This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Nicholas Matthew Smith, d/b/a Alltrade (Alltrade) for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on April 6, 2018, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Penny Fryback. Penalties are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: Alltrade has been assessed a \$2,450 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$2,450, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order requires a representative of Alltrade to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website <u>http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm</u>. The Order also requires your company to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the Order. Transportation Staff will contact your company at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Alltrade must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$2,450 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.

2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

4. Nicholas Matthew Smith, d/b/a Alltrade (Alltrade) has common operating authority with the Commission and further operates USDOT number 2465753.

5. Nicholas Smith attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Safety Instructional Meeting on August 31, 2015, on behalf of Alltrade.

6. Alltrade is a common motor carrier which primarily hauls general freight, metal, sheets, coils, rolls, building materials, and appliances.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on April 6, 2018, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Penny Fryback conducted a compliance review of the operations of Alltrade. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator identified five (5) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.

a. On February 8, 2018, Alltrade required or permitted its driver, Nicholas Matthew Smith, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1999 Ford F-250, VIN ending in 99338, GVWR 8,800 lbs., pulling a tandem axle car trailer with no title and no registration, in intrastate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Oakley, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's

Daily Log, dated February 8, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Alltrade failed to have the flatbed car trailer registered and did not have commercial registration on the Ford F-250 pickup. *See*, photographs attached hereto as Attachment "C" and are hereby incorporated by reference. Alltrade's operation of a commercial motor vehicle without having a USDOT Registration is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 392.9b(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

b. On February 22, 2018, Alltrade required or permitted its driver, Nicholas Matthew Smith, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2003 Freightliner, VIN ending in 12925, GVWR 33,000 lbs., pulling a 1999 45-foot Utility semi-trailer, VIN ending in 703410, in interstate commerce from Burlington, Colorado to Garden City, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated February 22, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Alltrade allowed or required its driver to drive after the 14th hour after coming on duty following the driver's last off duty period of at least 10 hours. *See*, Attachment "D". The carrier's failure to require its driver to cease driving at the 14th hour after coming on duty following ten (10) consecutive hours off duty is in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(2), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$250.

- c. On February 12, 2018, Alltrade required or permitted its driver, Nicholas Matthew Smith, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2003 Freightliner, VIN ending in 12925, GVWR 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2007 Chaparral forklift semi-trailer, VIN ending in 949135, GVWR 60,000 lbs., in interstate commerce from Garden City, Kansas to Pueblo, Colorado. This trip is evidenced by Driver's Daily Log, dated February 12, 2018, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "E" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, driver Nicholas Matthew Smith failed to take a 30 minute rest period after driving for eight (8) hours. This carrier was cited for the same violation in a safety compliance review conducted on January 10, 2018. Alltrade's failure to provide "rest breaks" to its drivers if more than eight (8) hours have passed since the end of the driver's last off-duty or sleeper-berth period of at least 30 minutes is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.3(a)(3)(ii), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and implemented by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$500.
- d. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Alltrade failed to retain and produce records of maintenance and inspection for the flatbed tandem axle car trailer. The carrier was cited for this same violation in a safety compliance review conducted on January 10, 2018. Alltrade's failure to maintain the required records of vehicle inspection, maintenance, and repair on the commercial motor vehicles owned for 30 days is in violation

of 49 C.F.R. 396.3(b), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$700.

e. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Alltrade could not produce a current annual inspection report for the flatbed tandem car axle car trailer. The carrier was cited for the same violation in a safety compliance review conducted on January 10, 2018. Alltrade's failure to conduct periodic (annual) inspections on commercial motor vehicles is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 396.17(c), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3j, and authorized by K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$500.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds Alltrade committed five (5) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$2,450 for five (5) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

10. Staff further recommends that a representative from Alltrade be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars be found the Commission's website can on at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Alltrade submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Alltrade because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,108.

13. The Commission finds Alltrade committed five (5) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

A. Nicholas Matthew Smith, d/b/a Alltrade, of Garden City, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$2,450 civil penalty for five (5) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.

B. Alltrade is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.

C. Alltrade is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.

D. On May 1, 2018, this Penalty Order was mailed to Alltrade via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Receipt Number 70161970000105743519. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt.

E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Secretary to the Commission, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Alltrade's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$2,450 civil penalty against Alltrade, and ordering a representative from Alltrade to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of this Order.

F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties less

than \$500, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2017 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$2,450 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$2,450 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN system located at <u>https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/</u>. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.

H. Failure to pay the \$2,450 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of Alltrade's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

I. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

• NOTICE: A pattern and/or repeated violations of the same or related acute or critical regulations (violations of the same Part in Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations) will cause the maximum penalties allowed by law to be assessed under Section 222 of the Motor Carrier Safety Improvement Act of 1999 (MCSIA). A pattern of violations means two or more violations of acute and/or critical regulations in three or more Parts of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered during any eligible investigation. Repeated violations means violation(s) of an acute regulation of the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after one or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation(s) of a critical regulation in the same Part of Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations discovered in an investigation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period and/or violation after two or more closed enforcement actions within a six year period.

• NOTICE: 49 CFR Part 391.23 requires prospective employers to, at a minimum, investigate a driver's employment information, crash record, and alcohol and controlled substances history from all employers the driver worked for within the previous 3 years.

The Pre-Employment Screening Program (PSP) is a screening tool that assists motor carriers in investigating crash history and roadside safety performance of prospective drivers. The PSP allows motor carriers to purchase 5 years of crash data and 3 years of roadside inspection data from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Motor Carrier Management Information System (MCMIS). Records are available 24 hours a day via Web request. Motor carriers should visit the following website for more information: http://www.psp.fmcsa.dot.gov/Pages/default.aspx

• All motor carriers and truck drivers are needed to fight against terrorism and hijacking. You could be a target. Protect yourself, your trucks, your cargo, and your facilities. FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry blases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.
