ORDER SETTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission finds the following:

- 1. On January 24, 2018, Urban Oil & Gas Group, LLC (Operator) applied for a location exception for its Clark #1 well in the SE/4 of Section 15, Township 26 South, Range 2 East, in Sedgwick County, Kansas.¹
- 2. On January 19, 2018, the Operator published notice of its Application in The Wichita Eagle newspaper.²
 - On February 1, 2018, Jodi Rosenberry filed a protest. 3.
- 4. On June 7, 2018, a Prehearing Conference was held and the parties agreed to the following procedural schedule:

Operator's Pre-filed Direct Testimony Due: July 16, 2018 Protestant's Pre-filed Direct Testimony Due: July 23, 2018 Due: July 30, 2018 Staff's Pre-filed Direct Testimony **Rebuttal Testimony** Due: August 6, 2018

5. Failure to submit pre-filed testimony may result in the Commission restricting the right to testify and present evidence at the evidentiary hearing. At the hearing, the Commission may limit the parties' direct and rebuttal testimony to the pre-filed testimony.

6. Any settlement agreement the parties wish to present for Commission consideration shall be due by August 6, 2018.

7. Any person requiring special accommodations under the Americans with Disabilities Act should notify the Commission at least 10 days before the scheduled hearing date.

8. Any party who fails to attend or participate in the evidentiary hearing or in any other stage of this proceeding may be held in default under the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act.³

THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

A. The procedural schedule set forth in paragraph 4 is adopted.

B. Any party may file and serve a petition for reconsideration pursuant to the requirements and time limits established by K.S.A. 77-529(a)(1).⁴

C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties for the purpose of entering such further orders as it deems necessary.
