This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Steve Brumback, d/b/a Brumback Towing (Brumback Towing) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on April 18, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Michael Heenan. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

**IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:** Brumback Towing has been assessed a \$300 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$300, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

The Order requires Brumback Towing to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the attached Order. Transportation Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Brumback Towing must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and must mail a copy of the request to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-542.

**IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:** Failure to pay the penalty of \$300 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the attached Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

#### PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

#### I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

#### II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Steve Brumback, d/b/a Brumback Towing (Brumback Towing) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates USDOT number 706840.
- 5. Steve Brumback attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on June 1, 2015, on behalf of Brumback Towing.
- 6. Brumback Towing is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, motor vehicles, and construction.
- 7. Brumback Towing transports in commerce between states (interstate commerce), and is thereby subject to the Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees assessed pursuant to 49 C.F.R. 367.30, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-30a.

#### III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

8. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on April 18, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Michael Heenan conducted a compliance review of the operations of Brumback Towing. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

a. On April 18, 2018, Brumback Towing was reviewed for their lack of paying its Uniform Carrier Registration (UCR) fees for the years of 2017 and 2018. Brumback Towing paid the 2017 UCR fees on February 23, 2018, nearly three (3) months late. The carrier paid the 2018 UCR fees on April 9, 2018, which was five (5) days after the enforcement date of April 5, 2018. Brumback Towing has operated as a wrecker with an interstate USDOT Number of 706840. At the time of this safety compliance review, the carrier had paid his delinquent UCR fees, but only after it was informed of the review. Brumback Towing's failure to annually register its commercial motor vehicle(s) operating in interstate commerce over the highways of this state and to pay the appropriate Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) fees as set out in 49 C.F.R. 367.30, is a violation of K.A.R. 82-4-30a, authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,139a and K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$300.

#### IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 9. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Brumback Towing committed one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 10. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$300 for one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Brumback Towing submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

#### V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Brumback Towing because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Brumback Towing committed one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

#### THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Steve Brumback, d/b/a Brumback Towing, of Fort Scott, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$300 civil penalty for one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Brumback Towing is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- C. On May 8, 2018, this Penalty Order was mailed to Brumback Towing via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105743465. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.
- D. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds

upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Brumback Towing's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$300 civil penalty against Brumback Towing, and ordering it to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.

- E. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- F. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$300 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$300 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at <a href="https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/">https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</a>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

G. Failure to pay the \$300 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Brumback Towing's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.


