This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service (Carrier) for violation of the Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered by Kansas Corporation Commission UCR Manager Verna Jackson. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the Commission-approved Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Carrier has been assessed a \$300 penalty for failure to pay Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees. If you have questions regarding UCR fees please contact the Transportation Division at 785-271-3145. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$300 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Network (KTRAN) located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a Personal Identification Number (PIN) for use with your KTRAN account, please contact the Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

Additionally, if your 2021 and 2022 UCR fees are still outstanding, those fees must be paid within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to avoid additional penalties being assessed. 2021 and 2022 UCR fees may be paid through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Carrier must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and must mail a service copy of the request to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$300 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, or failure to comply with the terms of the Order or, in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the attached Penalty Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions including suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112g and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 and adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

- 3. Pursuant to 49 U.S.C. § 14504a, the Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) Act is a federally mandated commercial motor vehicle registration program administered by individual States for motor carriers operating in interstate commerce. Kansas administers the UCR Act pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,139 which requires motor carriers to "register their motor vehicles in their base state pursuant to federal statutes." 49 U.S.C. § 14504a(i)(4) expressly authorizes States the ability to issue citations and impose reasonable fines and penalties "pursuant to the applicable laws and regulations of the State on any motor carrier, motor private carrier, freight forwarder, broker, or leasing company for failure to ...pay the fees required."
- 4. UCR fees are set annually by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). The Commission enforces this registration requirement as outlined in the Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix (Penalty Matrix), reviewed each year by July 1 and subsequently approved by the Commission. The Penalty Matrix establishes the structure of penalties for failure to pay the required UCR fees.

II. FINDINGS OF FACT

- 5. On May 11, 2022, Staff submitted a Report and Recommendation (R&R) regarding Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service's (Carrier's) failure to pay its 2021 and 2022 UCR fees. As part of the R&R, Staff recommended the Commission assess Carrier a penalty in the amount of \$300, to be paid through the Carrier's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) account, and require Carrier to pay its outstanding UCR fees for 2021 and 2022 through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov. A copy of the R&R is attached hereto as **Attachment "A"** and incorporated herein by reference.
- 6. As noted in the R&R, Carrier has operating authority under United States

 Department of Transportation (USDOT) number 1622519. According to Carrier's USDOT

profile,¹ it designates itself as an intrastate carrier. Carrier owns 1 self-propelled vehicle(s) that meet the definition of the type of vehicle for which Carrier is required to pay annual UCR fees.²

- 7. On January 5, 2021, Carrier required or permitted its driver, Robert W. Moses, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2014 Ford Truck, VIN ending in 85947, GVWR 14,000 lbs., in interstate commerce in from Spring Hill, Kansas to Kansas City, Missouri. The inspection found Carrier was operating interstate without first paying 2021 UCR fees. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KSPD83970673, dated January 5, 2021, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. Carrier failed to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce and pay the appropriate UCR fees prior to operating in interstate commerce. The Carrier's failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce and pay the appropriate UCR fees as set is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 367.60, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-30a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 66-1,129.
- 8. According to Staff's R&R, multiple attempts were made to contact Carrier regarding about paying UCR fees since it had been found to be operating ininterstate commerce. On July 1, 2021, a letter was sent to Carrier.³ On October 7, 2021, Carrier was sent another letter by Transportation Staff regarding its unpaid 2022 UCR fees.⁴ Finally, a letter marked "FINAL NOTICE" was sent on March 7, 2022 to carrier noting that Carrier's 2021 UCR fees were past due.⁵ Staff advised in the letter that nonpayment of UCR fees could result in enforcement actions.

