## ORDER GRANTING EMPIRE'S MOTION

The Commission rules as follows:

- 1. On May 4, 2020, the Empire District Electric Company (Empire) filed an application requesting waivers of certain Commission orders, rules and regulations, billing standards, and Empire's general terms and conditions for service on a temporary basis due to the COVID-19 pandemic.<sup>1</sup>
- 2. On October 6, 2020, the Commission granted Empire's application with modifications. The Commission stayed enforcement of any action against Empire for deviations from regulatory requirements that Empire does in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Commission approved Empire's proposed waiver of reconnect and trip fees and Empire's

temporary tariff to reimburse customers for fees associated with the use of debit or credit cards to pay for electric service. The granted requests remained in effect until December 31, 2020.<sup>2</sup>

- 3. On December 2, 2020, Empire filed a motion requesting an extension of the stay of enforcement of action against Empire through June 30, 2021.<sup>3</sup>
- 4. On February 16, 2021, the Commission issued an order on a unanimous settlement agreement in Docket No. 20-EPDE-459-TAR. Among other things, the Commission ordered Empire to continue to waive the credit or debit card transaction fees.<sup>4</sup>
- 5. On June 18, 2021, Empire filed a second motion requesting an extension of the stay of enforcement of action against Empire through September 30, 2021. Empire states the stay, "will allow [Empire] to continue to waive certain fees (late payment fees, disconnections, reconnection fees, credit card payment fees) for its customers." Empire also seeks clarification that the Accounting Authority Order (AAO) issued in Docket No. 20-EPDE-427-ACT "will extend at least through September 30, 2021." Empire discussed the request with Staff and CURB; neither party objects.
- 6. The Commission is given full power, authority, and jurisdiction to supervise and control the electric public utilities doing business in Kansas and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority, and jurisdiction.<sup>8</sup> All grants of power, authority and jurisdiction made to the Commission shall be liberally construed.<sup>9</sup>

7. Empire's motion requesting the Commission extend the stay of enforcement of action against Empire through September 30, 2021, is granted. Empire's waiver of reconnect and trip fees as discussed in the October 6, 2020 order is extended through September 30, 2021. Empire shall continue to waive late payment fees, disconnections, reconnection fees, and credit card and debit card transaction fees through September 30, 2021.

8. Empire may track and defer in a regulatory asset extraordinary costs associated with the COVID-19 pandemic as stated in this docket and the AAO through September 30, 2021.<sup>10</sup> Nothing in this order shall be construed as a decision on an end-date of the COVID-19 pandemic. Further, the Commission is not reaching a decision on the potential recovery of any amounts Empire is tracking per the AAO.

9. Because the Commission grants Empire's motion requesting the Commission extend the stay until September 30, 2021, Empire's previous motion to extend the stay until June 30, 2021, is moot.

## THEREFORE, THE COMMISSION ORDERS:

- A. Empire's motion is granted.
- B. Empire's motion filed December 2, 2020, is moot.
