NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT 25-TRAM-373-PEN

This is a notice of a penalty assessment against Midwest Wireline LLC ("Midwest Wireline") for violations of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted from February 26, 2025, to April 8, 2025, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigators. The Special Investigators identified six (6) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety regulations. Penalties for the violations are assessed in accordance with the FY 2025 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2024. Midwest Wireline has been assessed a \$2,500.00 penalty. For a full description of the penalties and terms and obligations please refer to the Order attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order to pay the penalty. Please remit payment of \$2,500.00 through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network ("KTRAN") system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

The attached Order also requires a representative of Midwest Wireline:

- a. To attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of the Order and to provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for safety seminars can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- b. To submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.
- c. To submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for a hearing must be made in writing, and within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. You may request a hearing through the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and you must also mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an

original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel.¹

<u>IF YOU FAIL TO ACT</u>: Failure to pay the penalty of \$2,500.00 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a timely written request for a hearing, will result in the Order becoming final and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas ("Commission"). Having examined its files and records, and being duly advised in the premises, the Commission finds and concludes as follows:

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112g and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority, and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority, and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 66-129a, 66-1,130, and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision, or regulation of the Commission.

- 3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and issue an order on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.
- 4. Midwest Wireline LLC ("Midwest Wireline" or "Carrier") is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. 390.5 and operates under USDOT number 3454360.
- 5. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Midwest Wireline pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,108b because it is a motor carrier as defined in 49 C.F.R. Part 390.5 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3f.
- 6. Between February 26, 2025, and April 8, 2025, Commission Transportation Staff ("Transportation Staff" or "Staff") Special Investigators ("SIs") completed a safety compliance investigation of Midwest Wireline. As a result of the compliance investigation, the SIs identified six (6) violations, set forth in two (2) counts of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations ("MCSRs"), which carry a penalty set forth in the FY2025 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix. ¹
- 7. On April 14, 2025, Transportation Staff submitted its Report and Recommendation ("R&R"), attached hereto as "Attachment A" and hereby incorporated by reference herein, recommending a penalty of \$2,500.00 to be issued to Midwest Wireline based on the frequency, timeline, and severity of the violations discovered.
- 8. Specifically, pursuant to Staff's R&R, the Commission finds that Midwest Wireline committed six (6) violations of the following two (2) counts, discussed more fully in Staff's R&R:²
 - a. Count 1: On December 23, 2024, Midwest Wireline required or permitted its driver,

 David Schmidt, to operate a commercial driver's license required commercial

motor vehicle (a 2012 Kenworth, VIN ending in 8418, GVWR over 33,000 lbs.) in Kansas on a public road (intrastate commerce from Hays, Kansas to Cheyenne County, Kansas) without first conducting a pre-employment query into the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse (DACH) on Mr. Schmidt prior to allowing him to perform a safety-sensitive function (i.e. driving). Midwest Wireline did not perform a pre-employment query in the DACH into drivers David Schmidt or Justin Henrickson prior to allowing them to perform a safety sensitive function, which resulted in two (2) violations of 49 C.F.R. 382.701(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of a penalty of \$500.00 is appropriate and in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.

b. Count 2: On December 23, 2024, Midwest Wireline required or permitted its driver, David Schmidt, to operate a commercial driver's license required commercial motor vehicle (a 2012 Kenworth, VIN ending in 8418, GVWR over 33,000 lbs.) in Kansas on a public road (intrastate commerce from Hays, Kansas to Cheyenne County, Kansas). Mr. Schmidt's electronic logging device record stated he was in the sleeper berth from 10:38 p.m. on December 22, 2024, until 11:46 a.m. on December 23, 2024, at which point he drove from WaKeeney, Kansas to Hays, Kansas. However, Mr. Schmidt's Job Summary report was not in the sleeper berth but rather served as a crew member and worked at the well site from 1:45 a.m. until 8:30 a.m. on December 23, 2024. Mr. Schmidt was required to document all onduty time as well as his driving time as part of his time record. Midwest Wireline required or permitted Davud Schmidt, Justin Trout and Derek Pickens to prepare

false reports of their record of duty status on four different transports, resulting in four (4) violations of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a. The Commission finds that Staff's recommendation of an enhanced penalty of \$2,000.00 is appropriate because this was an act of fraud and therefore an intentional violation, which is in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.

