## NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT 23-TRAM-248-PEN

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Jose Miguel T Ruiz d/b/a JMR Transport (JMR Transport) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 8 to August 11, 2022, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback & Erica Pargas. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2023 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 28, 2022. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

**IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:** JMR Transport has been assessed a \$5,250 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$5,250, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of JMR Transport to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. JMR Transport must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.<sup>1</sup>

<u>IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:</u> Failure to pay the penalty of \$5,250 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

## PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

## I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112 and 66-1,114b, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

## II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Jose Miguel T Ruiz d/b/a JMR Transport (JMR Transport or Carrier) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 2562410.
- 5. Andrea Ruiz attended the Procedures for Safety Compliance Seminar presented by the Kansas Corporation Commission, on August 15, 2022, on behalf of JMR Transport.
- 6. JMR Transport is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls grain, feed and hay.

## III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on August 8 to August 11, 2022, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback & Erica Pargas conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of JMR Transport. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
  - a. On February 19, 2022, JMR Transport required or permitted its driver, Jose Miguel T. Ruiz, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2010 Freightliner, VIN ending in 3716, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2009 Timpte semi-trailer, VIN ending in 19888, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in from Lydia, Kansas to Garden City,

Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report, Report Number: KSHP02700184, dated February 19, 2022, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, JMR Transport permitted or required its driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle that was not periodically inspected. The Special Investigators found two (2) violations of this type. The Carrier permitting its drivers to operate a commercial motor vehicle that had not been periodically (annually) inspected during the preceding 12-month period is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.17(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, JMR Transport operated a commercial motor vehicle for-hire prior to obtaining KCC operating authority. The carrier's commercial operations of commercial motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- c. On May 7, 2022, JMR Transport required or permitted its driver, Jose Miguel T. Ruiz, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2010 Freightliner, VIN ending in 3716, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2017 Timpte semi-trailer, VIN ending in 19888, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in from Marienthal, Kansas to Garden City, Kansas.

This trip is evidenced by a Driver's Daily Log, dated May 7, 2022, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, JMR Transport failed to retain inbound and outbound supporting documents for three of the four loads of grain hauled. The Special Investigators found sixty-one (61) violations of this type. The Carrier's failure to retain supporting documents for their transportations is a violation of K.A.R. 82-4-35a and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

d. During the transportation described in paragraph c., above, JMR Transport hauled a loads weighing 87,940 lbs., 90,340 lbs., 88,320 lbs. and 88,720 lbs., all of which were over the allowed gross weight of 85,500 lbs. The special investigators discovered twenty-three (23) violations of this type. The Carrier's failure to stay within the legal gross weight limit is a violation of K.S.A. 8-1901 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, as authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$3,000.

## IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Staff submitted a Report and Recommendation (R&R), dated August 19, 2022, attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. In its R&R, Staff made recommendation regarding the above-mentioned violations.
- 9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds JMR Transport committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the

Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

- 10. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$5,250 for four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 11. Staff further recommends JMR Transport submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.
- 12. Finally, Staff recommends that JMR Transport submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

## V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 13. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over JMR Transport because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.
- 14. The Commission finds JMR Transport committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

#### THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Jose Miguel T Ruiz d/b/a JMR Transport, of Garden City, KS is hereby assessed a \$5,250 civil penalty for four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor

carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

- B. Carrier is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.
- C. JMR Transport is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the Carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of JMR Transport's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.
- E. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney,

unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.<sup>2</sup> For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.<sup>3</sup>

F. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$5,250 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$5,250 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) system located at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</a>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

G. Failure to pay the \$5,250 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order may result in suspension of JMR Transport's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.<sup>4</sup> Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

Conduct periodic internal reviews of your driver qualification, hours of service control, maintenance, accident analysis/reporting, training, and other safety systems to ensure continued compliance with the FMCSR.

## 7. Duty status records must be kept on file for 6 months.

Ensure that all documents supporting records of duty status (such as toll, fuel repair and other on-the-road expense receipts, as well as invoices, bills of lading, dispatch records, etc.) are kept on file for at least 6 months.

#### 8. Retain supporting documents for 6 months.

Toll receipts and other on-the-road expense receipts, invoices, bills of lading, dispatch records, and other "supporting document" must be kept on file for six (6) months. This requirement also applies to records generated by the use of owner-operators. You may keep legible photocopies in lieu of originals.

Establish a systematic maintenance records program for all vehicles. Maintain a complete file for each subject vehicle, recording all repair, maintenance and inspection operations performed.



and/or the Revocation of Motor Carrier Authority.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Jose Miguel T Ruiz d/b/a JMR Transport (JMR Transport or Carrier) is a motor carrier possessing common operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling grain, feed and hay. JMR Transport operates under USDOT 2562410. On August 8 to August 11, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator Penny Fryback & Erica Pargas conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of JMR Transport. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, resulting in a recommended penalty of \$5,250.

## **DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:**

On August 8 to August 11, 2022, Commission Staff Special Investigator Penny Fryback & Erica Pargas conducted a safety compliance review of the operations of JMR Transport. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

Violation One (1 of 4)

On February 19, 2022, JMR Transport required or permitted its driver, Jose Miguel T. Ruiz, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2010 Freightliner, VIN ending in 3716, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2009 Timpte semi-trailer, VIN ending in 19888, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in from Lydia, Kansas to Garden City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report, Report Number: KSHP02700184, dated

February 19, 2022. At the time of this transportation, JMR Transport permitted or required its driver to operate a commercial motor vehicle that was not periodically inspected. The Special Investigators found two (2) violations of this type. The Carrier permitting its drivers to operate a commercial motor vehicle that had not been periodically (annually) inspected during the preceding 12-month period is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.17(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

## Violation Two (2 of 4)

During the transportation described in Violation One, above, JMR Transport operated a commercial motor vehicle for-hire prior to obtaining KCC operating authority. The carrier's commercial operations of commercial motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

## Violation Three (3 of 4)

On May 7, 2022, JMR Transport required or permitted its driver, Jose Miguel T. Ruiz, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2010 Freightliner, VIN ending in 3716, GVWR 52,000 lbs., pulling a 2017 Timpte semi-trailer, VIN ending in 19888, GVWR 65,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in from Marienthal, Kansas to Garden City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by a Driver's Daily Log, dated May 7, 2022. At the time of this transportation, JMR Transport failed to retain inbound and outbound supporting documents for three of the four loads of grain hauled. The Special Investigators found sixty-one (61) violations of this type. The Carrier's failure to retain supporting documents for their transportations is a violation of K.A.R. 82-4-35a and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

## Violation Four (4 of 4)

During the transportation described in Violation Three, above, JMR Transport hauled a loads weighing 87,940 lbs., 90,340 lbs., 88,320 lbs. and 88,720 lbs., all of which were over the allowed gross weight of 85,500 lbs. The special investigators discovered twenty-three (23) violations of this type. The Carrier's failure to stay within the legal gross weight limit is a violation of K.S.A. 8-1901 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, as authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$3,000.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find JMR Transport committed four (4) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$5,250 for four (4) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends JMR Transport submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that JMR Transport submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.
