SHUT-IN AND SHOW CAUSE ORDER, DESIGNATING A PRESIDING OFFICER AND SETTING A PREHEARING CONFERENCE

Commission records indicate the Sears #30 well has been in operation despite being listed on Quito, Inc.'s inactive and revoked license. This order finds Quito has violated K.A.R. 82-3-120 and K.A.R. 82-3-133 by conducting oil and gas operations under an inactive and revoked license, and/or that Thor Operating, LLC has violated K.A.R. 82-3-120 and K.A.R. 82-3-133 by conducting oil and gas operations on a well listed under Quito's inactive and revoked license. Accordingly, this order directs Commission Staff to seal all oil and gas wells listed under Quito's license, directs Quito and Thor to appear before the Commission to show why each should not be assessed a \$25,000 penalty, and further rules as more fully described below.

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. K.S.A. 74-623 provides the Commission exclusive jurisdiction and authority to regulate oil and gas activities in Kansas. K.S.A. 55-152 provides the Commission with jurisdiction to regulate the construction, operation, and abandonment of any well, and also the protection of the usable water of this state from any actual or potential pollution from any well. The Commission has licensing authority under K.S.A. 55-155.
- 2. K.S.A. 55-162(a) provides the Commission authority to issue penalty orders for violations of Chapter 55 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, or of any rule, regulation, or order of the

Commission. K.S.A. 55-162(e) provides that whenever an operator is in violation of subsection (a) of the statute, "agents of the commission may enter upon the lease or any other leases under the control of such operator and seal any well operated by the offending party."

- 3. Under K.SA. 55-164, a penalty order may include a monetary penalty of up to \$10,000, the penalty must constitute a substantial and actual economic deterrent to the violation, and each day of a continuing violation constitutes a separate violation.
- 4. K.A.R. 82-3-120 provides that no operator shall operate any well without a current license. K.A.R. 82-3-133 provides that production of oil or gas in violation of a Commission regulation or order shall be deemed unlawful.

II. BACKGROUND

- 5. On September 2, 2021, in Docket 22-CONS-3115-CMSC, the Commission issued an Order denying Quito's June 1, 2020, license renewal application.¹ Quito timely requested a hearing. On February 9, 2023, the Commission issued a Final Order affirming its denial of Quito's license renewal application.² On February 16, 2023, Quito filed a Petition for Stay of the Commission's Final Order, on February 24, 2023, Quito filed a Petition for Reconsideration of the Commission's Final Order, and on March 6, 2023, Quito filed a Request for Hearing.
 - 6. On February 17, 2023, Thor obtained an operator's license from the Commission.
- 7. On March 23, 2023, the Commission issued an Order Denying Quito's Petition for Reconsideration, Request for Hearing, and Petition for Stay.³
- 8. Between April 6, 2023 and May 9, 2023, Commission Staff received Request for Change of Operator (T-1) forms requesting transfer of the Appleby, Dearmond, Flossie-White,

McFarland-Delong, Morton, Sears, Wall, and Williamson leases from Quito to Thor. Staff has not approved the T-1 Forms.

- 9. On July 18, 2023, Staff inspected Quito's Sears lease and found the Sears #30, API #15-019-26185, in operation despite being listed under Quito's inactive and revoked license.⁴
- 10. On September 13, 2023, Commission Staff received a letter from Quito's counsel. Quito acknowledged T-1 forms had not been approved and stated Quito had not operated any of its wells since February 9, 2023.⁵
- 11. To date, the wells on the T-1 Forms for the Appleby, Dearmond, Flossie-White, McFarland-Delong, Morton, Sears, Wall, and Williamson leases remain on Quito's inactive and revoked license.

III. FINDINGS OF FACT & CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds that Quito has violated K.A.R. 82-3-120 by conducting oil and gas operations on an inactive and revoked license, resulting in unlawful production under K.A.R. 82-3-133, and/or that Thor has violated K.A.R. 82-3-120 by conducting oil and gas operations on wells listed under Quito's inactive and revoked license. The Commission also finds that under K.S.A. 55-162(e), Commission Staff may immediately seal any of the wells listed under Quito's license.
- 13. The Commission finds it appropriate to direct Quito and Thor to appear before the Commission, to demonstrate why each should not be assessed a \$25,000 penalty.
- 14. The Commission further finds that a Presiding Officer should be designated in this proceeding to determine procedural matters that may arise prior to a hearing on the merits,

including but not limited to conducting prehearing conferences,⁶ and that a prehearing conference should be scheduled.