- 9. To date, Commission records indicate that the Carrier has not paid its 2022 UCR fees.
- 10. Based on Carrier's failure to register its commercial motor vehicle(s) for registration year 2021 and 2022 and pay the appropriate UCR fees as established in 49 C.F.R. 367, there is sufficient evidence to demonstrate that the Carrier is in violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 in conjunction with K.A.R. 82-4-30a, and that a fine in the amount of \$300 is warranted. Additionally, Carrier is still obligated to pay its 2021 and 2022 UCR fees through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 11. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Carrier because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.
- 12. The Commission finds Carrier committed one violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to pay the 2021 and 2022 UCR fees outlined in 49 C.F.R. Part 367.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service of Spring Hill, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$300 civil penalty for one violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to pay the 2021 and 2022 UCR fees outlined in 49 C.F.R. Part 367.
- B. Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service shall pay its outstanding 2021 and 2022 UCR fees through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.
- C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of

service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Carrier's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.

- D. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.⁶
- E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$300 as well as payment of the 2022 UCR fees is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$300 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have a KTRAN account to pay the penalty through KTRAN. Payment of the 2022 UCR fees may be made through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.
- F. Failure to pay the \$300 civil penalty and the outstanding 2022 UCR fees within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order,⁷ may result in suspension of Carrier's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not be limited to, additional monetary sanctions, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

Motor Carrier Penalty Order for Failure to Pay 2021 and 2022 UCR Fees

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service (Carrier) is a carrier that has self-declared to be an intrastate motor carrier on its USDOT profile. However, on January 5, 2021, Carrier was found operating in interstate commerce and was cited for such by the Kansas Highway Patrol. Interstate motor carriers are required to pay annual Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees. Staff has attempted, without success, to contact Carrier regarding its 2021 UCR fees. The first attempt was on July 1, 2021, when a notice was sent through the Carrier's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN) account. The next attempt was on October 7, 2021, when Staff sent Carrier a letter regarding the 2022 UCR fees. An additional letter marked "FINAL NOTICE" and dated March 7, 2022, was sent by Staff. To date, Carrier's profile lists its UCR fees for 2021 and 2022 as unpaid. Staff recommends Carrier be assessed a penalty for failure to complete its federal registration as required by K.S.A. 66-1,139, as outlined in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix. Additionally Staff recommends the Carrier be required to pay the unpaid 2021 and 2022 UCR fees.

BACKGROUND:

Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service operates under USDOT number 1622519, domiciled in Kansas at 19595 So Lone Elm, Spring Hill, Kansas. Staff UCR Manager Verna Jackson has been tasked with ensuring Kansas motor carriers conducting interstate operations have properly paid their UCR fees for the calendar year 2021. Based on UCR Manager Jackson's review of Carrier's USDOT profile, Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service is self-declared to be conducting intrastate operations. On its most recent USDOT Profile update, submitted

October 13, 2021, the carrier lists 1 vehicle(s). However, its UCR fees for 2022 remain unpaid. A copy of the Carrier's most recent USDOT Profile update is attached hereto as Exhibit 1.

On January 5, 2021, Carrier required or permitted its driver, Robert W. Moses, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2014 Ford Truck, VIN ending in 85947, GVWR 14,000 lbs., in interstate commerce in from Spring Hill, Kansas to Kansas City, Missouri. The inspection found Carrier was operating interstate without first paying 2021 UCR fees. This trip is evidenced by a Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. KSPD83970673, dated January 5, 2021. Carrier failed to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce and pay the appropriate UCR fees prior to operating in interstate commerce. The Carrier's failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicles operating in interstate commerce and pay the appropriate UCR fees as set is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 367.60, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-30a, and authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 66-1,129.

An initial letter was sent to the Carrier on July 1, 2021, through K-TRAN informing it of its responsibility to pay UCR fees. A copy of the initial letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 2. A letter was sent by Staff to the Carrier on October 7, 2021, reminding it of its UCR obligations. A copy of that letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 3. Additionally, a letter marked "FINAL NOTICE" was sent on March 7, 2022 to carrier noting that Carrier's 2021 UCR fees were past due. Staff advised in the letter that nonpayment of UCR fees could result in enforcement actions. A copy of this letter is attached hereto as Exhibit 4.

