This is a notice of a penalty assessment against GTE LLC for violation(s) of Kansas Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules, and Regulations discovered during a compliance review conducted on August 3, 2017, by Kansas Corporation Commission Special Investigator(s) Verna Jackson. Penalty amounts are assessed in accordance with the FY 2018 Uniform Penalty Assessment Matrix, approved by the Commission on June 27, 2017. For a full description of the penalty(s) and terms and obligations please refer to the Order that is attached to this notice.

IF YOU ACCEPT THE PENALTY: GTE has been assessed a \$500 penalty. You have thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order to pay the fine amount. Please remit payment of \$500, through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.

You must attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of the attached Order and provide the undersigned Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found at the Commission's website http://www.kcc.state.ks.us/trans/safety_meetings.htm. You also must submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within 18 months from the date of the attached Order. Transportation Staff will contact you at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

IF YOU CONTEST THE PENALTY ORDER: You have the right to request a hearing. A request for hearing must be made in writing, setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. GTE must file, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, the request for hearing with the Commission's electronic filing system found at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, and must mail a copy of the request for hearing to the undersigned at the above address. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604 within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order and mail a copy to the undersigned Litigation Counsel. IF YOU FAIL TO ACT: Failure to pay the penalty of \$500 within thirty (30) days from the date of service of the Penalty Order or failure to comply with the terms of the attached Penalty Order, or in the alternative, failure to provide a written request for a hearing within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, will result in the attached Order becoming a Final Order and may result in additional sanctions of suspension and/or revocation of your motor carrier operating authority.

PENALTY ORDER

The above-captioned matter comes before the State Corporation Commission of the State of Kansas (Commission). The Commission, having been briefed on the issue by the Director of the Commission's Transportation Division, finds and concludes as follows:

I. JURISDICTION

- 1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108b, 66-1,111, 66-1,112, 66-1,114, 66-1,114b and 66-1,115, the Commission is given full power, authority and jurisdiction to supervise and control motor carriers, as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108, doing business or procuring business in Kansas, and is empowered to do all things necessary and convenient for the exercise of such power, authority and jurisdiction.
- 2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,129a, 66-1,130 and 66-1,142b, the Commission may suspend operations, revoke or amend certificates, and initiate sanctions or fines against every motor carrier and every person who violates any provision of Kansas law in regard

to the regulation of such motor carriers and persons, or who fails to obey any order, decision or regulation of the Commission.

3. The Commission has the authority, pursuant to K.A.R. 82-1-237, to investigate an entity under the Commission's jurisdiction and order a hearing on the Commission's own motion when the Commission believes the entity is in violation of the law or any order of the Commission.

II. BACKGROUND

- 4. GTE LLC (GTE) has private operating authority with the Commission and further operates USDOT number 2383764.
- 5. Angie Galloway attended a Commission-sponsored Motor Carrier Education and Instructional Meeting on November 5, 2013, on behalf of GTE.
- 6. GTE is a private motor carrier which primarily hauls machinery, large objects and grass turf.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 7. Pursuant to the jurisdiction and authority cited above, on August 3, 2017, Commission Staff (Staff) Special Investigator(s) Verna Jackson conducted a compliance review of the operations of GTE. A copy of the safety compliance review is included in this Penalty Order as Attachment "A" and is hereby incorporated by reference. As a result of this investigation, the special investigator(s) identified one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - a. On July 8, 2017, GTE required or permitted its driver, Steen Guetterman,
 to operate a CDL-required commercial motor vehicle, a 1990 Kenworth,
 VIN ending in 538494, GVWR greater than 33,000 lbs., pulling a 2002

JETCO Dropdeck Trailer, VIN ending in 000035, in interstate commerce from Bucyrus, Kansas to Belton, Missouri. This transportation is evidenced by Individual Vehicle Mileage and Fuel Schedule, dated July 8, 2017, a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment "B" and is hereby incorporated by reference. This is the same violation the carrier was cited for during a compliance review conducted on August 10, 2015. At the time of this transportation, GTE failed to make an inquiry every 12 months into the annual motor vehicle record (MVR) of its driver and maintain the response(s) of each state agency in the driver qualification file. GTE's failure to inquire into its driver's MVR at least once every 12 months and maintain a copy of the MVR in the driver qualification file is a violation of 49 C.F.R. Part 391.25(a) and (c)(1), adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3g, and authorized by K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,112. Staff recommends an enhanced fine of \$500.

IV. STAFF'S RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8. Based upon the available facts, Staff recommends the Commission finds GTE committed one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.
- 9. Additionally, Staff recommends a civil penalty of \$500 for one (1) violation(s) of the Motor Carrier Safety Statutes, Rules and Regulations.

- 10. Staff further recommends that GTE be required to attend a Commissionsponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance. A schedule of the dates and locations for the safety seminar can be found on the Commission's website at http://kcc.ks.gov/trans/safety meetings.htm.
- 11. Finally, Staff recommends that GTE submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the motor carrier at a later date to determine an appropriate time for this review.

V. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 12. The Commission finds it has jurisdiction over GTE because it is a motor carrier as defined in K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,108.
- 13. The Commission finds GTE committed one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law that governs motor carriers, including various provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSRs), as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations, and is therefore subject to sanctions or fines imposed by the Commission.

THE COMMISSION THEREFORE ORDERS THAT:

- A. GTE LLC, of Bucyrus, Kansas is hereby assessed a \$500 civil penalty for one (1) violation(s) of Kansas law governing the regulation of motor carriers, the Kansas Administrative Regulations and provisions of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, as adopted by the Kansas Administrative Regulations.
- B. GTE is hereby ordered to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, and is to provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance.

