NOTICE OF PENALTY ASSESSMENT

This is a notice of a penalty assessment for violation of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on January 4, 2017, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator Michael Heenan. For a full description of the penalty and process please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY:

You have been assessed a \$1,500 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. Check or money order must be made payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. Payment is to be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and must include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding. Credit card payment may be made by faxing your credit card information to the Transportation Office at 785-271-3124, using the KCC's credit card payment form found at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/creditcard.pdf.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm.

You must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next 18 months. Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. Respondent must submit an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date stamped on the last page of the Penalty Order. K.A.R. 82-1-215; K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-542.

IF YOU FAIL TO ACT:

Failure to pay the fine amount within thirty (30) days of service of the Penalty Order, or in the alternative, provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from service of the Penalty Order will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in the additional sanction of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. TS Construction General Contractors, Inc. (TS Construction) operates under USDOT number 942565.
- 5. TS Construction is an intrastate carrier that excavates and moves dirt. It owns four trucks and 4 trailers and employs two CDL drivers.
- 6. TS Construction is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls motor vehicles, construction, gravel and dirt.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on January 4, 2017, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator Michael Heenan conducted a compliance review of the operations of TS Construction. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, Mr. Heenan identified four (4) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On November 29, 2016, TS Construction required or permitted its driver, Duane Evans, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1995 Ford L9000 10 wheel dump truck, VIN ending in 70843, GVWR greater than 53,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around the area of Yates Center, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by KCC Written Statement of Tim A. Splechter, President of the company, dated January 4, 2017, a

copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of this transportation, TS Construction failed to maintain a copy of the motor vehicle record (MVR) in its driver's qualification file. TS Construction's failure to maintain a copy of the motor vehicle record received from each State in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.51(b)(2), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3, and as authorized by K.S.A. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$100.

- b. During the transportation described in paragraph a., above, TS Construction had not implemented an alcohol and/or controlled substance program to randomly test its CDL drivers. The carrier's failure to establish an alcohol and/or controlled substances program for its CDL drivers that complies with the procedures established in 49 C.F.R. 382.105 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 382.115(a), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3c, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$650.
- c. On September 29, 2016, TS Construction required or permitted its driver, Duane Evans, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 2000 Dodge 1 ton flatbed pickup, VIN ending in 209490, GVWR of 10,001 to 14,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce from Yates Center, Kansas to Pittsburg, Kansas. The carrier could not remember which trailer was used in this transportation to transport the large load of plastic pipe. The three trailers owned by the carrier have a GVWR of 22,000 lbs. to 22,500

lbs. This trip is evidenced by Invoice No. 16-527, dated December 20, 2016, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "C" and is hereby incorporated by reference. The actual delivery date of the material on the invoice was September 29, 2016. At the time of this transportation, the driver drove 86.9 miles as per Google Trips. This requires private carrier authority from the state of Kansas. TS Construction does not have private carrier authority. The carrier's commercial operation of motor vehicles prior to obtaining and maintaining proper Commission authority is a violation of K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,111 and 49 C.F.R. 392.2, as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3h and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine of \$500.

d. On November 29, 2016, TS Construction required or permitted its driver, Timothy A. Splechter, to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1983 Peterbilt tractor, VIN ending in 156437, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2001 Fontaine Detach trailer, VIN ending in 98978, GVWR 60,000 lbs., in intrastate commerce in and around the area of Yates Center, Kansas. This trip is evidenced by Drivers' Time Record, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "D" and is hereby incorporated by reference. At the time of the transportation, TS Construction failed to require its driver to be medically examined and certified that he is physically fit to operate the CDL motor vehicle. His medical certificate expired in late 2016. The carrier's failure to confirm that each of its drivers are medically examined and certified prior to

requiring or permitting the operation of a commercial motor vehicle and maintaining documentation of the medical certificate in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. 391.45(b)(1) and 49 C.F.R. 391.51(b)(7)(i), as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and as authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129. Staff recommends a fine in the amount of \$250.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission find TS Construction committed four (4) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$1,500 for four (4) violations of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.
- 10. Staff further recommends that TS Construction be required to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety_meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that TS Construction submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months. Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over TS Construction because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds TS Construction committed four (4) violations of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. TS Construction General Contractors, Inc., of Yates Center, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$1,500 civil penalty for four (4) violations of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. TS Construction is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and is to provide Staff with written proof of attendance. Further, TS Construction is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within the next eighteen (18) months.
- C. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issues by submitting a written request, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought, to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. If service is by certified mail, service is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. Hearings will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of TS Construction's right to a hearing, and this

Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$1,500 civil penalty against TS Construction, and ordering TS Construction to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within the next ninety (90) days and provide Staff with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of service of this Order.

- D. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.
- E. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty is due in thirty (30) days from date of service of this Order. Checks and Money Orders shall be payable to the Kansas Corporation Commission. For credit card payments, include type of card (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express), account number and expiration date. Payments shall be mailed to the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission, 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604. *The payment shall include a reference to the docket number of this proceeding*.
- F. Failure to pay the \$1,500 civil penalty within thirty (30) days of the service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of TS Construction's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited

to, the issuance and enforcement of out-of-service and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.

G. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.

- 12. Make certain that all drivers of commercial motor vehicles have a record check of their driving record at least every 12 months and within 30 days of their initial employement
- 13. Make certain that all CDL holders that operate CDL vehicles are in a random drug and alcohol testing selection pool with only other CDL operators. This gives CDL operators fair and equal chance of selection for drug and alcohol testing
- 14. Provide employees and owner operators with a drug and alcohol policy. The policy will provide a signature page to verify the employee or owner operator has been given a copy of the policy to read and does in fact understand its contents.
- 15. Provide proof that the company supervisor listed below has been trained and certified with training on alcohol and drug abuse and provide this agency a copy of such certification.

16. Lacknowledge that these requirements and/or recommendations have been discussed with me and my questions have been answered. I understand that failure to satisfactorily remedy the above-listed requirements, and/or failure to comply with Kansas Motor Carner Safety Statutes and Regulations could result in the suspension of [TS Construction General Contractors Inc.) operating authority and/or the impoundment of [TS Construction General Contractors Inc 1 vehicles
