June 20, 2014.
- 4. Attached to this Application as **Exhibit A** is the proposed 2014 update of the second sheet for KCP&L's EE Rider tariff. This tariff reflects the methodology adopted by KCP&L for allocating program costs among our various classes of customers. The allocation of costs proposed herein is consistent with the allocation methodology approved by the Commission in Docket No. 08-KCPE-802-TAR<sup>1</sup> and each KCP&L EE Rider tariff update thereafter.