- 9. The Commission hereby adopts Staff's findings as contained in its April 14, 2025, R&R.
- 10. The Commission finds that Midwest Wireline is required to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order. ³ A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars be found Commission's website can on the at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 11. The Commission further finds that Midwest Wireline is required to submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan ("CAP") that is satisfactory to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.⁴
- 12. The Commission further finds that Midwest Wireline is required to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order at a time agreeable to Staff.⁵

- 13. Failure to comply with the requirements of this Penalty Order shall result in the suspension of Midwest Wireline's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁶
- 14. The Commission concludes the penalty of \$2,500.00 for the six violations set forth above, and the additional three requirements set forth in paragraphs 10, 11, and 12 are just and reasonable.

IT IS, THEREFORE, BY THE COMMISSION ORDERED THAT:

- A. Midwest Wireline is hereby assessed a \$2,500.00 civil penalty for six (6) violations, set forth in two (2) counts, of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative regulations, and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Midwest Wireline is hereby ordered to have a representative responsible for the Carrier's safety compliance attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order.
- C. Midwest Wireline is hereby ordered to submit a written, comprehensive corrective action plan ("CAP") that is satisfactory to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violations described in this Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining Carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violations do not occur in the future.
- D. Midwest Wireline is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order at a time agreeable to Staff.
- E. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which

relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven copies of the request to the Executive Director at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Midwest Wireline's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order.

- F. If a request for hearing is filed, attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500.00, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest.⁷ For civil penalties of \$500.00 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation.⁸
- G. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$2,500.00 is due thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$2,500.00 must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network ("KTRAN") system located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty.
- H. Failure of Midwest Wireline to perform, pay, or fully comply with the provisions of this Order, including but not limited to Ordering Clauses A through D, above, will result in

suspension of Midwest Wireline's motor carrier operating authority without further notice.⁹ Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

Motor Carrier Authority

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Midwest Wireline LLC (Midwest Wireline) is a motor carrier (MC) possessing private operating authority from the Commission, primarily hauling hazardous materials. Midwest Wireline LLC operates under USDOT 3454360. From February 26, 2025 through April 8, 2025, Commission Staff Special Investigators (SIs) completed a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Midwest Wireline LLC. A copy of the safety compliance report is attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the SIs identified six (6) violations, set forth in two (2) specific counts, of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (MCSRs), which carry a penalty according to the FY2025 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix approved by the Commission. Based on the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations discovered by the SIs, staff recommends penalty of \$2,500.00 be issued to the MC.

DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS:

On February 26, 2025 through April 8, 2025, Commission Staff SIs conducted a safety compliance investigation of the operations of Midwest Wireline LLC. The investigation covers a 365-day period and any previous compliance review. Each specific count is detailed below. **Count One (1 of 2)**

Authority: K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

Relevant Statutes: 49 C.F.R 382.701(a) states: "Employers must not employ a driver subject to controlled substances and alcohol testing under this part to perform a safety-sensitive function without first conducting a pre-employment query of the Clearinghouse to obtain information about whether the driver has a verified positive, adulterated, or substituted controlled substances test result; has an alcohol confirmation test with a concentration of 0.04 or higher; has refused to submit to a test in violation of 382.211; or that an employer has reported actual knowledge, as defined at 382.107, that the driver used alcohol on duty in violation of 382.205, used alcohol before duty in violation of 382.207, used alcohol following an accident in violation of 382.209, or used a controlled substance, in violation of 382.213." Material Facts and Supporting Documents: On December 23, 2024, Midwest Wireline required or permitted its driver, David Schmidt, to operate a commercial driver's license (CDL) required commercial motor vehicle (CMV), a 2012 Kenworth T440, VIN ending in 8418, GVWR over 33,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Hays, Kansas to Chevenne County in Kansas. This transport is evidenced by Service Order No. 1 - 3206, attached hereto as Exhibit 2 and the Drug and Alcohol Clearinghouse (DACH) Query History report, attached hereto as Exhibit 3. At the time of this transport, Driver David Schmidt operated a CMV prior to Midwest Wireline obtaining a pre-employment query result through the DACH. The MC also allowed driver Justin Henrickson to operate a CMV on October 11, 2024, prior to obtaining a preemployment query result. Mr. Henrickson had previously been employed by Midwest Wireline, but left the company in May of 2022. He returned to work on May 13, 2024, at which time a new pre-employment query was required to be conducted prior to the performance of any safety sensitive functions. The DACH Query History Report does not include a pre-employment query date for Mr. Schmidt, and does not include one for Mr. Henrickson after he was re-hired, resulting in two violations.