15. Under K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(1), any party may either "appear before the Commission and be heard in person on that party's own behalf," or appear before the Commission through a licensed attorney. Because Quito and Thor are artificial entities, they cannot appear in person.⁷ Thus, Commission regulations require artificial entities such as Quito and Thor to appear before the Commission via counsel. Even if Commission regulations did not require counsel in this matter, the Commission finds it would be in the public interest to require counsel via order.⁸

THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- A. Quito and Thor are directed to appear before the Commission to demonstrate why each should not be assessed a \$25,000 penalty.
- B. Commission Staff is directed to shut-in and seal all oil and gas wells listed under Quito's license. The wells shall not be unsealed until they have been placed upon the license of an operator whose license is active and in good standing with the Commission.
- C. The Presiding Officer for prehearing matters in this proceeding shall be Jonathan R. Myers, Assistant General Counsel, Kansas Corporation Commission, 266 N. Main Street, Suite 220, Wichita, Kansas, 67202-1513, telephone number (316) 337-6245, email address j.myers@kcc.ks.gov. The Commission may designate other Staff members to serve in this capacity.
- D. A prehearing conference is scheduled for **Thursday**, **October 26**, **2023**, **at 1:30 p.m.** by telephone. The conference call information is: telephone number (253) 205-0468, Meeting ID 5248125436. Quito and Thor must each appear via a licensed attorney. Prior to the

prehearing conference, any such attorney must file an entry of appearance, comporting with the pleading requirements of K.A.R. 82-1-219 and identifying the filer as a licensed attorney.

E. At the prehearing conference, parties shall be prepared to discuss deadlines for filing

testimony and briefs, discovery procedures, scheduling of a hearing with the Commission, and any

other issues that will promote the orderly, prompt resolution of this proceeding. At the prehearing

conference, without further notice, this proceeding may be converted into a conference hearing or a

summary proceeding for disposition of this matter as provided by the Kansas Administrative

Procedure Act (KAPA). Any party that fails to attend or participate in the prehearing conference,

hearing, or other stage of this proceeding may be held in default under the KAPA.¹⁰

F. Although a Presiding Officer is designated, parties are still required to file pleadings

with the Commission, and filings shall be made with the Commission's Docket Room. Any filing

received after 5:00 p.m. shall be considered filed the next business day. In addition, any late filing

shall be accompanied by a Motion to File Out-of-Time. The Commission directs electronic

service of all filings in the docket to include service on the Presiding Officer and mailed

service of all filings to be directed to the Presiding Officer's attention.

Quito, Inc. acknowledges receipt of your Notice of Violation letter dated August 28, 2023. Please note that Quito, Inc. filed an Application to renew its operator's license on June 1, 2020; renewal of Quito's operator's license was the subject of Docket No: 22-CONS-3115-CMSC in which Quito sought to renew its operator's license, but in its Final Order issued February 9, 2023, the Commission affirmed its prior Order Denying Application for license previously issued on September 2, 2021.

Also, please note that Quito, Inc. has sought judicial review of the Commission's Final Order in CQ-2023-CV-000004, in the District Court of Chautauqua County, Kansas. Quito continues to seek to renew its license.

It should also be noted that Quito, Inc. has transferred many of the wells listed on Exhibit A attached to the Notice of Violation letter to Thor Operating, LLC, but those Transfers of Operator Responsibility have not yet been approved.

Additionally, K.A.R. 82-3-120(k) provides:

"The failure to obtain or renew an operator or contractor license before operating shall be punishable by a \$500 penalty."

Subsequent to February 9, 2023, Quito, Inc. has not operated any of the wells listed in Exhibit A attached to the Notice of Violation letter.
