## ORDER GRANTING MCI COMMUNICATIONS SERVICE AND MCIMETRO ACCESS TRANSMISSION SERVICES' PETITION TO INTERVENE

The above-captioned matters come before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission makes the following findings:

- 1. On May 19, 2008, Sprint Communications Company L.P., Sprint Spectrum L.P., and Nextel West Corporation (Sprint) filed a petition with the Commission requesting a general investigation into the intrastate access charges of United Telephone Company of Kansas, United Telephone Company of Eastern Kansas, United Telephone Company of South Central Kansas, and United Telephone Company of Southeastern Kansas (Embarq). Sprint is also requesting the Commission reduce Embarq's interstate carrier access rates to be in parity with its interstate access charges.
- 2. On September 23, 2008, MCI Communications Services, Inc. d/b/a Verizon Business Services and MCImetro Access Transmission Services LLC d/b/a Verizon Access

Transmission Services (Verizon Business) filed a Petition To Intervene in this proceeding.

Verizon Business pays intrastate switched access rates to Embarq and is a 3.

contributor to KUSF. Verizon Business stated that their legal rights, duties, privileges, and other

legal interests will be substantially affected by the proceedings in this docket and that no other

party to the proceeding can adequately protect Verizon Business' rights.

The Commission finds and concludes that granting intervention to Verizon 4.

Business is in the interests of justice and will not impair the orderly and prompt conduct of the

proceedings. K.A.R. 82-1-225.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

The Petition to Intervene of the MCI Communications Services, Inc. d/b/a A.

Verizon Business Services and MCImetro Access Transmission Services LLC d/b/a Verizon

Access Transmission Services is granted.

B. A party may file a petition for reconsideration of this order within fifteen days of

the service of this order. If this order is mailed, service is complete upon mailing, and three days

may be added to the above time frame. K.S.A. 66-118b; K.S.A. 2007 Supp. 77-529.

C. The Commission retains jurisdiction of the subject matter and the parties for the

purpose of entering such further order, or orders, as it may deem necessary and proper.