<u>Violation</u>: Midwest Wireline allowed a driver to perform a safety-sensitive function prior to conducting a pre-employment query of the Clearinghouse, which is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.701(a), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c (Exhibit 1, Page 3). Two (2) violations were discovered (Exhibit 1, Pages 10).

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$500, in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix.

Count Two (2 of 2)

Authority: K.S.A. 66-1,111 and 66-1,129.

Relevant Statutes: 49 C.F.R 395.8(e)(1) states:" No driver or motor carrier may make a false report in connection with a duty status. (2) No driver or motor carrier may disable, deactivate, disengage, jam, or otherwise block or degrade a signal transmission or reception, or reengineer, reprogram, or otherwise tamper with an ELD so that the device does not accurately record and retain required data. (3) No driver or motor carrier may permit or require another person to disable, deactivate, disengage, jam, or otherwise block or degrade a signal transmission or reception, or reengineer, reprogram, or otherwise tamper with an ELD so that the device does not accurately record and retain required data."

Material Facts and Supporting Documents: This violation took place during the transport on December 23, 2024, described in Count One, above (See Exhibit 2 and Exhibit 3). This transport is evidenced by the ELD records for December 22, 2024, and December 23, 2024, attached hereto as Exhibit 4. On this transport Driver David Schmidt was listed as a driver of a commercial motor vehicle from Hays, Kansas to Cheyenne County in Kansas. The electronic logging device (ELD) record (Exhibit 4) states Mr. Schmidt was in the sleeper berth from 10:38 p.m. on December 22, 2024, until 11:46 a.m. on December 23, 2024, at which point he drove from WaKeeney, Kansas to Hays, Kansas. However, the Job Summary report (Exhibit 2, Page 2) stated that Mr. Schmidt was not in the sleeper berth but rather served as a crew member and worked at the well site from 1:45 a.m. until 8:30 a.m. on December 23, 2024. Mr. Schmidt was required to document all on-duty time as well as his driving time as part of his time record. At the time of this transport, the MC required or permitted a driver to falsify a record of duty status.

The following drivers made false reports of record of duty status: Justin Trout on January 4 and 13, 2025; David Schimdt on December 23, 2024; and Derek Pickens on November 19, 2024. In total the SIs found four (4) violations.

<u>Violation</u>: Midwest Wireline required or permitted a driver to falsify a record of duty status in violation of 49 C.F.R. 395.8(e)(1) adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3a. (**Exhibit 1**, **Page 4**). Four (4) violations were discovered. (**Exhibit 1**, **Pages 10**).

Recommendation: Staff recommends a fine of \$2,000, in accordance with the FY2025 Penalty Matrix

RECOMMENDATION:

Transportation Staff recommends the Commission find Midwest Wireline LLC committed six (6) violations, set forth in two (2) specific counts, of Kansas law that governs MCs, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.s), and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.


Due to the frequency, timeline and severity of the violations, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$ 2,500 for two (2) violations of the MC Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations, in

accordance with the recommended penalties listed in the applicable Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix.

Staff further recommends Midwest Wireline LLC require a representative responsible for the company's safety to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for safety seminars can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

Staff further recommends Midwest Wireline LLC submit a written, comprehensive Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to Transportation Staff within thirty (30) days of the date of this order, documenting the violation(s) described in the Penalty Order, including specific and detailed information explaining the carrier's efforts and concrete steps taken to ensure the violation(s) do not occur in the future.

Finally, Staff recommends that Midwest Wireline LLC submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of the Penalty Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for the review.

On December 23, 2024 Driver David Schmidt operated Unit 106 to haul Class 7 materials to H & C Oil Operations Inc well site somewhere between Haigler, Nebraska and Cheyenne County in Kansas.
