APPLICATION

COMES NOW, Merit Energy Company ("Merit"), by and through its attorney, Stanford J. Smith, Jr., and in support of its Application in the above captioned matter states as follows:

1. Merit is authorized to do business in the State of Kansas, and has a street address of 13727 Noel Road, Suite 1200, Dallas, Texas, 75240.

2. The Kansas Corporation Commission has issued Merit operator's license 32446, which expires on May 30, 2020.

3. Merit is the owner and operator of the Johnson Heirs 1 well, which is located in the Southeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 30, Township 29 South, Range 38 West, Grant County, Kansas, API # 15-067-21021-00-00. The subject well is located on an active oil and gas lease or unit comprising the following lands:

East Half of Section 30, Township 29 South, Range 38 West, Grant County, Kansas.

4. The Johnson Heirs 1 was originally perforated in the St. Louis Formation but was not actively produced and was shut-in as inactive.

5. Pursuant to K.A.R. 82-3-111, Merit sought and obtained temporary abandonment status for said well on or about October 1, 2009.

6. On or about April 23, 2020, the Kansas Corporation Commission notified Merit of the KCC's denial of renewal of temporary abandonment status for the well due to the limitation period of ten (10) years imposed by K.A.R. 82-3-111.

7. K.A.R. 82-3-111 imposes a 10-year limitation on the amount of time during which wells may be temporarily abandoned, but an exception to the 10-year limitation may be obtained pursuant to said regulation through an Application filed with the Commission pursuant to K.A.R. 82-3-100. Applicant seeks such an exception.

8. Merit wishes to continue temporary abandonment status for the subject well because Merit intends to return the well to production in the future due to it being uneconomic at current oil prices. There is also the potential to make his well an injector to support the Johnson Heirs 2 well. This injector option is also uneconomic at current oil prices. It is estimated that this well has the potential to initially produce 12 BOPD and have an EUR of 91 MBO. This is based on the Johnson Heirs 1 well's historical production and the analog well the Johnson Heirs 2 completed in 2008 located in Section 30, Township 29 South, Range 39 West. No new zones are being considered.

9. On May 20, 2020, the subject well passed a Commission Staff-witnessed mechanical integrity test of the casing between the surface and a point within fifty (50) feet above the uppermost perforations.

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10. There are two wells on the lease including one temporarily abandoned well and one active oil well. It would cost an estimated Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$90,000.00) to plug this well and the remaining well on the lease. A current production rate for the lease is 25 bopd. A basic estimation of remaining reserves and an explanation of the basis is: Johnson Heirs 1 – 91000 bo (existing zone) and Johnson Heirs 2 – 210000 bo (existing zone). In order to reactivate the Johnson Heirs 1 well, it would cost approximately Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) based on current prices. It would cost an estimate of Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$750,000.00) based on current prices to drill and complete a replacement well in the St. Louis Formation.

11. Merit has included a plat map, attached as Exhibit A, showing the locations of all producing, injection, temporarily abandoned, abandoned and plugged wells located on the same lease premises as the subject well.

12. Based on the foregoing, Merit requests the Commission grant an exception to the 10-year limitation, specifically to allow the Johnson Heirs 1 well to remain eligible for temporary abandonment status for three (3) years following the expiration of 10-year limitation. Merit understands that the exception would be valid for three (3) years, but Merit would still need to apply annually to the Conservation Division District Office for approval of an Application for temporary abandonment status.

13. Listed in attached Exhibit B are the names and addresses of the following persons:

A. Each operator of each oil and gas lease covering lands within onehalf (1/2) mile radius of the subject well; and

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B. Each person who owns any mineral interest of record in and under any lands located within one-half (1/2) mile radius of the subject well if unleased.

14. That the Applicant has sent by regular mail a copy of this Application and Notice of Pending Application to all persons listed on the attached Exhibit B.

15. Notice of this Application will be published pursuant to K.A.R. 82-3-135a.

16. WHEREFORE, Merit prays that this matter be granted administratively without a hearing, or in the alternative be set for hearing, and upon hearing that the Commission grant Merit's request for an exception to the K.A.R. 82-3-111 10-year limitation, to allow the subject well to remain temporarily abandoned for three (3) years, subject to annual approval by the Conservation Division District Office of an application for temporary abandonment status.

of Injection


