Dear Commissioners,

I have been informed that my earlier protest of TGT's application to extend the plugging of the Wheeler F#1 well bore has been dismissed because my allegations of waste, violation of correlative rights and potential for pollution were either speculative and/or did not constitute matters relevant to the jurisdiction of the KCC.

I accept the conclusion regarding my earlier allegations. I do however want to express my concern that TGT Petroleum may be asking for the extension only to delay or ultimately avoid the economic cost of plugging this well. TGT may own as many as 15 wells on my property, many of which appear uneconomic. Of these 15 wells, only two appear to be producing in paying quantities. I understand that statement is speculative, but I hope the KCC understands that it is imperative for operators to timely plug wells. The timeliness must include some consideration for the ability of a company to pay the costs of plugging.

As a concerned citizen, I believe the KCC should require TGT to document TGT's ability to pay plugging costs for all of its wells prior to receiving any extension of time to plug this well.
