ORDER SETTING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

This matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission) for consideration and decision. Having reviewed its files and records, the Commission makes the following findings:

1. On September 1, 2020, Wolf Creek Nuclear Operating Corporation (WCNOC), Evergy Metro, Inc. d/b/a Evergy Kansas Metro, Evergy Kansas Central, Inc. and Evergy Kansas South, Inc. (Evergy), and Kansas Electric Power Cooperative, Inc. (KEPCo) (collectively, the Parties) jointly filed an application for approval of its 2020 Wolf Creek Triennial Decommissioning Financing Plan.

2. On September 22, 2020, the Commission granted the Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board's Petition to Intervene.¹

3. On December 18, 2020, Adam H. Gatewood and Leo Haynos filed testimony on behalf of Commission Staff (Staff). Gatewood (1) agrees with the escalation rates proposed by Jason O. Humphry, Senior Director of Finance for Evergy, and recommends those escalation rates and Humphry's methodology should be applied to the decommissioning plan selected by the Commission; (2) finds the annual accruals for Evergy Kansas are sufficient to fund its share of the decommissioning costs; and (3) finds that KEPCo needs a small increase to its annual accrual to

meet its obligations under the WCNOC Owners' proposed decommissioning methodology.² Haynos testified: (1) the cost estimate methodology included in the Application is consistent with the estimating methodology used in previously approved cost studies;³ and (2) the DECON estimate strikes an appropriate balance between the U.S. Department of Energy's immediate acceptance of the spent fuel and the need to provide for spent fuel storage of a longer period of time.⁴

4. On February 1, 2021, the Parties filed a Joint Motion for Procedural Order, noting there are no contested issues and Staff's testimony is unopposed,⁵ and proposing a procedural schedule with a March 31, 2021 hearing date.⁶
