APPLICANT'S MOTION TO STRIKE AND RESPONSE TO PROTESTANTS' MOTIONS TO DENY APPLICANT'S MOTION TO DISMISS THE PROTESTS FILED HEREIN

COMES NOW, the Applicant, RJM Company, and moves the Commission to strike the Motions to Deny Applicant's Motion to Dismiss the Protests Filed Herein and, in the alternative, responds to such motions.

Applicants' Motion to Strike

1. Applicant filed a motion to dismiss the protests filed herein on June 1, 2018. This motion was served on all parties in this matter, other than the two protestants (Elizabeth Fischer and Cynthia Evans) who failed to comply with K.A.R. 82-3-135b(a) by failing to include addresses in their letters of protest.

2. When Applicant viewed the Commission's online docket today, it noticed for the first time that protestants Kathy Carroll, Andy Prosser, Royceann Mather, Cindy Hoedel, and Charles and Lynne Hunter have apparently each filed pleadings in this matter, entitled "Motion to Deny Applicant's Motion to Dismiss the Protests Filed Herein" (Protestants' Motions to Deny). 3. None of the Protestants' Motions to Deny were served upon Applicant, as required by K.A.R. 82-1-216(b)(1).¹ The language of K.A.R. 82-1-216(b) makes clear that the protestants, as parties in this matter, and not the Commission, are personally obligated to serve all documents they file in this matter upon the other parties in this matter, including Applicant. Further, this regulation requires strict compliance.² Protestants' *pro se* status in this matter does not excuse their compliance with this mandatory regulation.³

4. Because this Commission cannot ignore the legal requirements contained in K.A.R. 82-1-216, the Commission does not have jurisdiction to entertain the Protestants' Motions to Deny.⁴ As such, Protestants' Motions to Deny should be stricken from the record.

Applicants' Response to Protestants' Motions to Deny

5. None of Protestants' Motions to Deny properly respond to Applicant's Motion to Dismiss the Protests Filed Herein. In fact, the generalized nature of all of these protestants' apparent concerns, which they simply repeat in their letter-writing campaign, protesting a number of similar applications filed by Applicant and other operators, is evidenced by the form attached as page 2 of protestant Andy Prosser's Motion to Deny. Despite this coaching, Protestants' Motions to Deny still fail to state facts sufficient to grant them legal standing to protest the Application in this matter.

6. Applicant incorporates the arguments and authorities in Applicant's Motion to Dismiss the Protests Herein in response to each of the Protestants' Motions to Deny.
