### **SUSPENSION ORDER: DECEMBER 23, 2020**

NOW, the above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed its files and records and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission makes the following findings:

- 1. On April 27, 2020, Prairie Land Electric Cooperative, Inc. (Prairie Land) filed an Application with the Commission, requesting approval to update its Local Access Delivery Service (LADS) tariff.<sup>1</sup>
  - 2. K.S.A. 66-117(c) states in part:

"The commission shall not delay the effective date of the proposed change in rate, joint rate, toll, charge or classification or schedule of charges, or in any rule or regulation or practice pertaining to the service or rates of any such public utility or common carrier, more than 240 days beyond the date the public utility or common carrier filed its application requesting the proposed change. If the commission does not suspend the proposed schedule within 30 days of the date the same is filed by the public utility or common carrier, such proposed schedule shall be deemed approved by the commission and shall take effect on the proposed effective date."

3. A full investigation of the proposed changes to Prairie Land's LADS tariff, which may result in further proceedings, is deemed necessary and proper. Absent suspension of the

proposed changes to its LADS tariff found in Prairie Land's Application, Commission Staff is without sufficient time to fully review, consider, and analyze whether the requested changes should be approved.

4. The Commission finds and concludes that suspension of any potential effectiveness of the changes to service, as outlined in the Application submitted by Prairie Land, is required to allow sufficient time for full investigation of this matter. The effective date of the rates and/or terms proposed shall be suspended for a period not to exceed 240 days from the date the application was made, April 27, 2020, until December 23, 2020.<sup>2</sup> A Commission decision may be issued before such date.

## IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. Any decision regarding Prairie Land's Application shall be deferred until December 23, 2020. The Commission may issue a decision before such date.
- B. The parties have fifteen (15) days, plus three (3) days if service of this order is by mail, from the date this order was served in which to petition the Commission for reconsideration of any issue or issues decided herein. K.S.A. 66-118b; K.S.A. 77-529(a)(1).
- C. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and parties for the purpose of issuing such further order, or orders, as it may deem necessary.