Therefore, Staff recommends Carrier be assessed a civil penalty for failure to pay 2021 and 2022 Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as required. This is a violation of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to "register their motor vehicles in their base state pursuant to federal statutes," namely 49 USC 14504a. Additionally, Staff requests the Commission require the Carrier to pay its UCR fees for 2021 and 2022 through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

K.S.A. 66-1,139 requires "all interstate regulated public motor carriers of property, of household goods, or of passengers who operate a motor vehicle in Kansas shall register their motor vehicles in their base state pursuant to federal statutes" unless otherwise exempted. The UCR Act, pursuant to 49 USC 14504a, establishes the registration requirements for motor carriers operating in interstate commerce.

The UCR Act is a federally mandated commercial motor vehicle registration program administered by individual states for motor carriers self-designating their operations as interstate or are discovered to be operating in interstate commerce through roadside inspections or an accident. UCR funds are used by states for administration of the UCR program and enforcement of motor carrier safety programs.

UCR fees are collected from all motor carriers or other entities required to obtain an Interstate USDOT number and/or is required to register with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA). There are six fee categories and the registration fees are based on the number of commercial motor vehicles operated in interstate commerce.

Kansas based motor carriers can register UCR by logging into the NRS portal at www.ucr.gov and paying the UCR fees.

For the purposes of determining UCR fees, a Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) is defined as: a self-propelled vehicle used on the highways in commerce principally to transport passengers or cargo (as defined under 49 U.S.C. Section 31101), if the vehicle:

- (1) Has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination weight rating or gross vehicle weight or gross combination weight of at least 10,001 pounds, whichever is greater;
- (2) Is designed to transport more than 10 passengers including the driver; or
- (3) Is used in transporting material found by the Secretary of Transportation to be hazardous under 49 U.S.C. Section 5103 and transported in a quantity requiring placarding under regulations prescribed by the Secretary.

The operation of certain non-CMV vehicles still qualify it for UCR fees, but at the lowest UCR fee bracket. For example, for lightweight passenger vehicles that do not meet the above definition of CMV (I less than 10 passengers including the driver), the fleet size for the UCR purposes would be zero and the carrier would register and pay the lowest fee bracket.

In 2021, the UCR fee schedule was established in 49 C.F.R. 367.60 as follows:

The UCR Agreement applies to the following types of interstate operations of passenger and property:

- (1) Motor carrier;
- (2) Motor private carrier of property;
- (3) Freight forwarder;
- (4) Broker;
- (5) Leasing company; and
- (6) CMV registered with IRP plates cannot be excluded from the UCR vehicle count.

UCR Exempt Operations include:

- (1) Wholly intrastate CMV; and
- (2) Private Motor Carriers of Passengers.

If a carrier designates itself as an interstate carrier on its USDOT profile and fails to pay UCR fees within the calendar year that such fees apply, it is in violation of the UCR Agreement as enforced by the state of Kansas and subject to the appropriate fine based on the number of vehicles that should have been registered. Here, Carrier designated itself as an interstate carrier, with 1 vehicle(s) operating in interstate commerce.

Each year, the Commission approves a Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, which establishes the fee schedule used by Staff for penalties. With regard to violations of K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to pay the fees outlined in 49 CFR 367, the matrix establishes the following fee schedule for standard violations:

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends a penalty of \$300 be assessed against Robert W. Moses d/b/a Lakeside Tree Service in accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix. This penalty is based on the carrier's operations in interstate

commerce, as evidenced by the roadside inspection which took place on January 5, 2021. As discussed above, numerous attempts were made to contact the motor carrier and notify it of its obligation to pay the UCR fees. To date the 2021 and 2022 UCR fee remains unpaid. This is a violation K.S.A. 66-1,139 for failure to comply with the UCR Act, 49 U.S.C. 14504a, by not paying the applicable UCR fees outlines in 49 C.F.R. 367.

Additionally, Staff requests the Commission require the Carrier to pay its outstanding UCR fees for 2021 and 2022 through the UCR website at www.ucr.gov.
