This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on April 22, 2015, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Michael Heenan. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$950 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY:

You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. Ace Transports LLC (Ace Transports) obtained private and common operating authority from the Commission on April 17, 2013, and operates under KSMCID number 169479 and USDOT number 2365172.
- 5. Glenna Edwards attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Instructional Meeting on March 11, 2013, on behalf of Ace Transports.
- 6. Ace Transports is a private and common motor carrier which primarily hauls oilfield equipment, general freight, building materials, beverages and machinery/large objects.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on April 22, 2015, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Michael Heenan conducted a compliance review of the operations of Ace Transports. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Heenan identified three (3) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On April 3, 2015, Ace Transports required or permitted its driver, Tyler L. Edwards, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2011 Kenworth, VIN ending in 221582, pulling a 2003 trailer, in interstate commerce from Salem, Oregon to Atlanta, Georgia. This trip is evidenced by Driver/Vehicle Examination Report No. ORAALE004657, dated April 3,

2015, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, Ace Transports had not made inquiry into the motor vehicle record (MVR) of Mr. Edwards within the preceding 12 months. Ace Transports' failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, as authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

b. On April 17, 2015, Ace Transports required or permitted its driver, Rodger L. Swisher, to operate a commercial motor vehicle, a 2010 Kenworth, VIN ending in 221356, pulling a 1999 Great Dane trailer, VIN ending in 312484, in interstate commerce from Tulsa, Oklahoma to Wichita, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Invoice No. 1018, dated April 20, 2015, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. Mr. Swisher was hired on April 11, 2015, and at the time of this transportation he had not submitted to a pre-employment drug test with a negative result. Ace Transports' failure to require its drivers to submit to a pre-employment alcohol and/or controlled substances test and to obtain a negative test result prior to requiring or permitting them to operate a commercial motor vehicle is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.301(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c and as authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1.129. Staff recommends a fine of \$750.

c. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, Ace Transports required or permitted this transportation prior to first designating a person to supervise staff for the purposes of making reasonable suspicion determinations regarding alcohol and drug usage. This designated person must then undergo reasonable suspicion training to include 60 minutes of alcohol training and 60 minutes of controlled substance training. Ace Transports' inability to produce documentation of this training and its failure to have a designated person to attend 60 minutes of training on alcohol misuse and an additional 60 minutes of training on controlled substances use is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.603, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c and as authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find Ace Transports committed three (3) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$950 for three (3) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that Ace Transports be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with

written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.

11. Finally, Staff recommends that Ace Transports submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over Ace Transports because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds Ace Transports committed three (3) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. Ace Transports LLC, of Cherryvale, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$950 civil penalty for three (3) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. Ace Transports is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, Ace Transports is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.
- C. <u>Pursuant to K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may</u> request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the

Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of Ace Transports' right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$950 civil penalty against Ace Transports, and ordering Ace Transports to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.

- D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.

F. Failure to pay the \$950 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in revocation of Ace Transports' motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further order or orders as it may deem necessary.

FMCSA recently announced planned improvements to the Carrier Safety Measurement System (SMS) which was implemented in December 2010 as part of the Agency's broader Compliance, Safety, Accountability (CSA) initiative. A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012.

The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents.

Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site.

The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.


