#### NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC (Strong Masonry Constructors) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on July 11, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Michael Heenan. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2019 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on August 7, 2018. For a full description of the penalty and terms and obligations, please refer to the Penalty Order attached to this notice.

#### IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

Strong Masonry Constructors has been assessed a \$1,000 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine, unless you choose the reduced penalty option explained below. Please remit payment of \$1,000 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</a>. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

# STRONG MASONRY CONSTRUCTORS IS A NEW ENTRANT MOTOR CARRIER AND MAY BE ELIGIBLE FOR A PENALTY REDUCTION OF FIFTY PERCENT (50%) UNDER THE FOLLOWING TERMS:

New Entrant motor carriers are eligible for a one-time, fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed motor carriers. You have to agree to meet the terms and obligations set out in the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to be eligible for the reduction. A fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed may be available if:

- (1) within fifteen (15) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier signs and submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel at the above address;
- (2) within thirty (30) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier submits to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) described in the attached Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future;
- (3) within thirty (30) days from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier sends an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance must be submitted to the undersigned Litigation Counsel shortly thereafter; and
- (4) within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Penalty Order, the carrier must submit to a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

If a carrier is approved for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced penalty, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment assessing the reduced penalty and setting out the terms and conditions stated above may be issued by the Commission. Payment of the reduced penalty of \$500 would be due within 30 days from the date of service of the Order Amending Penalty Assessment.

#### IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER:

You have the right to request a hearing if you contest the terms of the Penalty Order. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC must file within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to Litigation Counsel at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-542.

#### IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to adhere to the terms and obligations set out in the attached Penalty Order, including payment of the penalty of \$1,000 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within 15 days from the date of service of the Penalty Order, will result in the Order becoming final and the terms and conditions set out therein will be enforced. If Strong Masonry Constructors submits the attached Reduced Penalty Agreement as explained above, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment may be issued assessing the reduced penalty of \$500 and that payment would become due within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Order Amending Penalty Assessment.

#### REDUCED PENALTY AGREEMENT

#### 19-TRAM-104-PEN

Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC (Strong Masonry Constructors) hereby submits this Reduced Penalty Agreement for approval of a fifty percent (50%) reduction in the penalty assessed in the Penalty Order dated September 25, 2018. Strong Masonry Constructors has agreed to comply with the following terms and obligations:

- 1. Strong Masonry Constructors has submitted, within fifteen (15) days from the date of the Penalty Order this signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement to Litigation Counsel.
- 2. Strong Masonry Constructors will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, submit to Transportation Staff a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) documenting the violation(s) and describing specific and detailed information explaining its efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. I understand the CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to become eligible for the 50% reduced penalty.
- 3. Strong Masonry Constructors will, within thirty (30) days from the date of the Penalty Order, send an individual responsible for safety compliance to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar, and proof of attendance will be submitted to the Litigation Counsel.
- 4. Strong Masonry Constructors will be available within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order for a follow-up Safety Compliance Review. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to schedule the review.

Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC understands that if approved, an Order Amending Penalty Assessment will be issued by the Commission assessing a reduced penalty of \$500, and will set out the terms and conditions stated above. Once the Order Amending Penalty Assessment is issued by the Commission, Strong Masonry Constructors will have thirty (30) days from the date of service of that Order to pay the reduced penalty assessed.

#### PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

#### I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

#### II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC (Strong Masonry Constructors) has private and common operating authority with the Commission and further operates under USDOT number 2489301.
- 5. Daryl Strong attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on September 7, 2016, on behalf of Strong Masonry Constructors.
- 6. Strong Masonry Constructors is a private and common motor carrier which primarily hauls motor vehicles, logs, poles, beams, lumber, mason, and concrete tools.
- 7. Strong Masonry Constructors is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction of the penalty(s) assessed below.

#### III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 8. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on July 11, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Michael Heenan conducted a compliance review of the operations of Strong Masonry Constructors. A copy of the safety compliance review is attached hereto as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
  - a. On February 27, 2018, Strong Masonry Constructors required or permitted its driver, Daryl Z. Strong, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor

vehicle, a 2005 Kenworth truck tractor, VIN ending in 092213, GVWR 46,000 lbs., pulling a 1991 Reitnouer trailer, VIN ending in 000634, GVWR 80,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Kansas City, Missouri to Dewey, Oklahoma. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report Number KSHP03530397, dated February 27, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Daryl Z. Strong recorded he was in Neosha, Missouri at the time of the KHP inspection, thereby making a false record of duty status. *See*, Driver's Daily Log, dated February 27, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. Strong Masonry Constructors' falsifying records of duty status is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.

#### IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Strong Masonry Constructors committed one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 10. Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,000 for one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

- 11. Staff provides notice to the Commission that Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduced civil penalty. The carrier must submit to Litigation Counsel within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Penalty Order the signed and dated Reduced Penalty Agreement and Transportation Staff must approve the carrier's Corrective Action Plan (CAP).
- 12. Staff recommends Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future. The CAP must be approved by Transportation Staff to qualify for the fifty-percent (50%) discount.
- 13. Staff further recommends that a representative from Strong Masonry Constructors attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel.
- 14. Finally, Staff recommends that Strong Masonry Constructors submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

#### V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 15. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Strong Masonry Constructors because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 16. The Commission finds a penalty of \$1,000 should be assessed to Strong Masonry Constructors for committing one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers,

including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

17. The Commission finds Strong Masonry Constructors is a New Entrant motor carrier and may be eligible for a fifty-percent (50%) reduction in the penalty(s) assessed herein.

#### THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Strong Masonry Constructors, LLC, of Frontenac, KS is hereby assessed a penalty of \$1,000 for one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations. Payment of \$1,000 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</a>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.
- B. A representative from Strong Masonry Constructors is ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety meeting within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide proof of attendance to Litigation Counsel. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- C. Strong Masonry Constructors must submit a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) within thirty (30) days of the date of this Penalty Order, to Transportation Staff, documenting the violation(s) described above, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

- D. Strong Masonry Constructors is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.
- E. If Strong Masonry Constructors does not submit the Reduced Penalty Agreement and fails to pay the penalty of \$1,000 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or fails to comply with the provisions of this Order, the Commission will have the right to order further sanctions, including suspension of Strong Masonry Constructors's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may issue and enforce revocation of motor carrier authority and/or issue cease and desist order(s), and may order other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.
- F. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and a copy mailed to the Litigation Counsel. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Strong Masonry Constructors's right to a hearing.
- G. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For

civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.



The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry blases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012.

The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents.

Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site.