- C. GTE is ordered to submit to one follow-up safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order. Transportation Staff will contact the carrier to set up the appointment.
- D. Pursuant to K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, any party may request a hearing on the above issue(s) by submitting a written request setting forth the specific grounds upon which relief is sought. The request may be electronically filed with the Commission's electronic filing system at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/e-filing/e-express/, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, and a copy of the request mailed to the Litigation Division. If you do not have access to the internet, you can mail an original and seven (7) copies of the request to the Commission's Secretary, at 1500 S.W. Arrowhead Road, Topeka, Kansas 66604, and mail a copy of the request to Litigation Counsel, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order. On August 22, 2017, this Penalty Order was mailed to GTE via Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested, Number 70161970000105740013. Service of this Order is complete upon the date delivered shown on the Domestic Return Receipt. A hearing will be scheduled only upon written request. Failure to timely request a hearing will result in a waiver of GTE's right to a hearing, and this Penalty Order will become a Final Order assessing a \$500 civil penalty against GTE, and ordering GTE to attend a Commission-sponsored safety seminar within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order and provide Litigation Counsel with written proof of attendance, and to submit to a safety compliance review within eighteen (18) months from the date of this Order.
- E. Attorneys for all parties shall enter their appearances in Commission proceedings by giving their names and addresses for the record. For civil penalties exceeding \$500, a corporation shall appear before the Commission by its attorney, unless waived by the

Commission for good cause shown and a determination that such waiver is in the public interest. K.S.A. 77-515(c); K.A.R. 82-1-228(d)(2); K.A.R. 82-1-202(a). For civil penalties of \$500 or less, a corporation may appear by a duly authorized representative of the corporation. K.S.A. 2016 Supp. 66-1,142b(e) and amendments thereto.

- F. If you do not request a hearing, the payment of the civil penalty of \$500 is due in thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Order. Payment of \$500, must be made through your personal account with the Kansas Corporation Commission's KTRAN application located at https://puc.kcc.ks.gov/ktran/. If you have not received a letter from the Transportation Division assigning you a PIN, please contact that Division at 785-271-3145. You must have an account through KTRAN to pay the penalty owed.
- G. Failure to pay the \$500 civil penalty within thirty (30) days from the date of service of this Penalty Order, *see* K.S.A. 66-1,105, and/or failure to comply with the provisions of this Order, may result in suspension of GTE's motor carrier operating authority without further notice. Additionally, the Commission may impose further sanctions to include, but not limited to, the issuance and enforcement of revocation of authority and/or cease and desist orders, and any other remedies available to the Commission by law, without further notice.
- H. The Commission retains jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties for the purpose of entering such further orders, as necessary.



A preview of these improvements is currently available to motor carriers. The system changes are scheduled to be available to the public in July 2012. There will be additional opportunity for public comment on the changes after the preview period ends in July 2012. The improvements to SMS are based on ongoing analysis and feedback from enforcement personnel, the motor carrier industry, and other stakeholders. The changes more effectively identify and prioritize high-risk and other unsafe motor carriers for enforcement interventions designed to reduce commercial motor vehicle crashes and hazardous materials incidents. Motor carrier's currently have the ability to preview how the improvements impact their individual safety data in SMS. These improvements include: (1) Changes to the SMS methodology that identify higher risk carriers while addressing industry biases; (2) better applications of SMS results for Agency interventions by more accurately identifying safety sensitive carriers (i.e., carriers transporting people and carriers hauling hazardous materials (HM)), so that such firms can be selected for CSA interventions at more stringent levels; and, (3) more specific fact-based displays of SMS results on the SMS Web site. The data preview may be found at http://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/. During the data preview period, the Agency requests comments on the impacts of the changes.

2. DRIVER FITNESS BASIC PROCESS BREAKDOWN: Monitoring and Tracking

DESCRIPTION OF PROCESS BREAKDOWN: GTE LLC failed to obtain the annual motor vehicle report for carrier drivers. Without these documents, the carrier cannot validate the qualifications of the driver. The process of obtaining the motor vehicle report is to verify the driver has a valid license and is not suspended or otherwise incapable of operating a commercial motor vehicle.

BASIC SPECIFIC RECOMMENDED REMEDIES

Implement Safety Improvement Practices: The following are recommended practices related to Monitoring and Tracking Processes.

- Implement an effective process for monitoring and documenting all drivers' job functions, training, qualifications, renewal dates, disclosed medical conditions, and operational restrictions, including those of drivers on a waiver program or with impairments that may be satisfied by a Skill Performance Evaluation certificate, to ensure that assignments are covered by qualified drivers.
- Review and retain each driver's Motor Vehicle Record (MVR) at least annually to ensure compliance with company policies, Federal regulations, and State and local laws and ordinances related to driver fitness. If a driver seems to have numerous violations, the MVR should be reviewed more often. Random MVR checks in addition to annual checks are also effective. File the MVR in each driver's driver qualification file after review.
- Maintain each driver's investigation history file in a secure location with limited and controlled access for as long as the driver is employed and for three years thereafter.
- Evaluate personnel who are monitoring driver fitness performance by making sure they are reviewing driver-assignment and qualification files; applying the performance standards fairly, consistently, and equitably, and documenting the evaluations.
- Regularly evaluate the company's driver fitness-related inspection results via the Federal Motor Carrier Safety
 Administration's (FMCSA) website at http://ai.fmcsa.dot.gov/SMS. Assess violations for process breakdowns and
 how to remedy them. Use data to help implement an effective process beyond self-reporting to monitor, document,
 and evaluate compliance with driver-fitness regulations and company policies.
- When monitoring and tracking any driver-fitness-related issue, always assess whether it is individual or represents a systemic breakdown in one of the Safety Management Processes (Policies and Procedures, Roles and Responsibilities, etc.).
