Dear Mr. Haynos,

On November 21, 2007 the Kansas Corporation Commission granted Midwest Energy a "...temporary waiver of the minimum natural gas heat content value found in section 5(B)(3) of its Distribution Transportation Terms and Conditions for gas deliveries supplied from the KMIGT Holcomb to Scott City Pipeline." The waiver was intended to "...provide an interim solution to the shut in gas production in north central Finney County..." and "...provide OFS and KMIGT the needed time to reconfigure the gas gathering/transportation system in such a manner that only processed gas will be delivered to the Holcomb/Scott City pipeline."

The British thermal unit per standard cubic foot, (Btu/scf) minimum was lowered to 840 Btu/scf on this line segment until May 1, 2008. The November 21 Order stated, "At that time, the minimum heat value would return to the tariff specification, 900 BTU/scf."

Midwest Energy has not been a party to any formal discussions or negotiations between KMIGT and Oneok. While we continue to expect KMIGT and Oneok to fulfill their commitments to reconfigure their systems in a manner that will allow only processed gas to be delivered on this pipeline, we are not aware of any substantive progress. We do not intend to unilaterally extend support for the waiver beyond May 1, 2008.

Midwest Energy has and will continue to contact HVAC contractors who work in the affected area to identify any Btu-related issues on customers' premises.
