This is a notice of a penalty assessment against August Dawson, d/b/a Dawson's Moving (Dawson's Moving) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on May 1, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Jared Smith. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Dawson's Moving has been assessed a \$3,600 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$3,600, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Dawson's Moving to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Dawson's Moving must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$3,600 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. August Dawson, d/b/a Dawson's Moving (Dawson's Moving) operates under USDOT number 3128166.
- 5. Dawson's Moving is mainly intrastate/interstate carrier and leases straight trucks as needed from Penske Corporation.
 - 6. Dawson's Moving is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls household goods.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on May 1, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Jared Smith conducted a compliance review of the operations of Dawson's Moving. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified eight (8) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On February 15, 2018, Dawson's Moving required or permitted its driver, Ramon Worlds, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2017 International, VIN ending in 459422, GVWR 19,501 to 26,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Topeka, Kansas to Castle Rock, Colorado. This trip is evidenced by Penske Rental Agreement, dated February 15, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby

incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Dawson's Moving failed to pay its Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fee for 2018. The carriers failure to register its commercial motor vehicle(s) operating in interstate commerce and to pay the appropriate UCR fee as set out in 49 C.F.R. 367.30, is a violation of K.A.R. 82-4-30a, authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$300.

- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Dawson's Moving was found to be operating a commercial motor vehicle without having in effect the required minimum levels of financial responsibility coverage on the vehicle. The carrier's failure to obtain and have in effect the minimum levels of financial responsibility, including policies of insurance, is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 387.7(a) and (b)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- c. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Dawson's Moving used a driver that was not medically examined and certified determining him as physically fit to operate a commercial motor vehicle. The carrier's failure to confirm that its driver is medically examined and certified prior to requiring or permitting the operation of a commercial motor vehicle and maintaining documentation of the medical certificate in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.41(a)(1)(i),

- adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.
- d. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Dawson's Moving did not have a driver qualification file containing the required documents on its driver. The carrier's failure to maintain a driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.51(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.
- e. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Dawson's Moving was operating in commerce without having the proper federal operating authority under 49 U.S.C. § 14901(d)(3). The carrier's operation of a commercial motor vehicle without having the proper federal operating authority is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 392.9a(a)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$1,000.
- f. On May 26, 2017, Dawson's Moving required or permitted its driver, Ramon Worlds, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2017 International, VIN ending in 459025, GVWR 19,501 to 26,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around the area of Topeka, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Penske Rental Agreement, dated May 25-26, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Dawson's Moving failed to require its driver to make a record of duty status, indicating the date, start

time, end time, and total number hours worked. The special investigator found 31 violations of this type. The carrier's failure to require its drivers to keep records of duty status for each 24-hour period, or in the alternative to maintain and retain time records described in 49 C.F.R. 395.1(e) under the short haul exemption, using the method described in 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), and to submit the original record to the motor carrier within 13 days of creation is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

- g. During the transportation described in paragraph f., above, Dawson's Moving operated a commercial motor vehicle in Kansas without having Kansas Corporation Commission public carrier (KAN-C) operating authority. The carrier's commercial operations of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.
- h. On February 2, 2018, Dawson's Moving required or permitted its driver, Ramon Worlds, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2017 International, VIN ending in 459538, GVWR 19,501 to 26,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around the area of Topeka, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Penske Rental Agreement, dated February 1, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated

by reference. At the time of this transportation, Dawson's Moving had not be retaining copies of records or documents relating to operating as a commercial motor carrier. The special investigator discovered 10 violatins of this type. The carrier's failure to retain documentation and records of its commercial motor vehicle operations is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 390.31, adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a violation of \$200.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Dawson's Moving committed eight (8) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$3,600 for eight (8) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Dawson's Moving be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that Dawson's Moving submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Dawson's Moving because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Dawson's Moving committed eight (8) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. August Dawson, d/b/a Dawson's Moving, of Topeka, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$3,600 civil penalty for eight (8) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Dawson's Moving is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.
- C. Dawson's Moving is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. On June 7, 2018, this Penalty Order was mailed to Dawson's Moving via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105745971. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds

upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Dawson's Moving's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$3,600 civil penalty against Dawson's Moving, and ordering a representative from Dawson's Moving to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.

- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$3,600 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$3,600 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$3,600 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Dawson's Moving's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.



This rating will become the final rating 60 days from the date indicated on a forthcoming official notice from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration headquarters in Washington, D.C.

However, if this rating improves a previous Unsatisfactory rating, it will become effective on the date of the official notice from the FMCSA headquarters.

Corrective actions must be taken for the violations (deficiencies) listed on Part B of this review. Title 49 CFR Sections 385.15 and 385.17 provide for administrative review and a change to a safety rating based on corrective actions, respectively. A request for a change to a safety rating under section 385.17 may be made at any time. A motor carrier may request, in writing, a change in the rating by providing evidence of corrective actions to the Field Administrator for the FMCSA Service Center in which the carrier maintains its principal place of business. (See 49 CFR 385.17 for additional details). A request for administrative review under section 385.15 must be made within 90 days of the date of the proposed safety rating issued under section 385.11(c) or a final safety rating issued under section 385.11(b), or within 90 days after denial of a request for a change in rating under section 385.17.

If this was a focused investigation, which will be noted in the Review Type on the first page of this report (Part A), some factors shown above may be marked "SATISFACTORY" even if they were not reviewed. A focused investigation will not result in a SATISFACTORY safety rating because all standards and factors specified in 40 CFR 383 5 and 385.7 were not examined in full, even though it may appear that they were under the rating factors in Part B of this document. It may, however, result in a less than SATISFACTORY rating if sufficient violations are discovered in the parts and factors examined to result in a CONDITIONAL or UNSATISFACTORY rating, or a non-ratable review.

If you receive a conditional or unsatisfactory rating, you may request an administrative review under 49 CFR 385.15 or a safety rating upgrade based on corrective action under 49 CFR 385.17. 




