**ORDER DENYING MOTION RECOMMENDING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE,
HOLDING MOTIONS TO DISMISS IN ABEYANCE, AND
DIRECTING THE SCHEDULING OF A STATUS CONFERENCE**

The Commission rules as follows:

1. On January 21, 2025, Commission Staff motioned for the designation of a presiding officer and the setting of a prehearing conference in this matter. Staff stated that in November 2024, it received Request for Change of Operator (T-1) Forms for approximately 55 leases, which would transfer the leases from Daylight Petroleum, LLC, to Bluejacket Operating, LLC. Staff, however, did not believe at the time that the forms should be processed.
2. Both Daylight and Bluejacket entered appearances. On March 21, 2025, Staff filed a motion recommending a procedural schedule; the recommended dates have passed. Later that week, Daylight and Bluejacket both filed motions to dismiss these proceedings.
3. On June 20, 2025, Staff submitted a filing styled as a withdrawal of its January 21, 2025, motion, stating that it would process forms submitted by Daylight and Bluejacket once resubmitted, but that Staff might not transfer injection authority for various wells.
4. On September 12, 2025, Staff submitted a report indicating that all T-1 forms at issue had been processed, thus transferring the wells to Bluejacket's license, but identified 12 wells for which Staff had not approved transfer of injection authority.

5. Based upon the above, the Commission denies Staff's March 21, 2025, motion recommending a procedural schedule as moot, holds Daylight's and Bluejacket's motions to dismiss in abeyance, and finds it appropriate for status conference to be scheduled, wherein the parties can discuss: (1) whether Daylight still maintains standing in this docket; (2) clarification of the remaining issues; (3) the development of a procedural schedule; and (4) all other matters that would assist in bringing this matter to resolution. Presiding Officer Myers is directed to work with the parties to schedule the status conference.
