ORDER ADOPTING PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed the pleadings and record, the Commission makes the following findings:

1. On July 24, 2018 the Commission issued its Order Opening General Investigation to fully investigate the parameters and intricacies of a customer opt-out program for advanced metering infrastructure digital electric meters.¹

2. As directed by the Commission's July 24, 2018 Order, The Empire District Electric Company, a Liberty Utilities Company (Empire), Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCP&L), Westar Energy, Inc. and Kansas Gas and Electric Company (referred to together herein as "Westar") and Southern Pioneer Electric Company (Southern Pioneer) entered their respective appearances in this proceeding. Kansas Electric Cooperatives, Inc. (KEC)² and the Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB)³ petitioned for and were granted intervention in this proceeding.

3. On October 4, 2018, Empire, KCP&L, Westar, KEC, Southern Pioneer, CURB, and the Staff of the Commission, collectively referred to as "Joint Movants," filed a Joint Motion for Procedural Schedule for the Commission's review.

4. After reviewing the Joint Motion, the Commission adopts the following procedural schedule:
